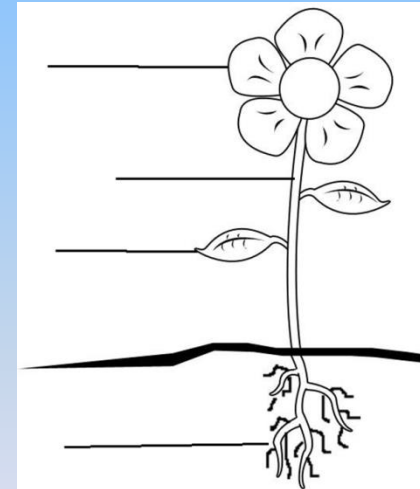
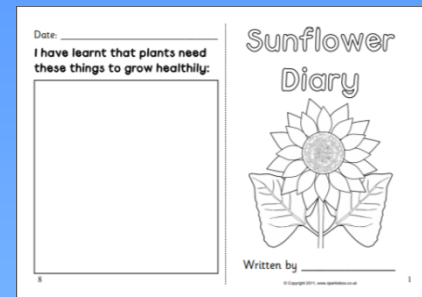
Science Learning

How are your sunflower seeds growing?
Some of them might be quite tall by now!

We need to learn to identify the parts of a plant including
root, stem, leaf and **flower**.

Find a plant (even a weed) and draw and label a diagram of it. Can you find out what the different parts are for? (Lots of helpful resources for this on Twinkl.) When you have done one drawing you could do one of another plant and compare how the parts are the same and different.

When you are eating vegetables think about which part of the plant you are eating. For example, when you eat a carrot you are eating the root and if you eat celery you are eating the stem. Could you find an example of when you eat the leaves or the flowers of a plant? How could you show what you have learned?



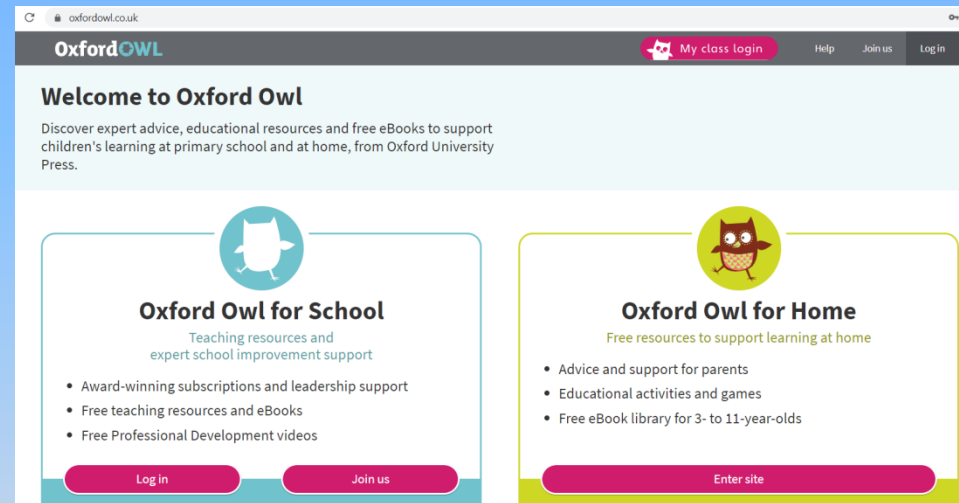
Reading

Mrs Smith's group are working on Phase 4.

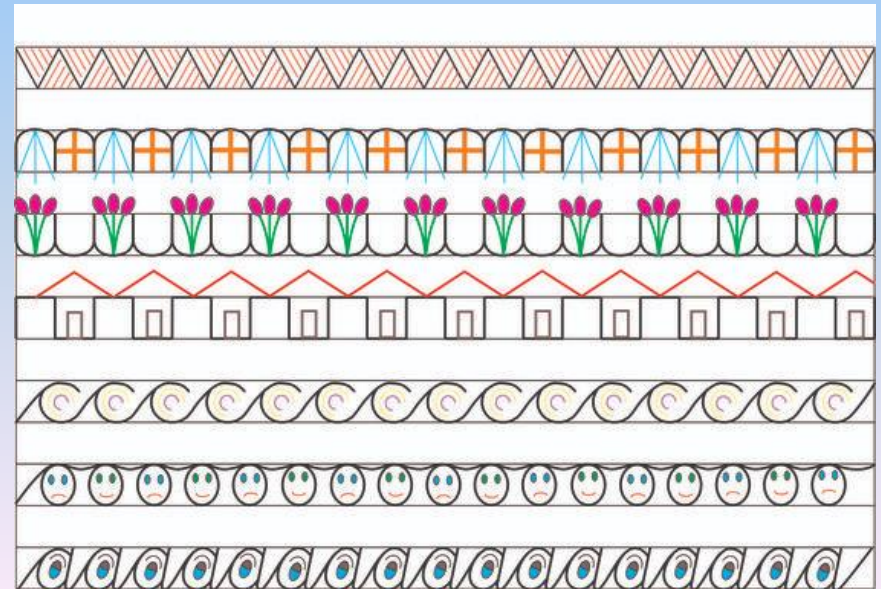
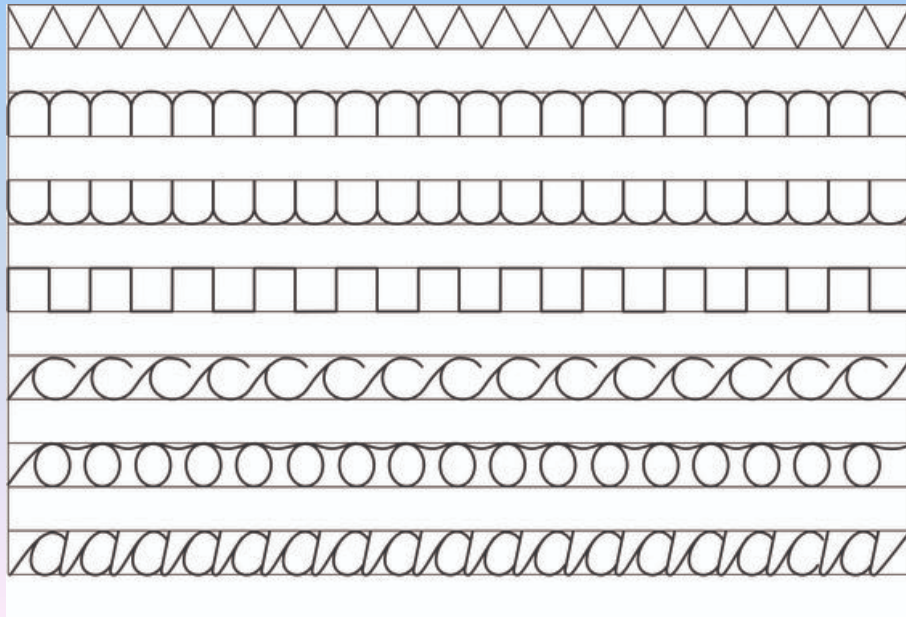
Additionally, there are many excellent Phonics resources on the Twinkl website(see below for how to get free access). Practising reading "alien words" is a particularly fun and valuable activity.

Writing

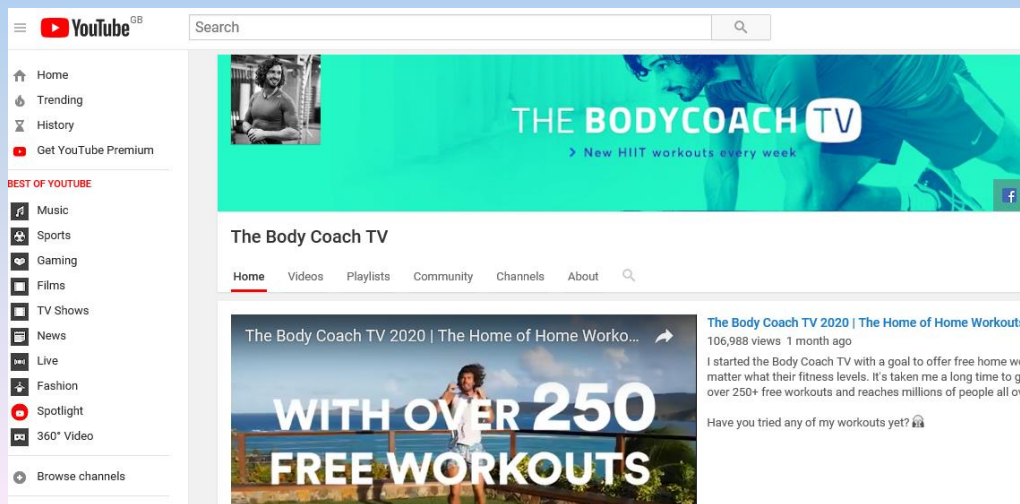

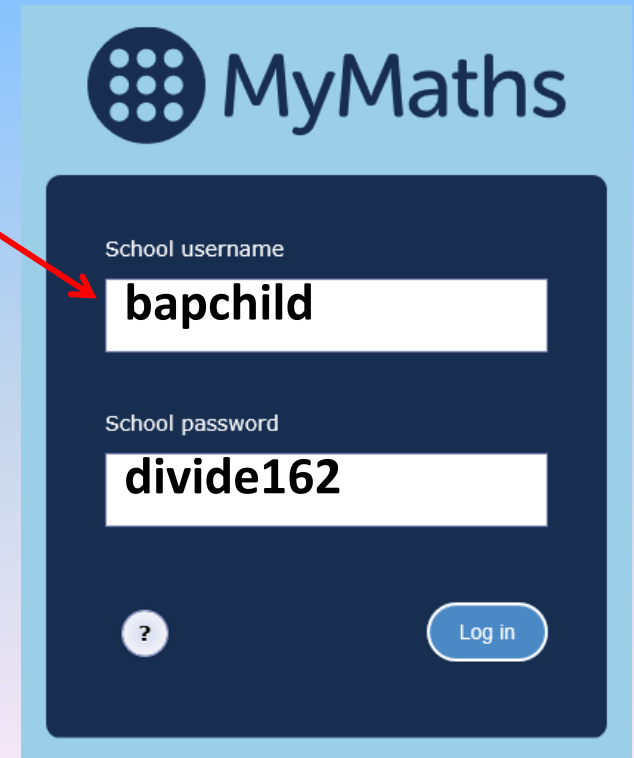
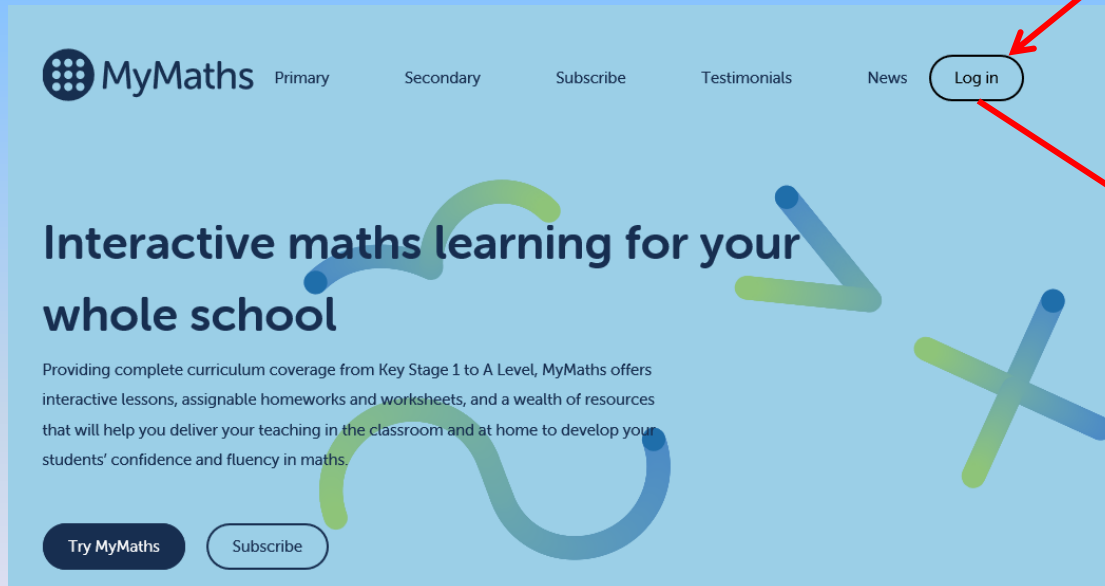
It is important to keep your children active. If it is safe to do so, ensure they have some time outside throughout the day. Please visit **Joe Wicks** YouTube channel

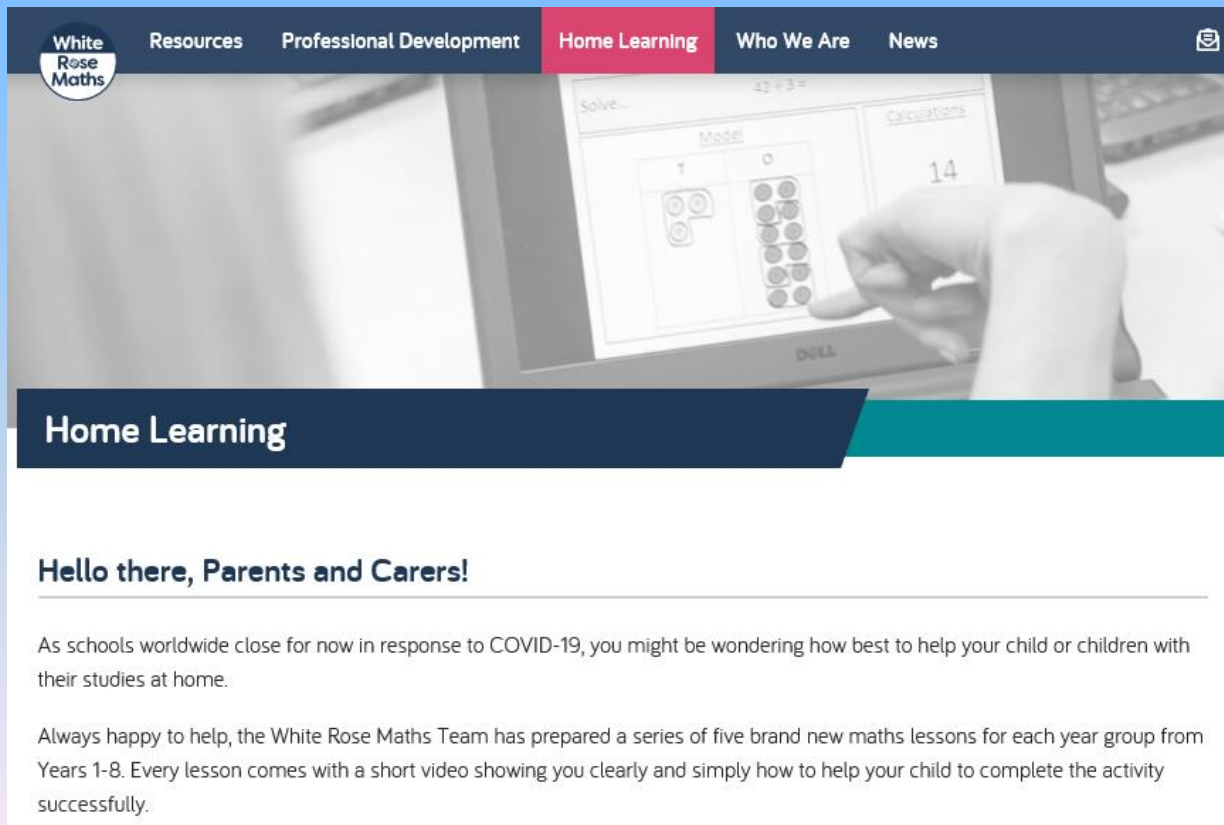
Access any lesson based on what your child is learning in class or search the topic in the search bar.

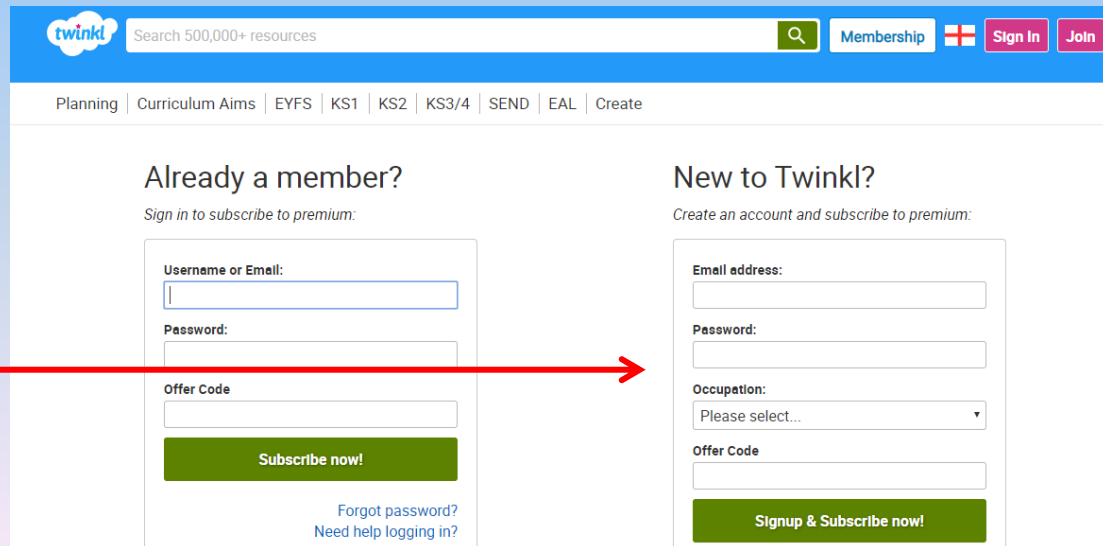
Accessing Twinkl
