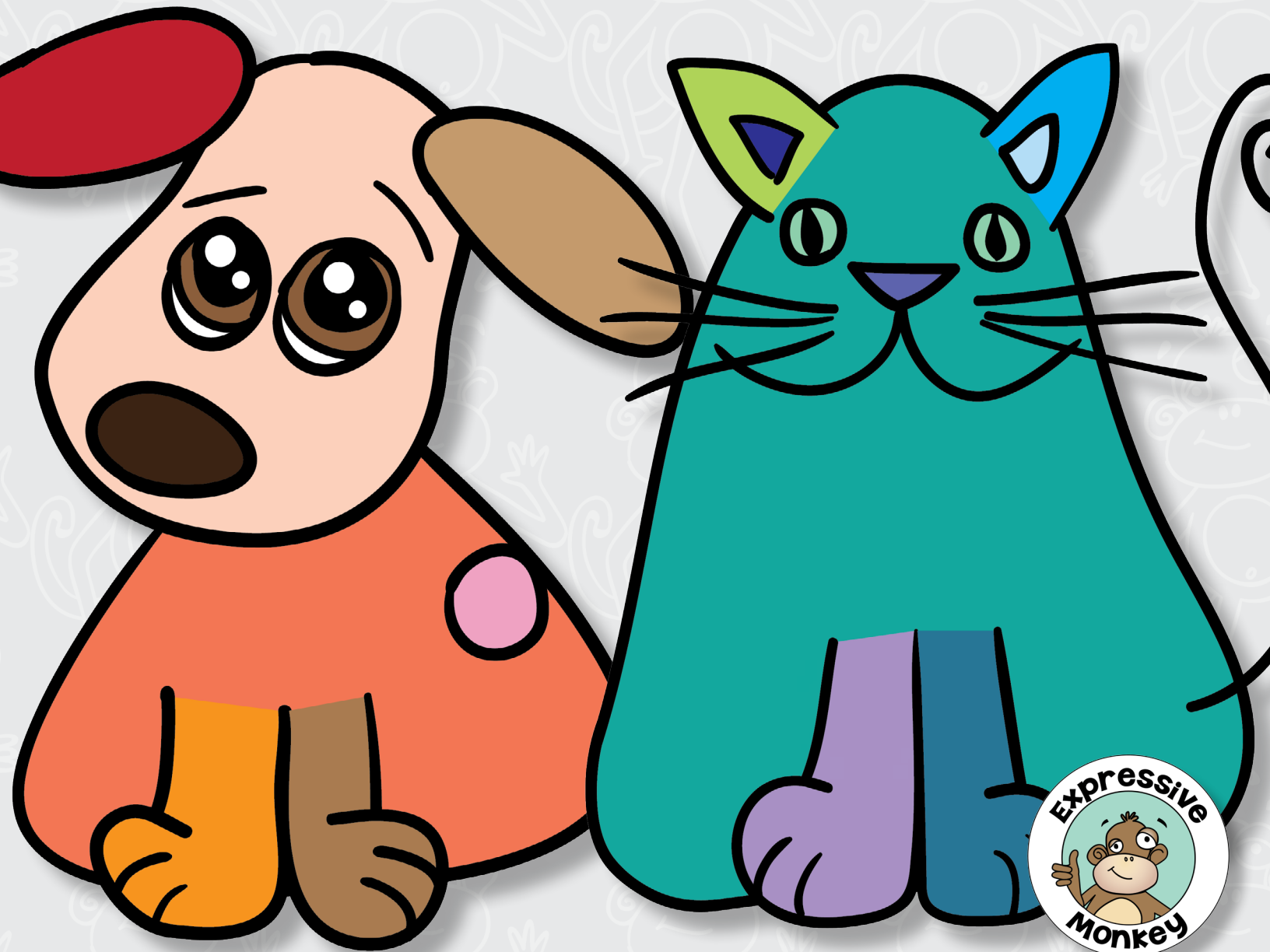
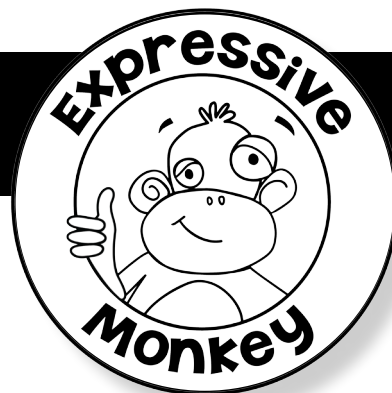

gray is also a cool colour.

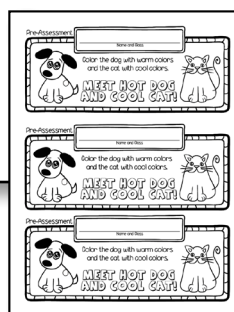

LESSON 1: THE COLOUR WHEEL

Pre-assess students using the
hot dog and cool cat pre-
assessment.

Introduce students to the colour
wheel and show them how they
can understand colour mixing
by using the colour wheel. Have
them fill in the colours of the colour wheel
by using only the primary colours
to mix the secondary colours.

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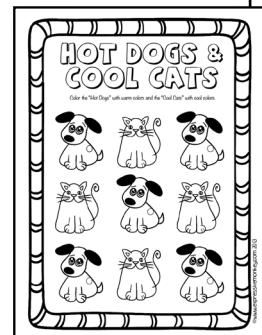
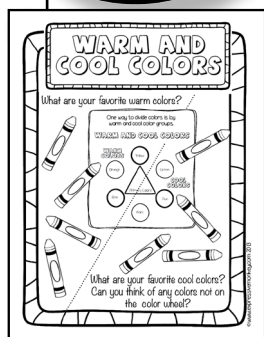

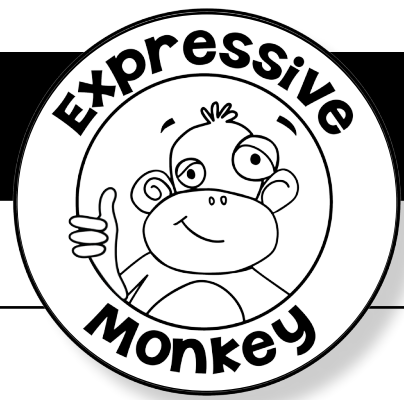
LESSON 2: WARM AND COOL COLOURS

Introduce students to the concept of warm and cool colours.
Ask students to name things that feel warm and cool or remind
them of feeling warm or cool. Point out that many of the things
they mention also have warm and cool colours. Show them how
the colour wheel can be divided into 2 sides; the warm colours
and the cool colours. Have them fill out the warm and cool
colour wheel and add some of their favourite warm and cool
colours that are not on the colour wheel (Like pink, turquoise,
gold, and lime green).

Let them get started colouring the dogs with warm colours and the cats with cool colours on the "Hot Dogs and Cool Cats" colouring page. (This can be something they come back and work on any time they finish early during the next couple of lessons.)

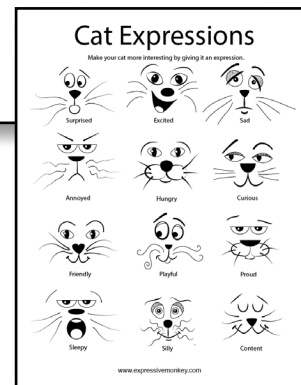
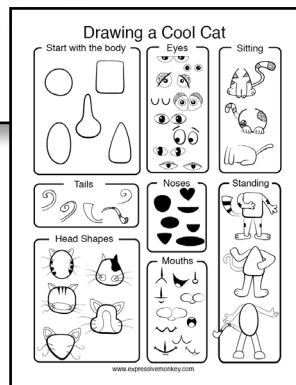

LESSON 3: COOL CATS

Show students (and demonstrate) the step-by-step page on how to draw Cool Cat. Have them try drawing Cool Cat. (In their sketchbooks, if they have them.)

Next show them the 2-page "Drawing a Cool Cat" and "Cat Expressions". Let them try out a couple of their own cats. Have them colour their favourite cat with cool colours.

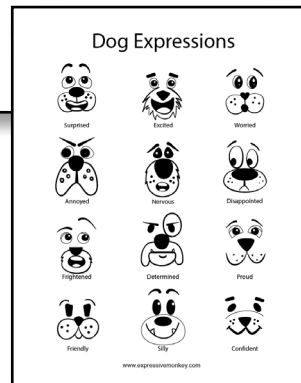
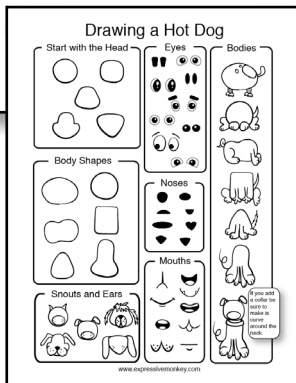
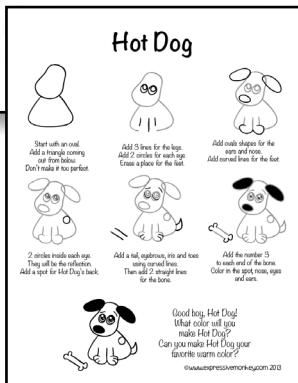


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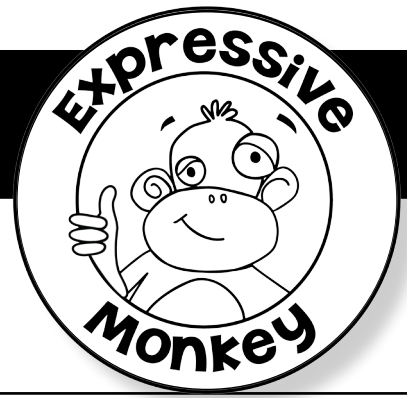
LESSON 4: HOT DOGS

Show students (and demonstrate) the step-by-step page on how to draw Hot Dog. Have them try drawing Hot Dog. (In their sketchbooks, if they have them.)

Next show them the 2-page "Drawing a Hot Dog" and "Dog Expressions". Let them try out a couple of their own dogs. Have them colour their favourite dog with warm colours.

LESSON 5: HOT DOG AND COOL CAT FRIENDS

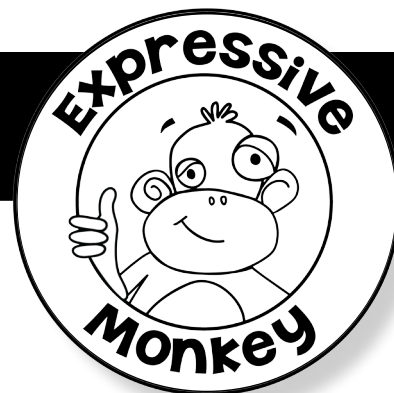
Give students a final piece of paper 9x12 or larger, and have them draw their favourite hot dog and cool cat. While they are drawing, ask them to think of a name for each one. (They could write the name on the back of their paper if they don't want to forget.)

Have students add warm and cool colours to their pictures. (Your choice of media.) A favourite media for me is using Crayola markers to make cat and dog "fur" lines. Then go over the marker lines gently with a wet brush. The marker "bleeds" and spreads the colour between the marker lines. Darker colours usually work best for seeing this. Try mixing 2 or more coloured fur lines, then see what happens when they mix.

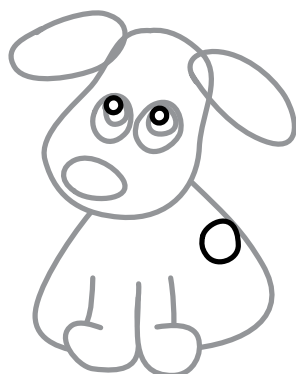
Start with an oval.

Erase a place for the feet.



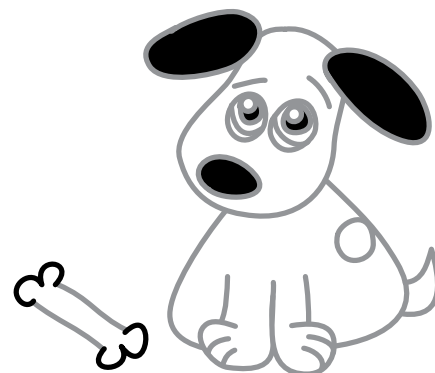
Add ovals shapes for the

Add curved lines for the feet.



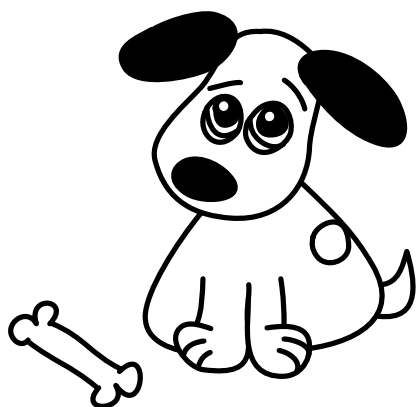
1 circle inside each eye.
They will be the reflection.
Add a spot for Hot Dog's back.



Add a tail, eyebrows, iris and
toes using curved lines.
Then add 2 straight lines
for the bone.



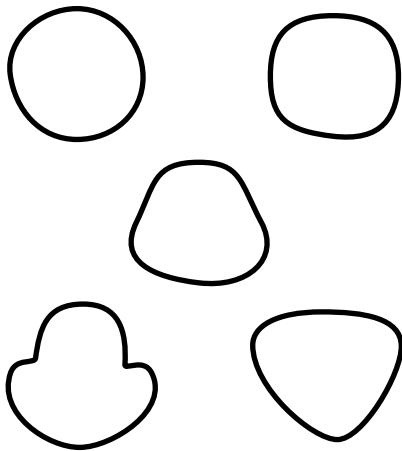
Add the number 3
to each end of the bone.

and ears.



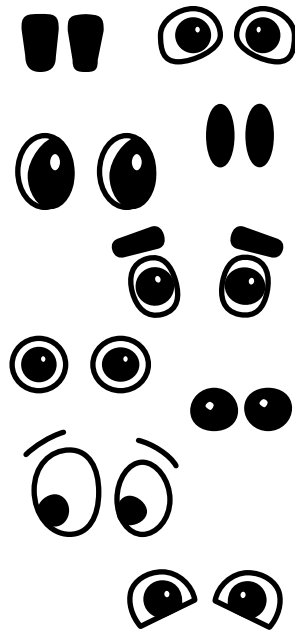

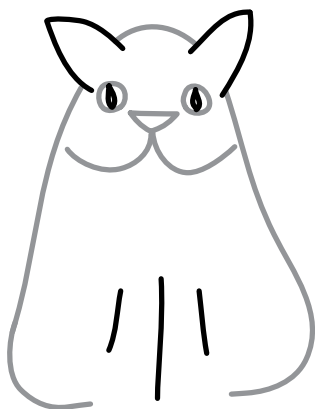
Start with a triangle with rounded corners.
Don't make it too perfect.



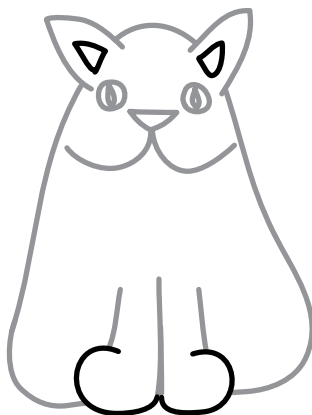
Add a triangle for the nose.



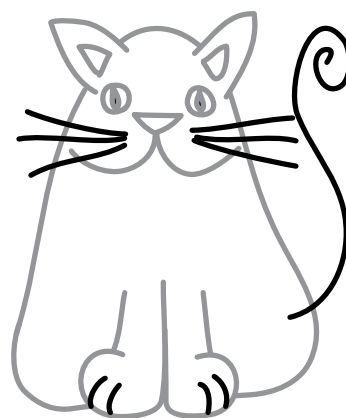
2 circles for the eyes.

Erase a place for the ears and feet.



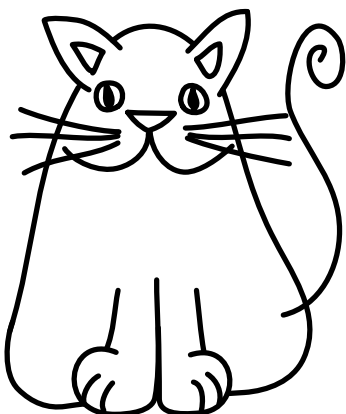
Draw 2 curved lines for the ears and the inside of the eyes. Three lines for the legs.

2 curved lines for the feet.



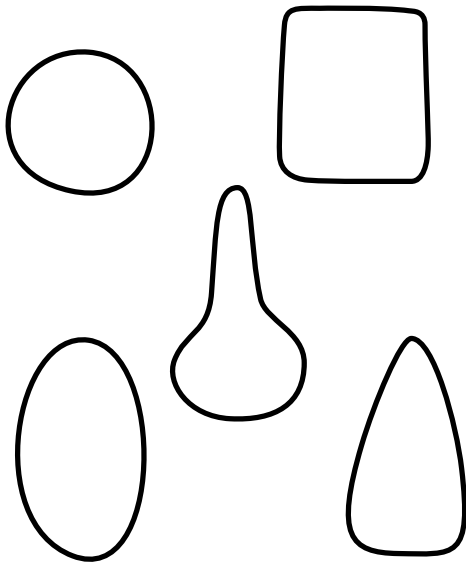
Add straight lines for the whiskers and curved lines for the tail and toes.
Fill in the eyes.



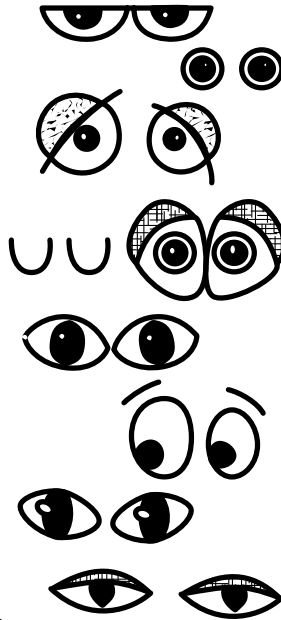
