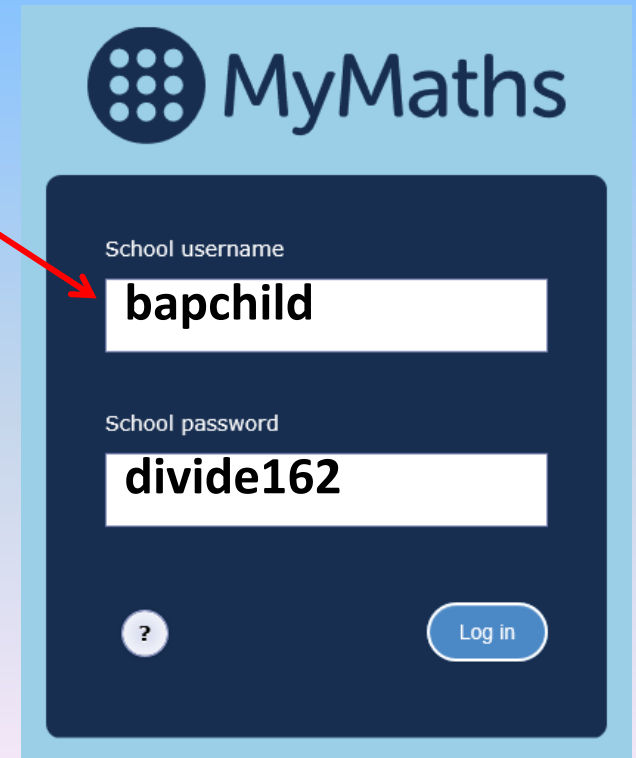

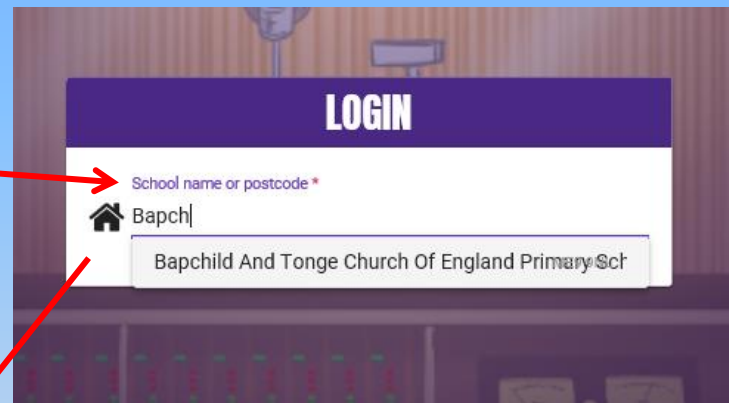
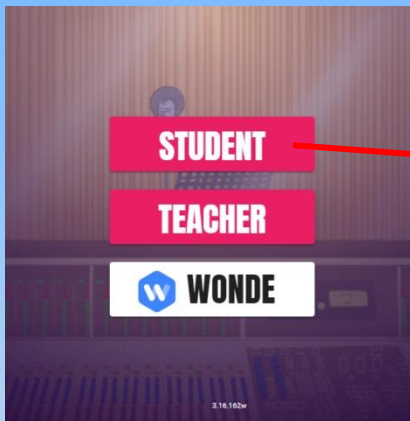
As schools worldwide close for now in response to COVID-19, you might be wondering how best to help your child or children with their studies at home.

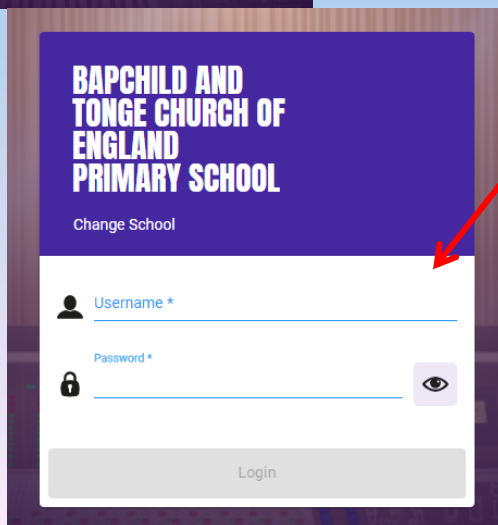

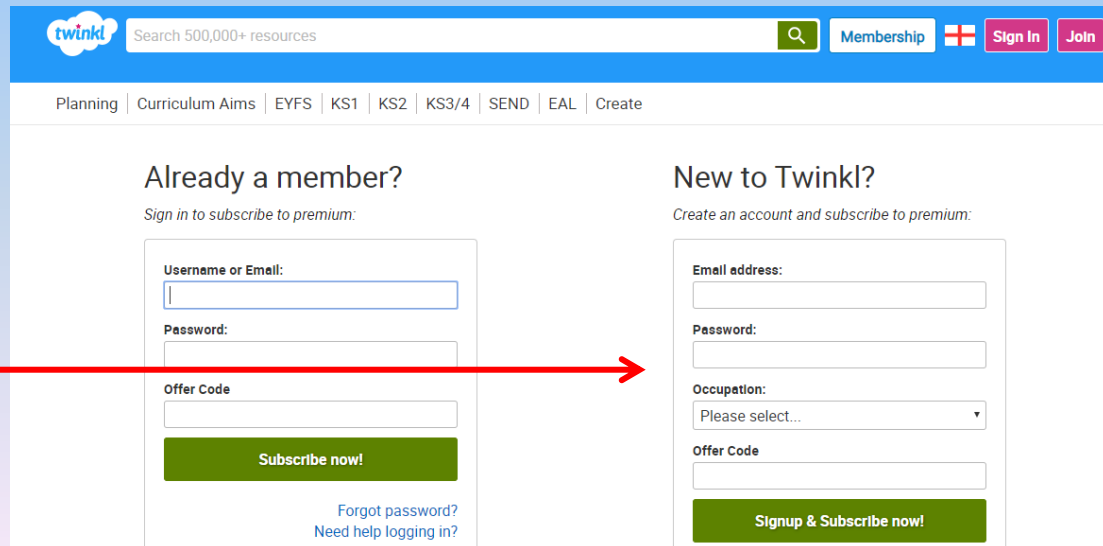
Accessing Twinkl

English Learning

In English in Term 5 we think about characters in stories. This week we would like you to read the story Clara's Crazy Curls by using the link below.

Read the book to yourself or with a grown up a few times until you know the story well and then have a go throughout the week at the following activities.

1. Write a book review. You could use a template from twinkl or make up your own using subheadings such as; Title, Author, What is the book about?, What is your favourite part of the story, Who would enjoy this story and why?. Then you could copy your favourite illustration from the book and even give it a rating out of 5 stars! Here's a link to an example of a book review.

2. Write a character description of Clara. Include a description of what she looks like, what sort of girl she is (kind, adventurous, friendly etc), who she lives with, what she does at school, what makes her unusual. Then you can draw a picture of Clara.
3. The title of the story Clara's Crazy Curls uses words that all start with the same letter. This is called alliteration and it is a great way to make our writing more interesting. Try making up the names of some more characters that could be used in stories using alliteration. For example Tim's Tiny Toes or Lucy's Long Legs. List as many new characters as you can and perhaps include an illustration for each one.

Maths Learning

This week we will continue to learn to tell the time.

⚡ Challenge 1: Try to find and write a fact about each of the living things you find to go onto our factfile.

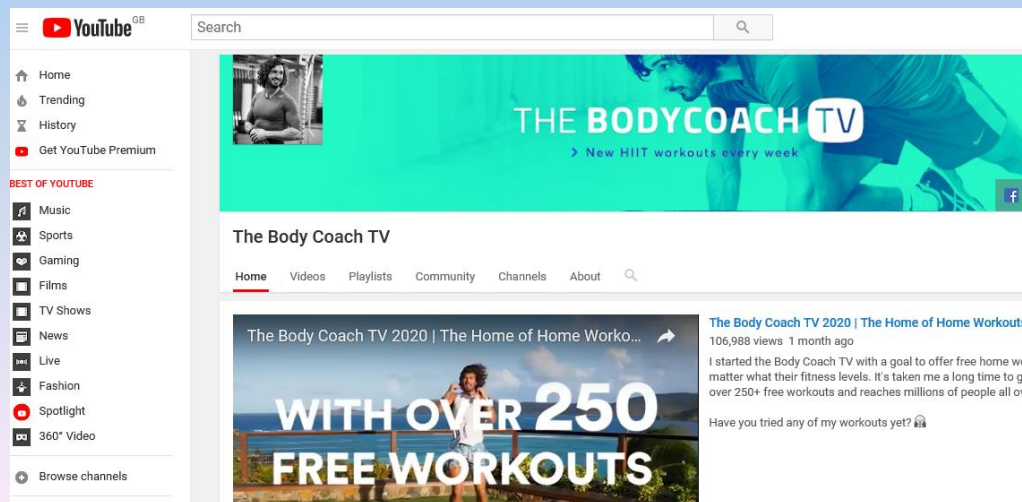
⚡⚡ Challenge 2: Research a typical garden in a different country. Why do you think different plants grow and different animals live in different gardens around the world?
