'o_e' Spelling Game

Instructions: A game for 2 players. Each player takes it in turn to roll a dice. If a player lands on a 'missing letters' square, they must copy the word onto a whiteboard, filling in the split o_e grapheme, and reading the word to their partner. If a player lands on a sentence square, they must either write or say the sentence to their partner before moving on. The player who reaches the 'FINISH' first is the winner.
