Message from the class teacher

In the English section, I've added some spellings to have a practise of this week. Think about the usual way we'd learn them in class – find the definitions (what do these words mean?), what they look like in context (how would we use these words in sentences?) and think of a visual representation to support the meaning (can I create an image to help me remember this word?). You may even want to have a spelling test on Friday with an adult at home – you could test them on the words too!

Maths will continue with the White Rose lessons – again, please do not worry if you're not completely caught up. Just make sure you've completed the lessons from last week before this week.

I hope you're enjoying your home learning and are finding out new and exciting things! I can't wait until we're all back together and sharing our learning in class. Stay safe and hopefully see you soon,

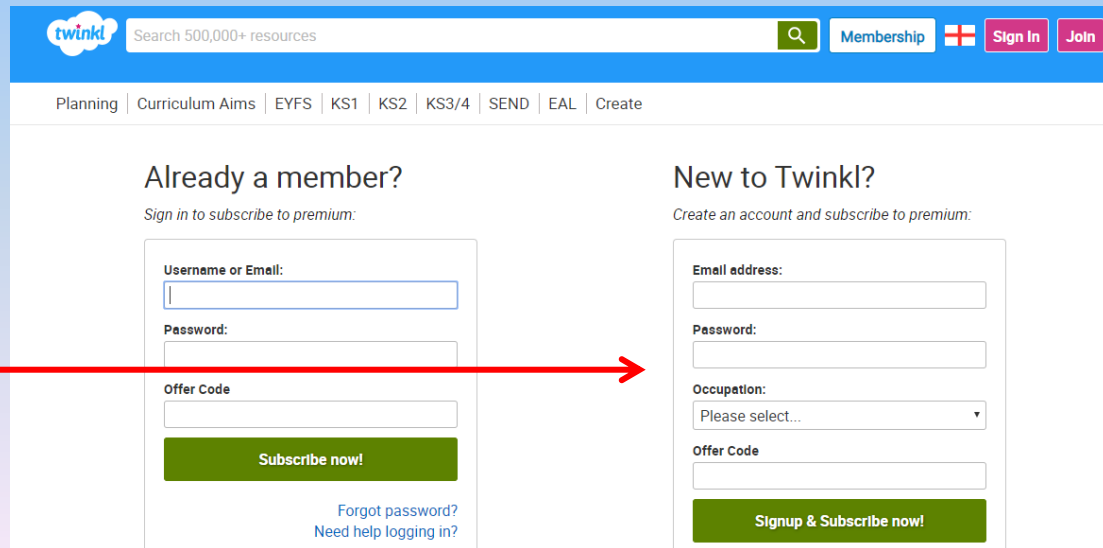
Accessing Twinkl

Chapter 1: The great Hall

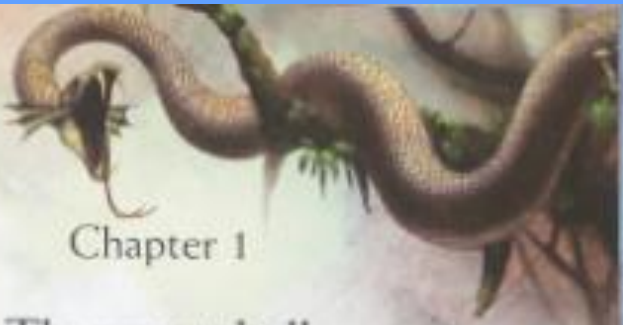
On the following slides, I have attached images of the first chapter of Beowulf.

Using the chapter, answer the following questions:

- ‘Denmark was a wild place’ – what does this suggest about it? Do you know where Denmark is?
- ‘they howled and growled and shrieked and snarled’ – why does the author list these different types of words? What is the impact/purpose of this? What types of words are ‘howled’, ‘growled’, ‘shrieked’ and ‘snarled’.
- The king, Hrothgar, is referred to as a ‘warlord’ – what does this suggest about him?
- We end the chapter with ‘But outside, something evil was rising...’ – What do you think is ‘rising’? What do you predict will happen in the next chapter?

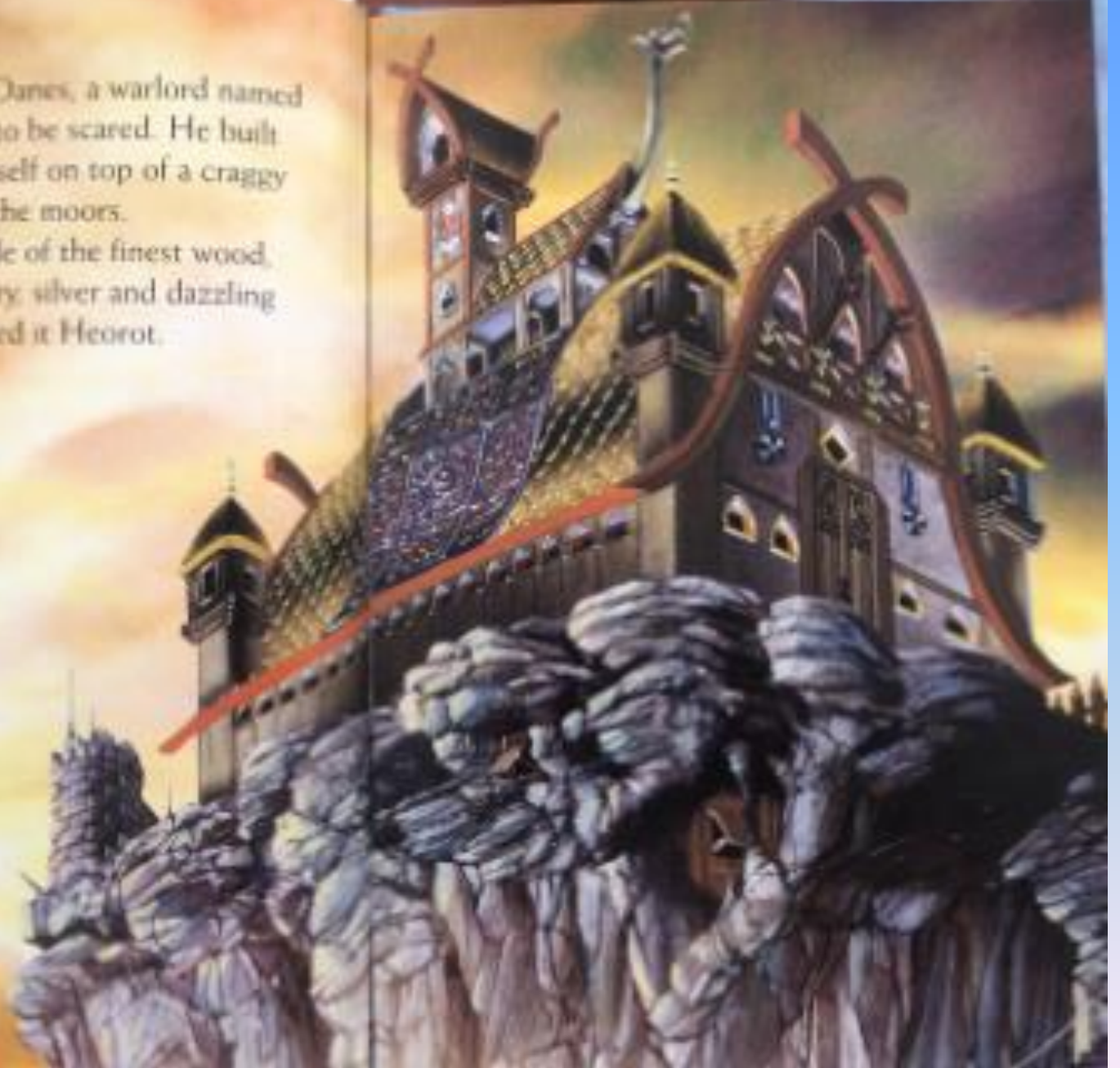
The great hall

Long, long ago, Denmark was a wild place. Gruesome monsters roamed the misty moors. At night, they howled and growled and shrieked and snarled.

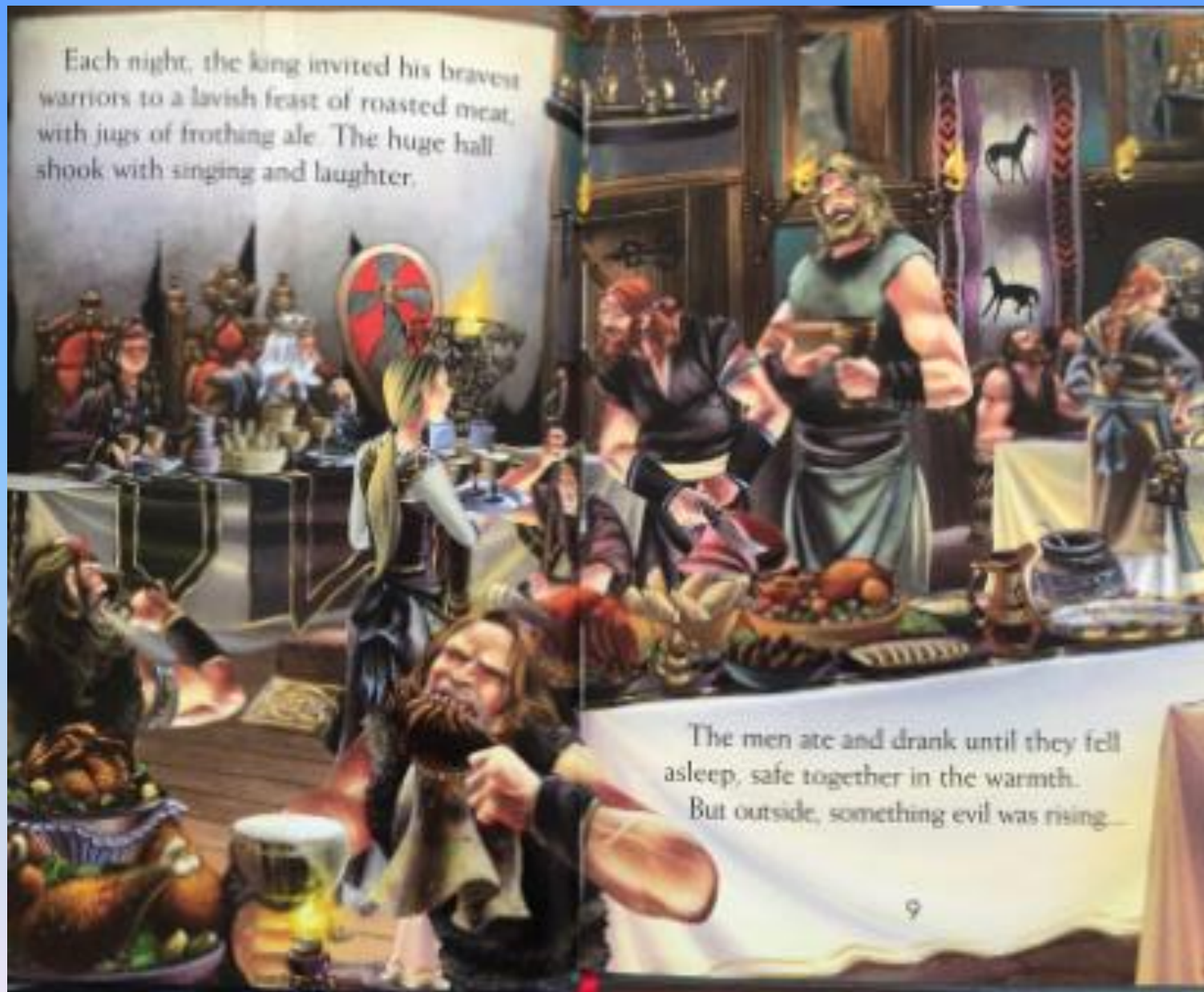


The king of the Danes, a warlord named Hrothgar, refused to be scared. He built a huge hall for himself on top of a craggy hill at the edge of the moors.

English Learning – Task 3

Words ending in -ent, -ence/-ency

Rules and Guidance

Use -ent and -ence/-ency after soft c sound, soft g sound and qu, or if there is a related word with a clear short /e/ sound in the right position

There are many words, however, where the above guidance does not help. These words just have to be learnt

Example Words

innocent, innocence, decent, decency, frequent, frequency, confident, confidence

obedient, obedience, independent, independence

Practise and try to learn the words on the 'example words'. We usually do 10 in class but you're welcome to learn all 12 from this list!

Maths Learning – Task 1

- Your first task will be to complete the Classroom Secrets work on adding decimals (<https://classroomsecrets.co.uk/free-adding-decimals-within-1-homework-extension-year-5-decimals/>). This can either be printed out and worked on or you could just use it on screen and write down your answers. The sheets are levelled by a D, E and GD. In class, we have used these letters to try work:
- D – If you're not 100% and need something a bit easier to try first.
- E – If you think you've got it but want a bit more practise.
- GD – You understand the concept and want a challenge.

You do not have to do just one of these – if you complete D and think it was easier than expected, you may want to move up to E. It is completely up to you.

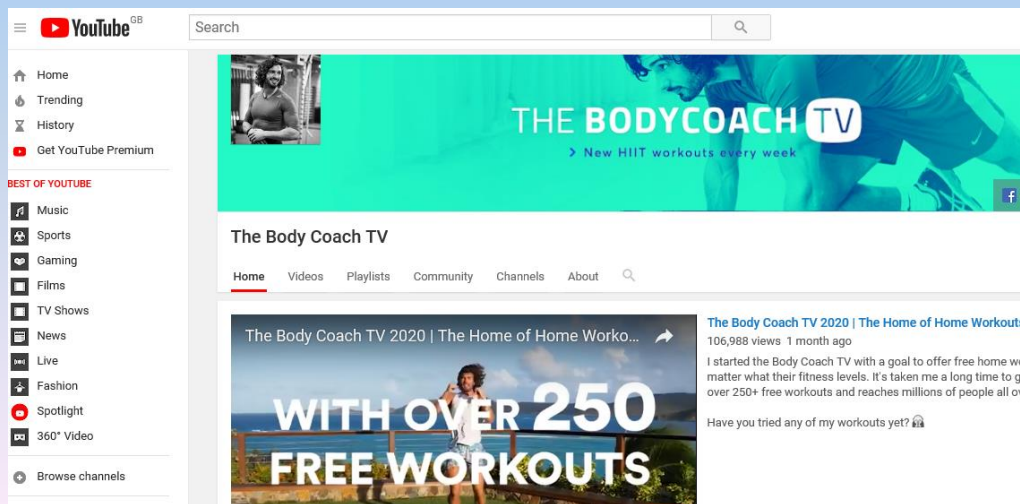
Think about the artwork we looked at last week. Can you write the descriptions that would be put under the art for when it is displayed in a gallery?

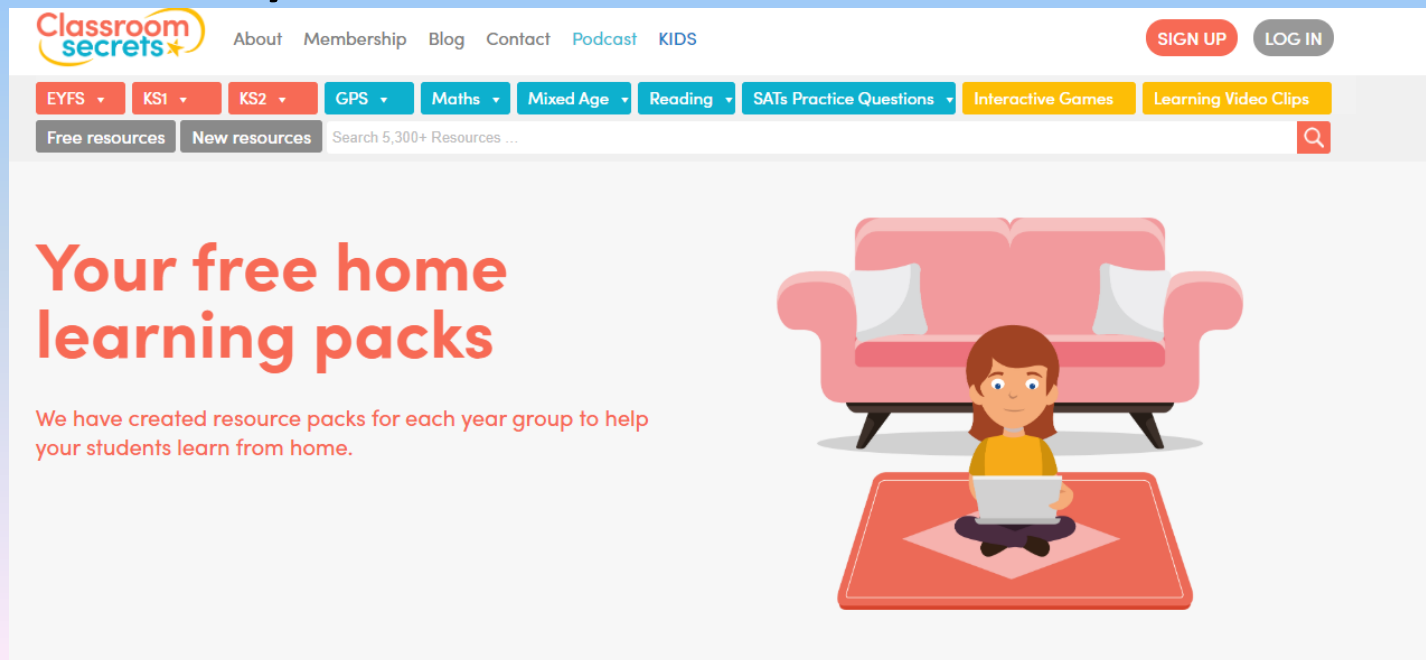
