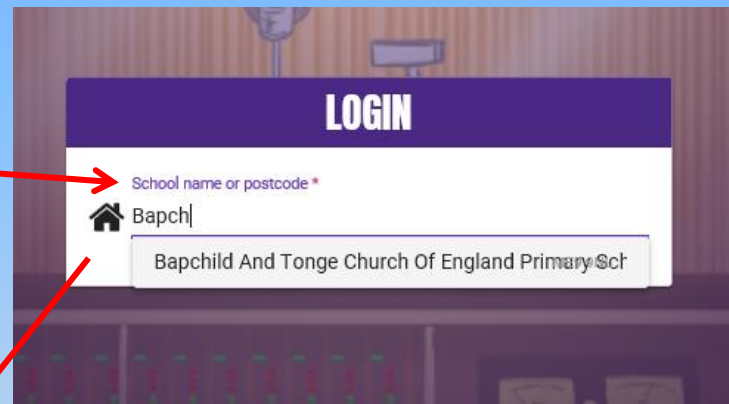
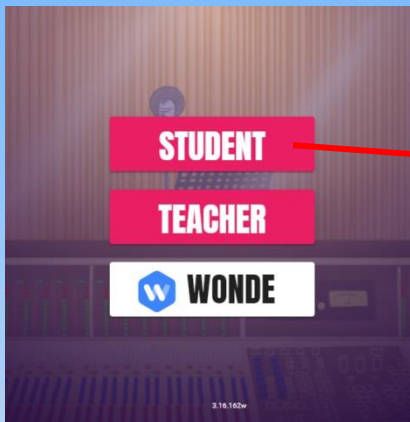
As schools worldwide close for now in response to COVID-19, you might be wondering how best to help your child or children with their studies at home.

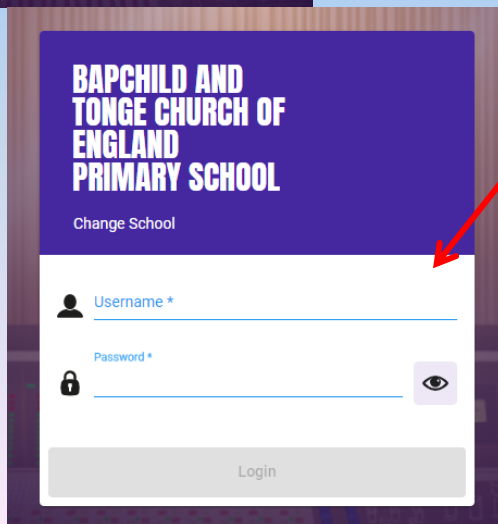

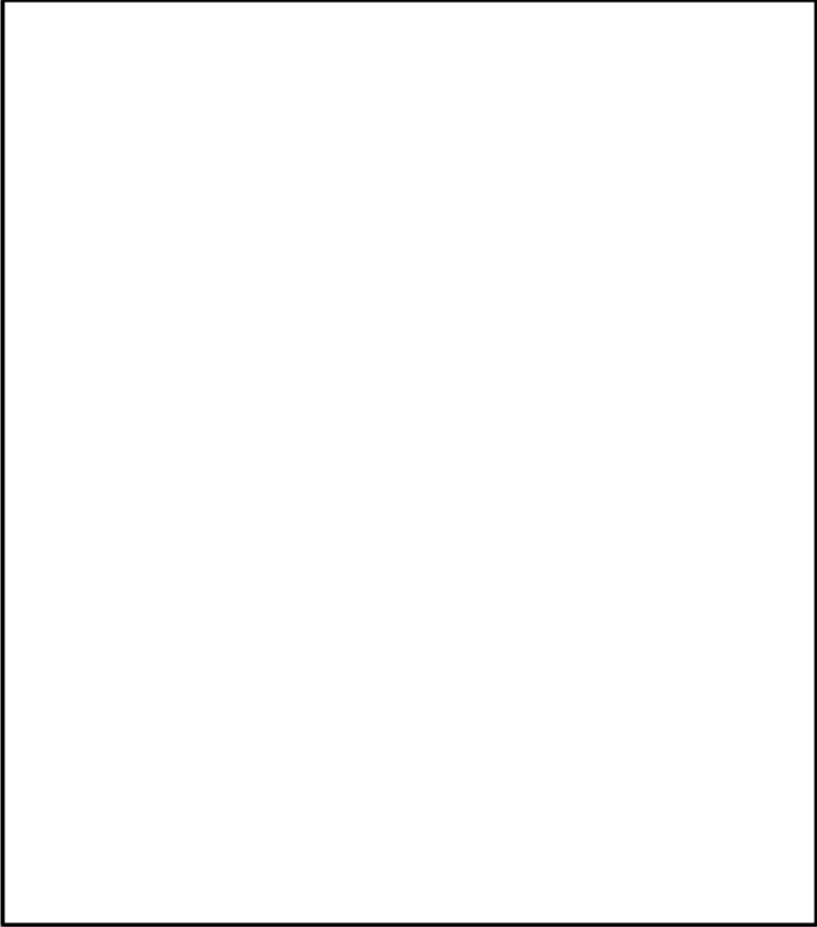
Activity 1: In the story Hansel and Gretel the two children come across a house made of sweets and treats. Think about how amazing that would be. What would you make a sweetie house from? What favourite treats would you include? You are going to design your own sweetie house. You can use the template on the next slide to help you but you might want to use bigger sheet. Make it as creative as you can. You could even use real sweets to stick onto your design. Think about what you would make the walls from. How would you stick the tiles on the roof? What are the beds made from? You can add as many labels and descriptions as you can.

➡ As an extra challenge why not make your sweetie house 3D with a cardboard box. You could add rooms to the inside and even stairs!

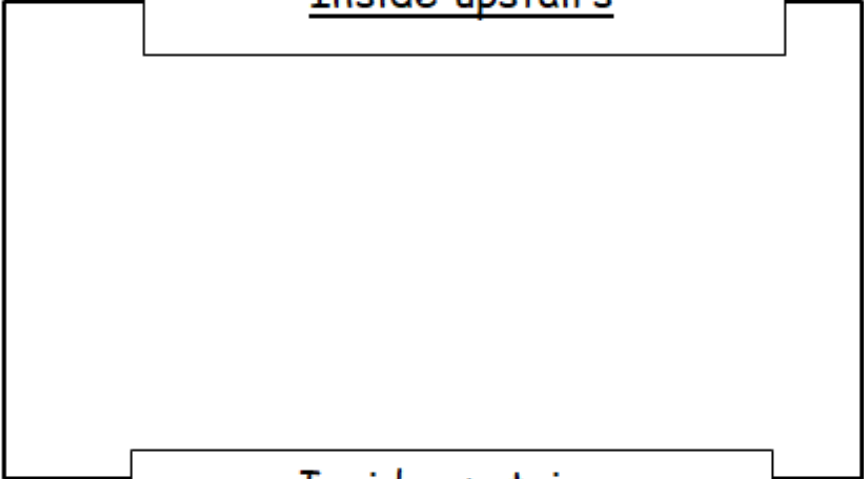


Designing my own sweetie house.

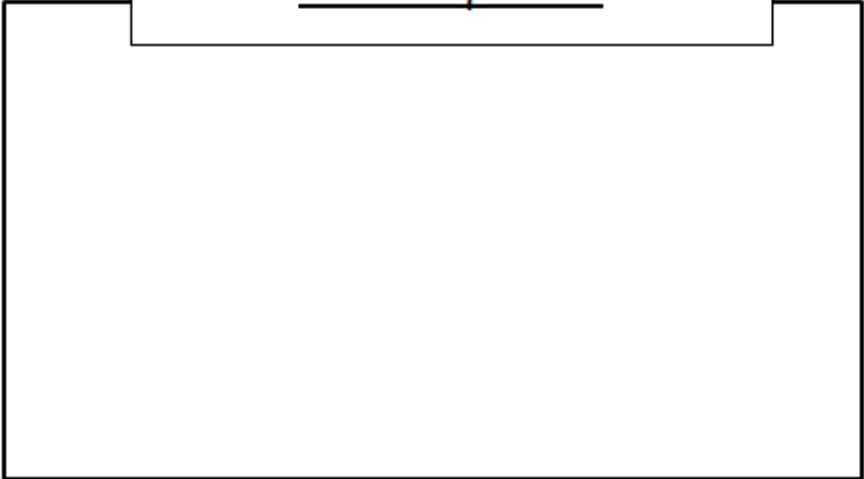

Activity 2: Now you have designed your dream sweetie house you are going to imagine that you are an estate agent and you are going to sell the house to a new owner.

Q: What is an estate agent?

A: Someone whose job it is to sell houses.

Estate Agents are very good at using words to **persuade** someone to buy a house. This means they exaggerate the good things about the house to make it sound as good as possible.

Have a look at the powerpoint that is on the home learning next to this one. It will tell you more about how estate agents use words and phrases to **persuade** the customer to buy the house. Have a go at the quiz.



Activity 3: Now you are going to write your own Estate Agent advert for your sweetie house. You need to try and persuade someone to buy the house so use some of the phrases from the powerpoint that you used in activity 2. The next few slides will help you with how to write your advert and there is a couple of templates for you to either print out or use it to help you create your own advert.

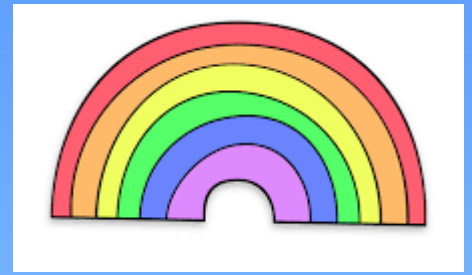

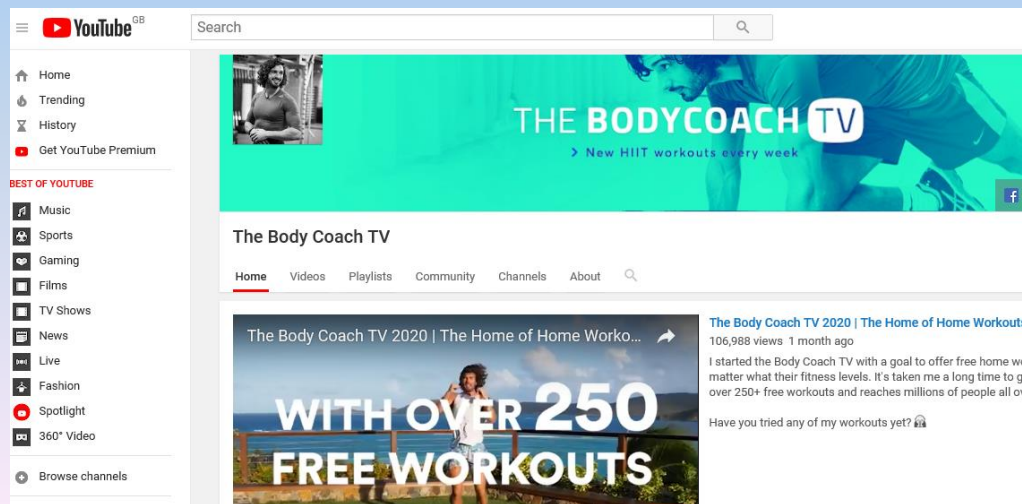
