Please also find below three English tasks, some White Rose Maths lessons and an Art Activity.

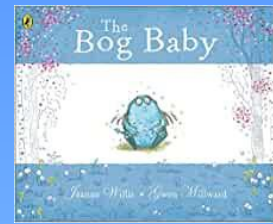

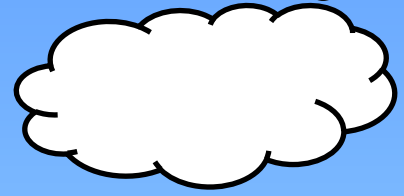
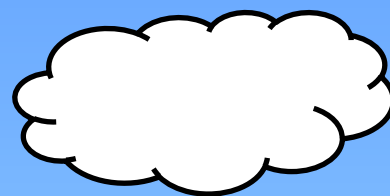
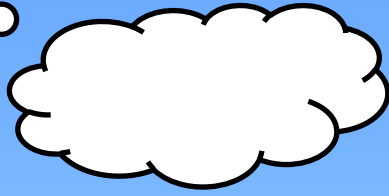
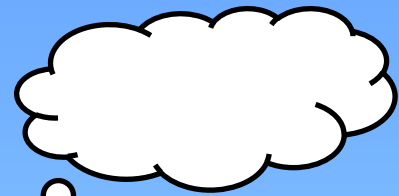


Time to write your very own Bog Baby adventure story. Hopefully you have planned your story and practiced telling it and that it has improved each time you have told it. Here are some tips to make sure your writing is really good:

1. As you write, make sure you say each sentence out loud first and listen hard to the sounds in the words and use your Phonics to write them down.
2. Remember to start each new sentence with a capital letter and end with a full stop (unless it needs a question mark or an exclamation mark).
3. Include adjectives to describe your Bog Baby and your Bog Baby's habitat.
4. Try to use some compound sentences, joining ideas with "and" to make your writing more interesting.
5. Remember the -ed suffix for verbs in the past tense (even though it sometimes sounds like -t). Can you use a word that starts with the prefix "un-"?
6. When you have finished, read through your writing very carefully to make sure it makes sense and you have included all the parts of the story.

When you are sure it is really good think about how you can present it. You could fold paper to make a little book and copy the story in your best handwriting and illustrate the different parts. Maybe you could copy your writing on a computer and illustrate it with photos. Maybe you could make a video of you reading your story out loud and showing the pictures. Remember to include a title page. Good luck!

Today you are going to write a diary entry from your Bog Baby's point of view. Pretend to be your Bog Baby. Get someone to ask you questions about your adventures. Can you describe what happened in the right order? Use the words First, Next, Then, After that and Finally to help you sequence the events in time. Remember that you will be using the First Person and the past tense. E.g. "Fred picked me up. At first I was scared. I didn't know where we were going. Then he put me in a sparkly bucket and gave me a fairy cake."

When you have rehearsed the diary entry by talking, try writing the sentences down. Make sure you include time words and feelings words.

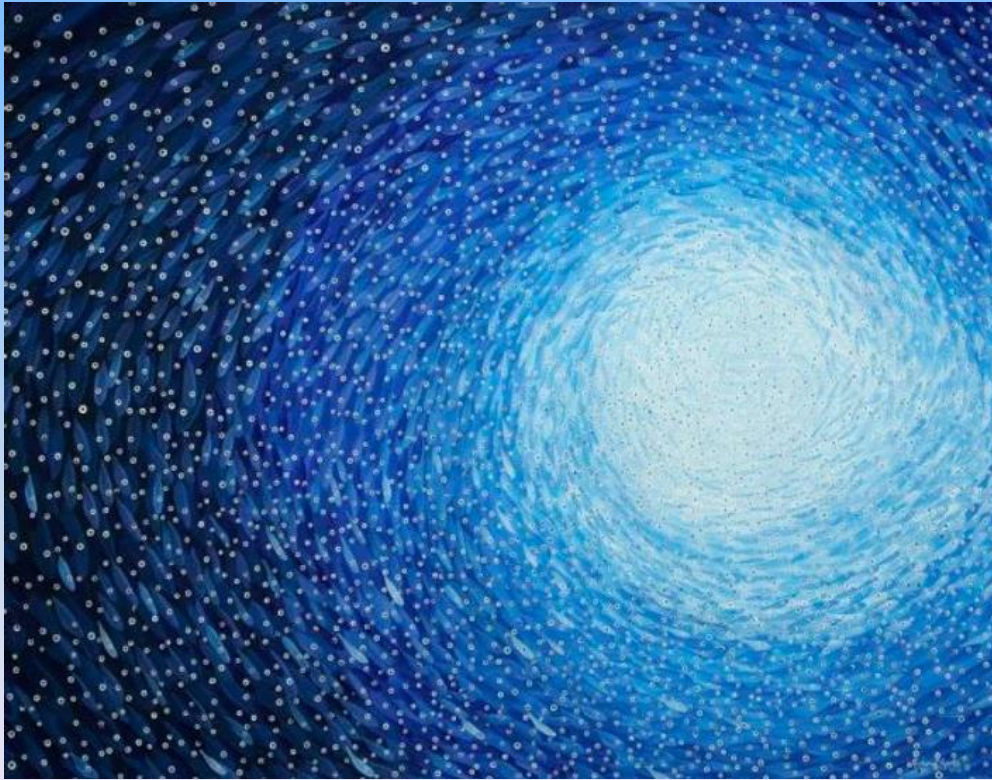

Art Learning

This is Kobina Nyarko. He is an artist from Ghana. He is 48 years old and lives in the city of Takoradi right next to the ocean. He paints huge paintings on canvas of thousands of fish. Take a look at these two paintings.

"Surfer's Pride"

Draw and cut out a small fish on a piece of scrap paper, old magazine or newspaper, like this.



Draw around this shape lots of times until you get lots of fish the same size. Cut them out. (You can get someone to help you do this as there will be a lot to cut out! Fold the paper to cut out lots at once.)



Now place them on the floor and make patterns out of them. Play with your fish. Take photos of them in different spiral and wave patterns.



If you have glue and big paper or recycled card, you can stick them down. Maybe you could even do your own version of a Kobina Nyarko painting.

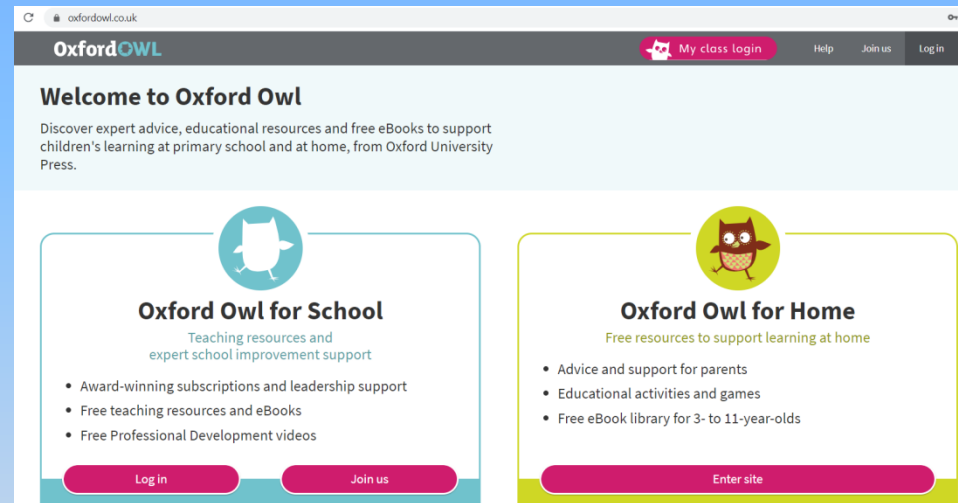
Reading

Mrs Child's Phonics group are currently working on Phase 5c (alternative ways of writing sounds we already know e.g. ai, ay, a_e all make the same sound).

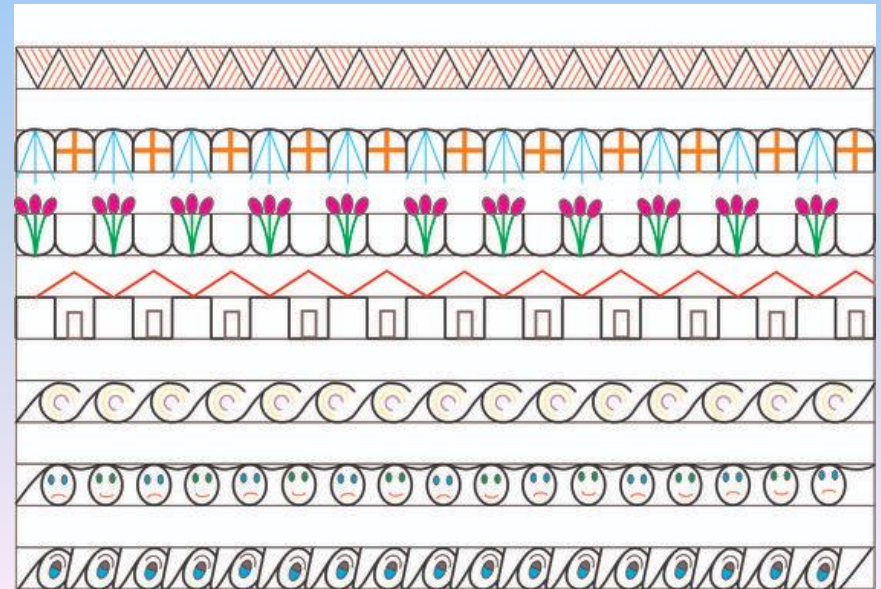
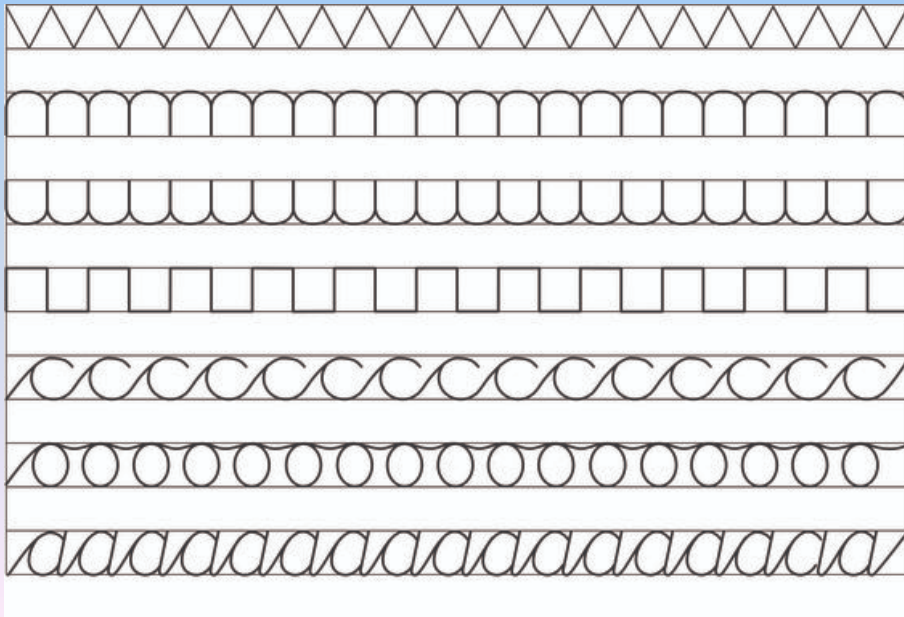
Mrs Smith's group are working on Phase 4.

Writing

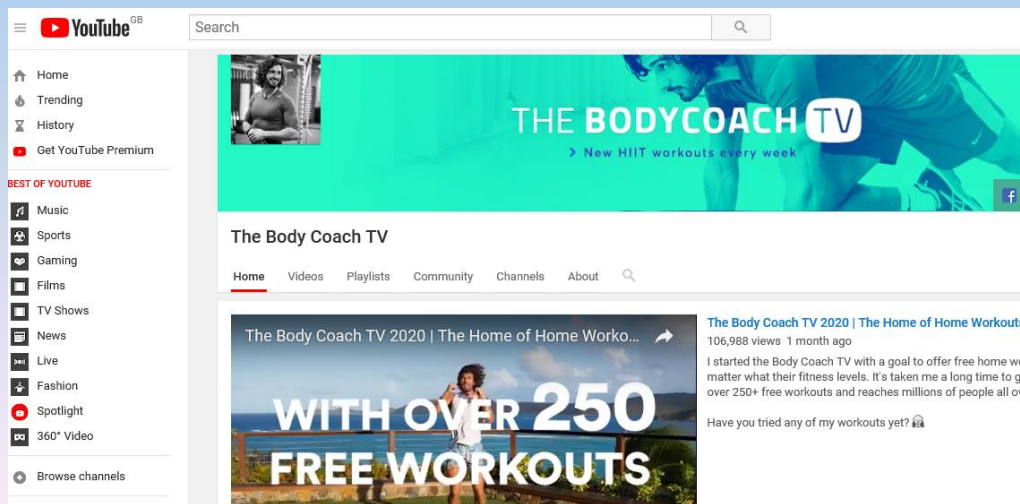

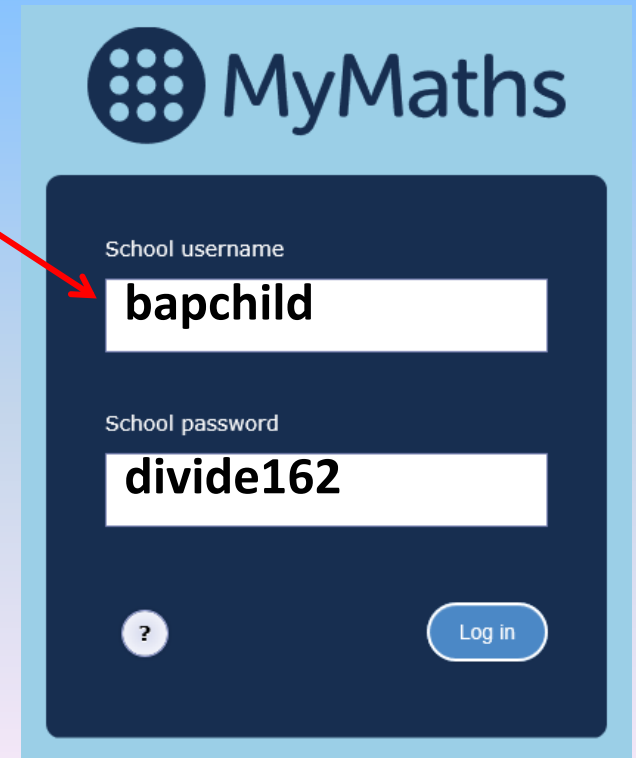
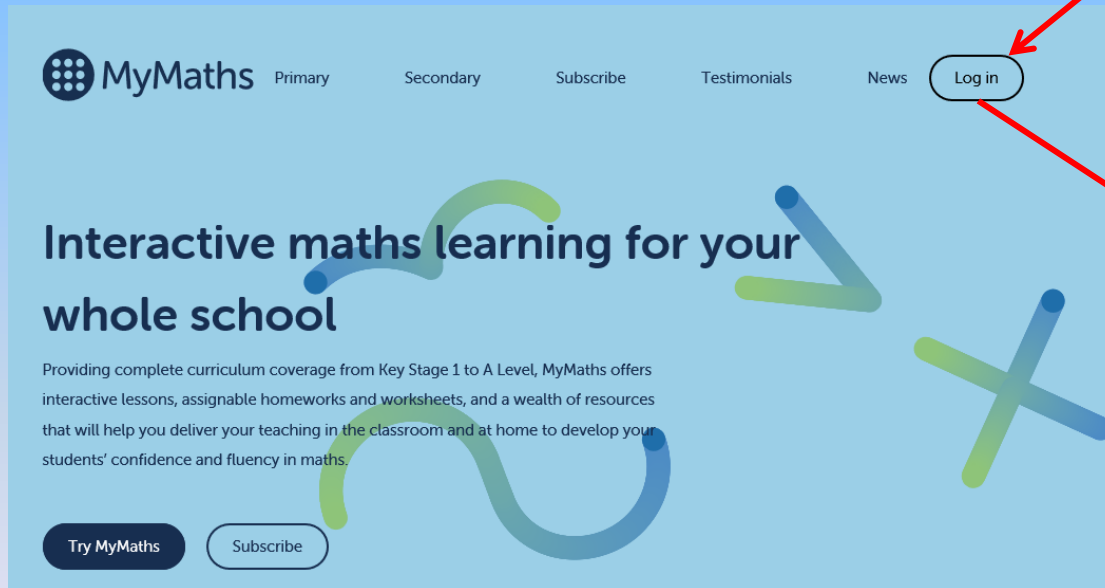
It is important to keep your children active. If it is safe to do so, ensure they have some time outside throughout the day. Please visit **Joe Wicks** YouTube channel

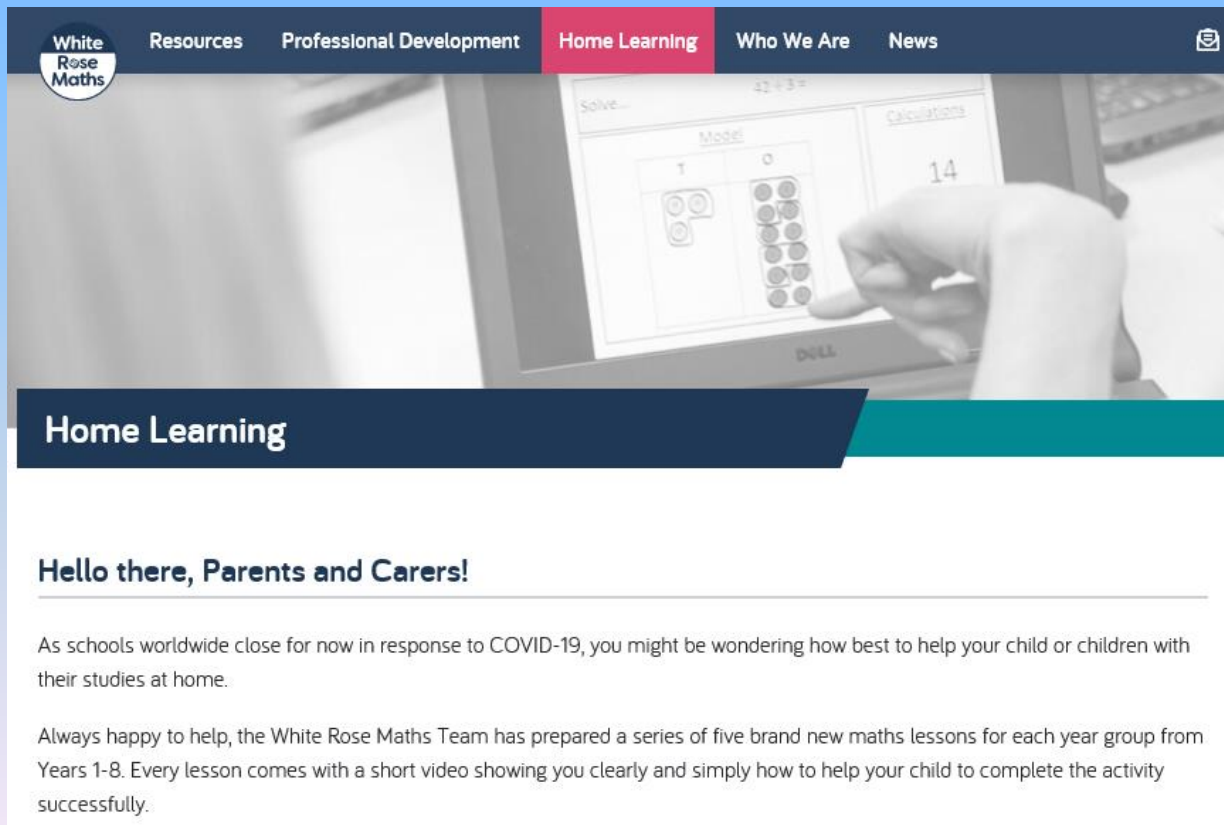

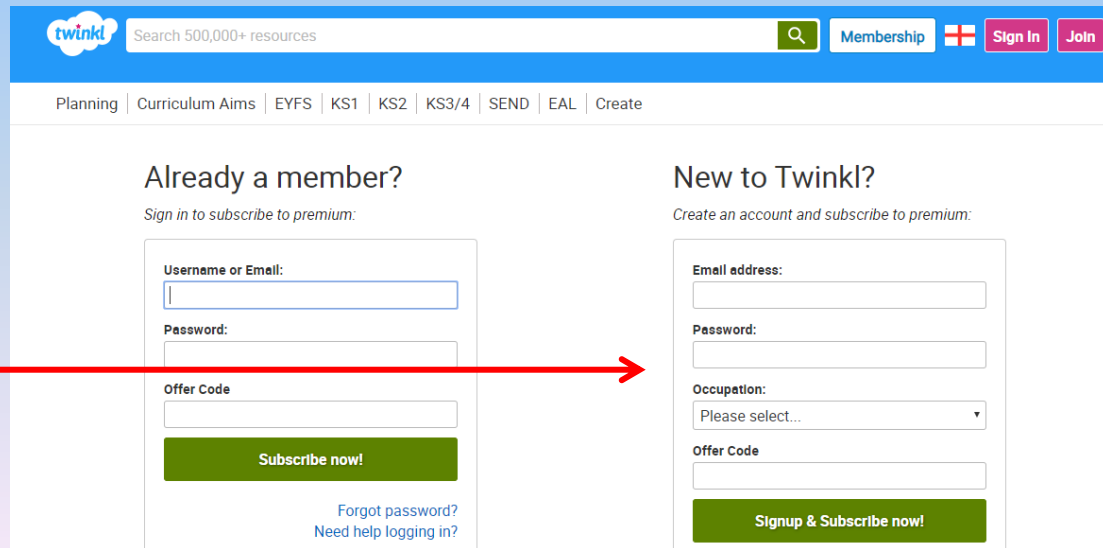
Accessing Twinkl
