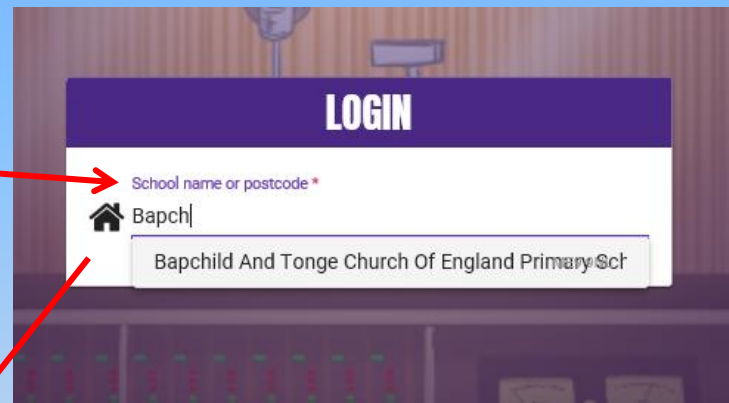
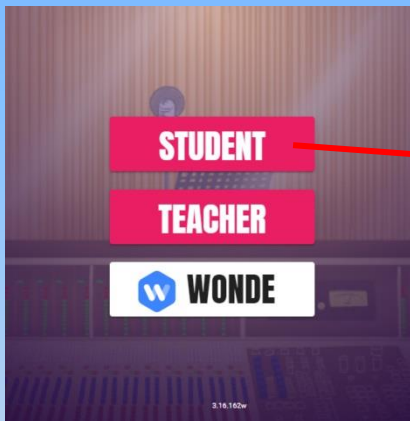
As schools worldwide close for now in response to COVID-19, you might be wondering how best to help your child or children with their studies at home.

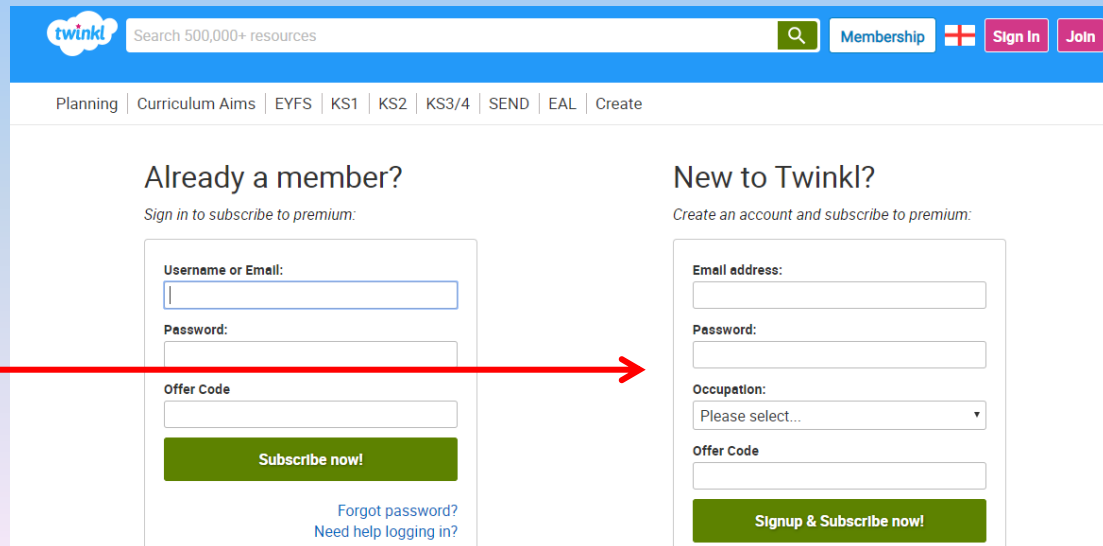
Accessing Twinkl

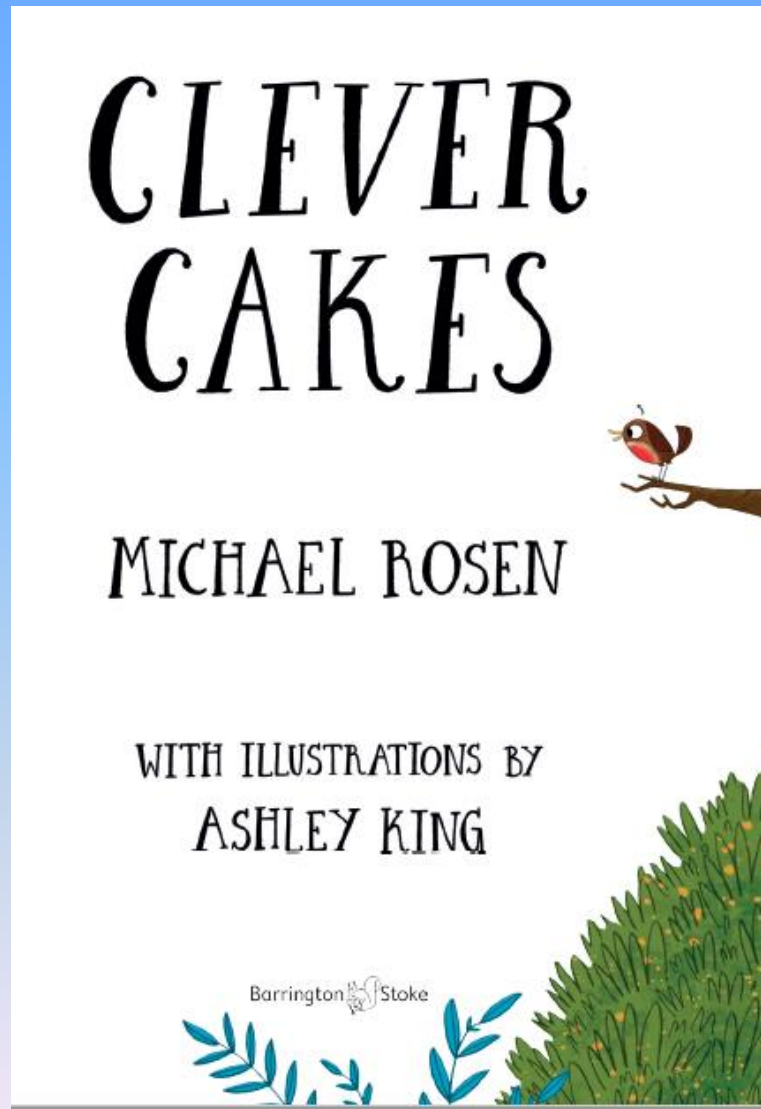

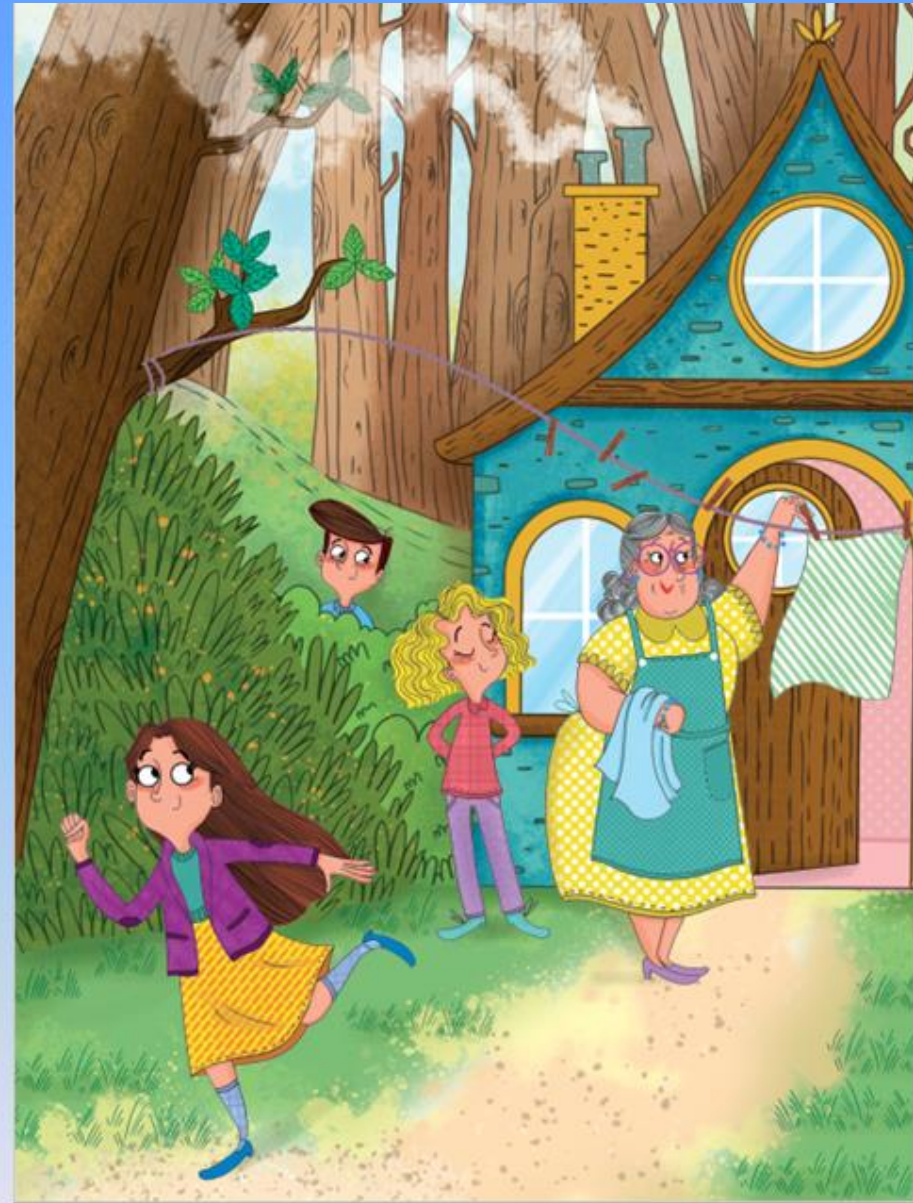
I have included the extract again over the next few slides for you to read before you complete the tasks.

So Masha came out of her hiding place and started to walk home.

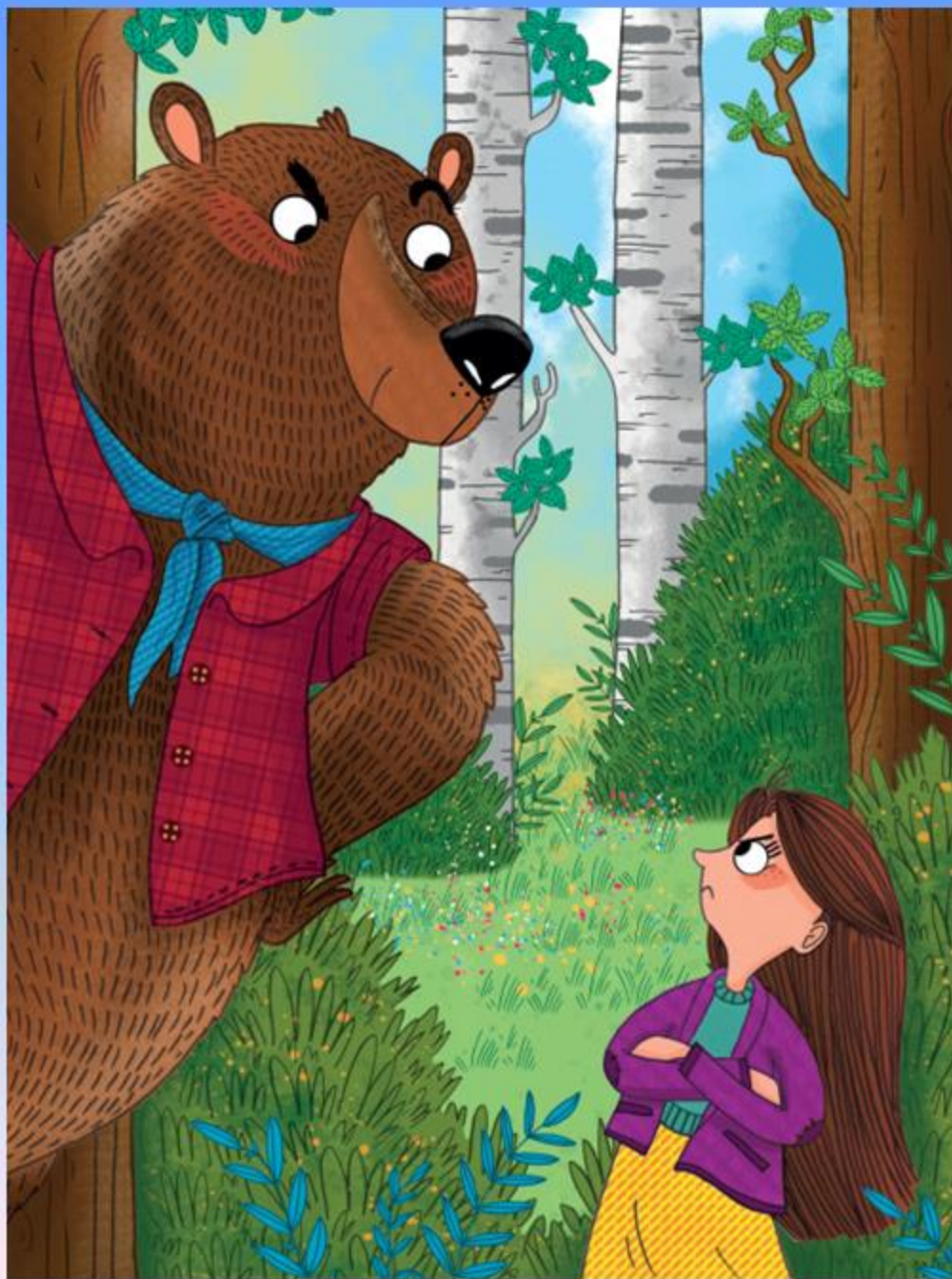
She went this way, then that way, but very soon she knew she was lost.

5. What did the bear do to make sure she couldn't go home?

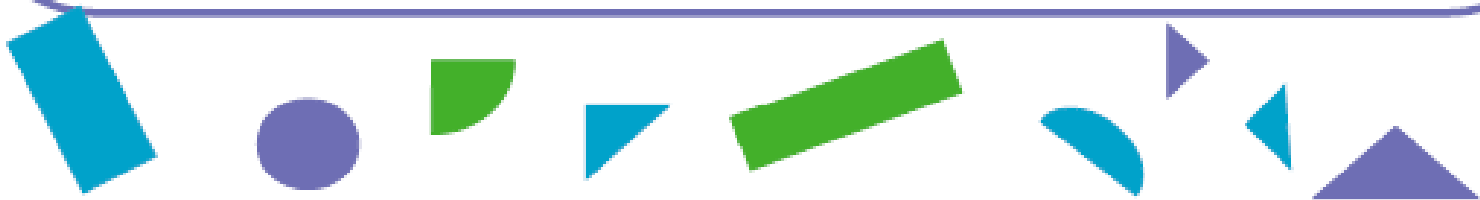
Task 2: Predict the next part of the story.

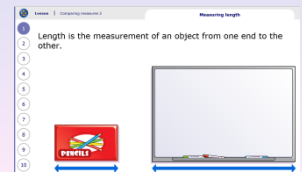
Activity 2 – White Rose Home Learning → **Summer Term – Week 2 (w/c 27th April) → Lesson 2 Order Lengths.**

Also don't forget to be regularly learning your times tables on TT Rockstars. Our focus in Year 2 is the 2x, 5x and 10x tables.

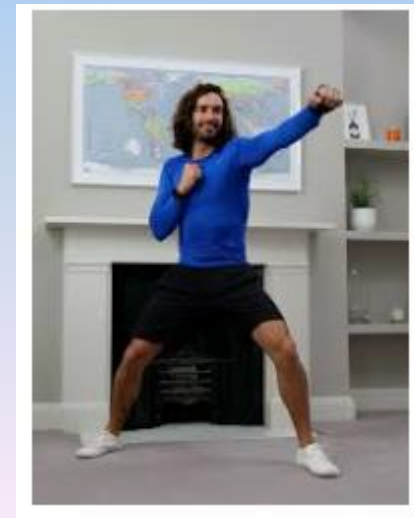


PSHE

The last few weeks have been very different and it is strange to not know when life will go back to normal. You have all done brilliantly so far by staying at home to do your learning. This week we are going to think about how important it is to keep ourselves healthy on the inside and the outside while we are at home. The 3 tasks this week are all to do with keeping ourselves feeling happy and positive in these unusual times.

Task 1: Keeping our bodies active with exercise releases special chemicals called endorphins into our brains which make us feel happy and energetic. This week try to do 30 minutes exercise a day. This could be playing a sport like football in the garden or doing some exercise in your living room. Try doing Joe Wicks PE lessons everyday on YouTube. They are live at 9am so you could do it then or choose a different time in the day. Try to get everyone in your house to join in.

Inside the rainbow write all the ways that you and your family are making the best of this time and what you are enjoying the most.



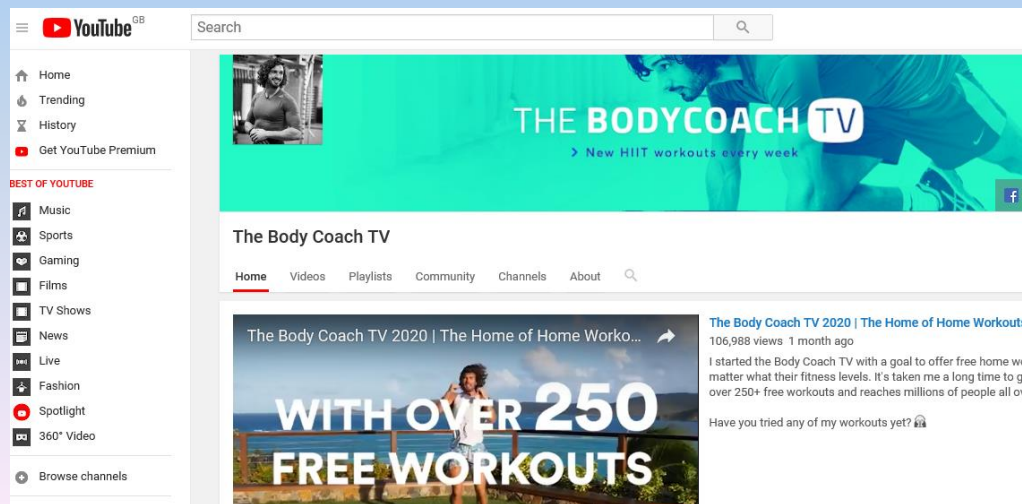
Inside the sun write all the things you are looking forward to doing when this strange time is over.

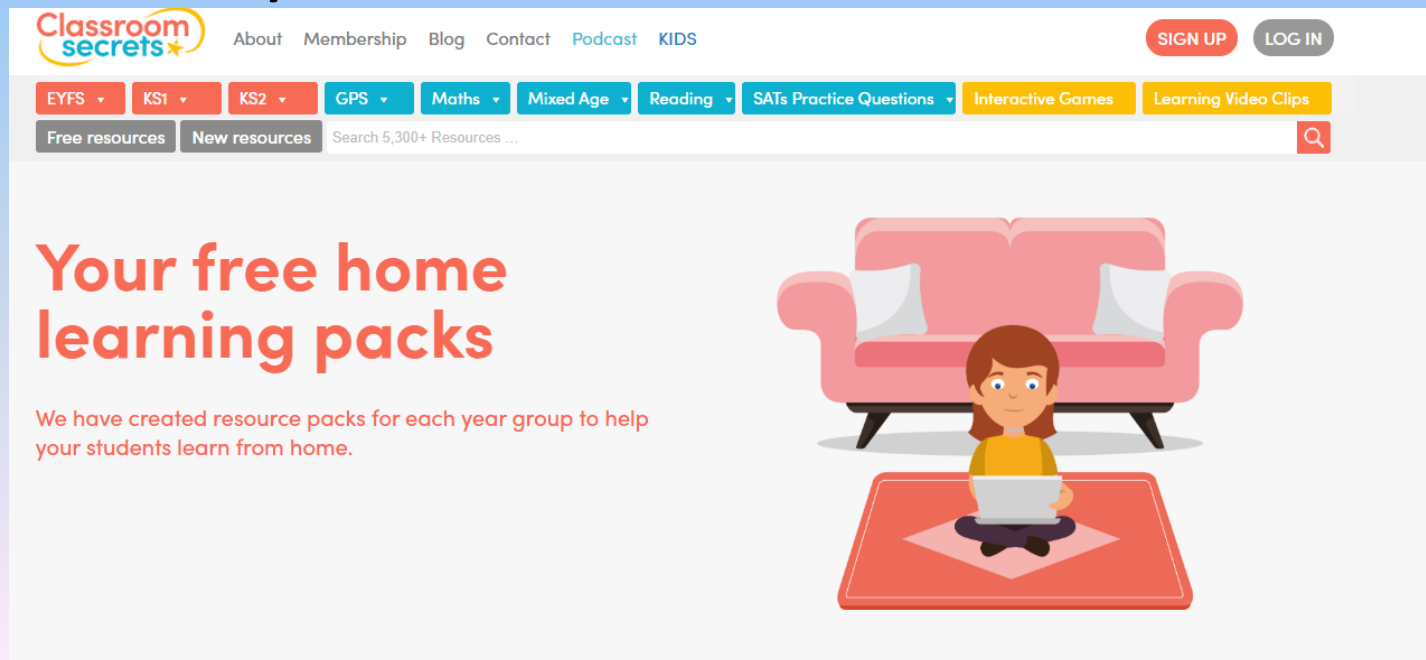
