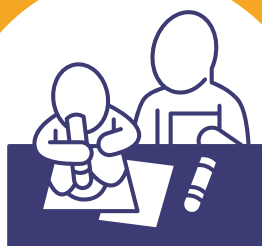


Stage of SEN Support at Bapchild



1.

Concerns Raised

Concerns are shared between the class teacher and family. Either the family or teacher can raise a concern - verbally or using the Concern Form.

2.

Class Observations

The Class Team will continue to support the child whilst observing the concerns - feedback gathered from all staff.

5.

Review Meeting

After the SENCo has completed the monitoring process, all parties will meet to review the findings. It will be decided if a Support Plan needs to be in place.

4.

Monitoring Period

If it is agreed that further investigation would be beneficial the SENCo will begin the monitoring period. The SENCo will make contact with the family if they haven't already.

3.

Initial Findings

The Class Teacher will share observations both with the SENCo and the family. There may be patterns emerging or the child may be presenting differently at school.

6.

Support Plan

This plan will put in place strategies at both whole class and individual level to support the child. It will be reviewed and the Class Teacher will share progress.

7.

External Support

During this time it may be determined that external support would be helpful, for example this could be a Speech and Language Assessment.

8.

Pupil Progress Review

The Class Teacher will share the progress and review provision with the Senior Leadership Team. Further intervention may be required.

11.

Regular Reviews

Every child is unique - some may make accelerated progress and no longer need a plan and some children may need to explore a variety of support that is on offer.

10.

Provision Review

This Plan will be reviewed at agreed intervals. This forms part of the Assess, Plan, Do and Review cycle and parents will be involved.

9.

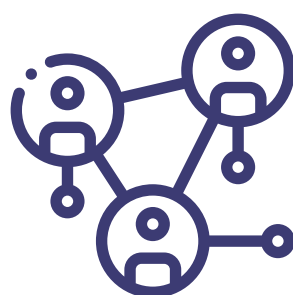
Personalised Plan

If progress is not being made, a Personalised Plan will be created for that child. The Class Teacher and SENCo will meet with the parents to discuss next steps further.

12.

Beyond Bapchild...

Parents may decide that an Education Health Care Plan Needs Assessment would be of benefit. Parent's apply directly to the Local Authority and the school will submit evidence and findings.
