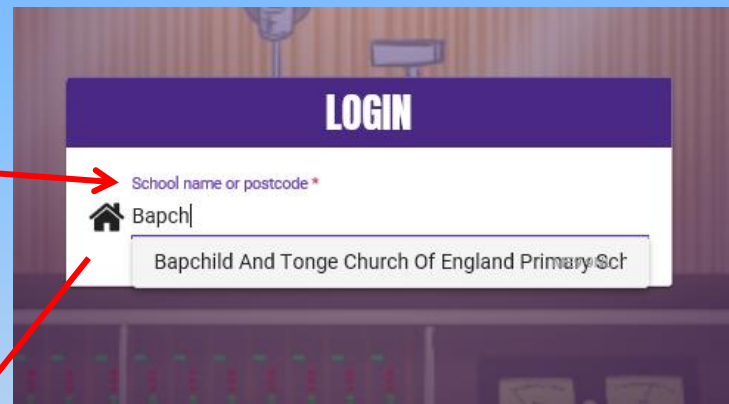
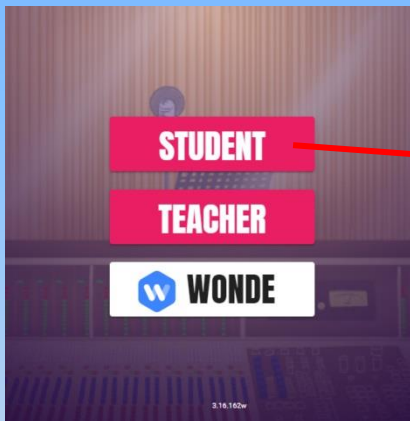
As schools worldwide close for now in response to COVID-19, you might be wondering how best to help your child or children with their studies at home.

English Learning

Back in Term 5 we looked at a story by the author and poet Michael Rosen. This week we are going to look at more of his work and concentrate on his poem.

Activity 1: We are going to compare two of Michael Rosen's poems. They are called Chocolate Cake and Down By The Dustbin. Below is a link to a video of Michael Rosen reading Chocolate Cake for you to listen to and on the next slide is a copy of Down by the Dustbin for you to read yourself. When you have listened to and read both poems write a comparison by answering the following questions.

1. What is each poem about?
2. Chocolate Cake is a quite long and Down by the dustbin is short. Do you think it they both sound like poems? What makes you think this?
3. Do both the poems rhyme? How do you know? Give examples of rhyming.
4. Which is your favourite poem? Why ?

Down behind the Dustbin by Michael Rosen

Down behind the dustbin

I met a dog called Ted.

'Leave me alone,' he says.

'I'm just going to bed.'

Down behind the dustbin

'Do you own this bin?' I said.

'No. I'm only a lodger.'

I met a dog called Sue.

'What are you doing here?' I said.

'I've got nothing else to do.'

Activity 2: Look again at the poem Down behind the Dustbin on the previous slide. For this activity you are going to write your own version of the poem. You will have noticed from the last activity that some of the words in this poem are rhyming so you will have to get your thinking caps on to think of some different rhyming pairs. Below is a copy of the poem. All the parts highlighted in yellow are the parts you have to change.

Down behind the Dustbin by Michael Rosen

Down behind the dustbin

I met a dog called Ted.

'Leave me alone,' he said.

'I'm just going to bed.'

Down behind the dustbin

I met a dog called Roger.

'Do you own this bin?' I said.

'No. I'm only a lodger.'

Down behind the dustbin

I met a dog called Sue.

'What are you doing here?' I said.

'I've got nothing else to do.'

Firstly you will have to think of your title for example 'Just around the corner' or 'At the bottom of my garden'. This will also be line 1 of the poem and will be repeated 3 times in the poem.

For line 2 you have to choose a different animal to meet with a different name. For example 'I met a snail called Paul'.

Line 3 can stay the same and for line 4 the last word must rhyme with the name. For example 'I'm crawling on this wall.'

So the beginning of my poem is:

At the bottom of my Garden by Mrs Clark

At the bottom of my garden

I met a snail called Paul

Leave me alone, he said,

I'm crawling on this wall.

Start with your first 4 lines and then repeat the pattern but with different rhyming words for lines 4-8 and 9-12.

Activity 3: Now you are going to research the author and poet Michael Rosen. Click on the link below and read the autobiography that he has written about himself. Then write as many facts and interesting things about him as you can. Try to do at least 10. You could also print a picture of him to stick with your writing or try and draw a picture of him yourself.

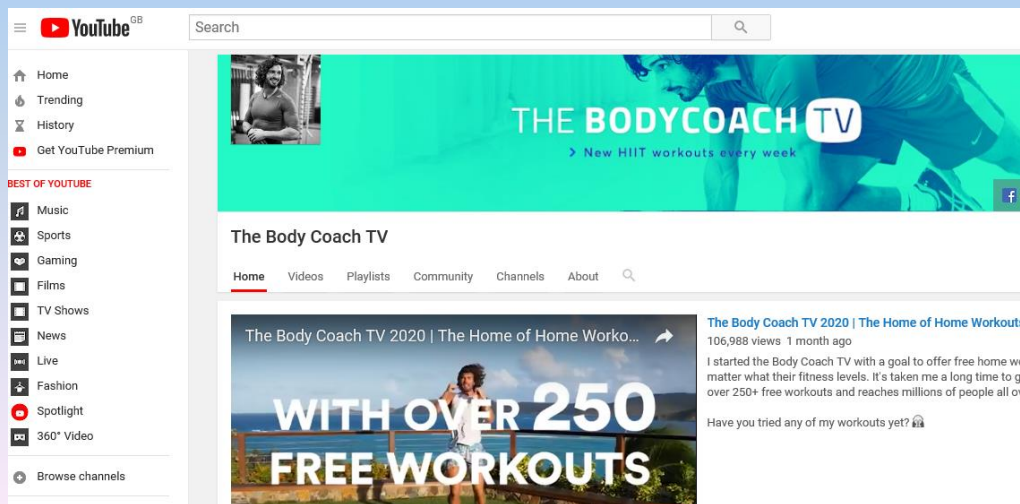
