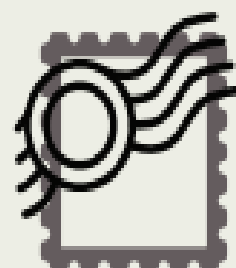


Dear Granny,

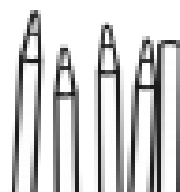

Fill in your key with a different colour for each spelling and then colour in the picture.

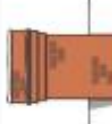
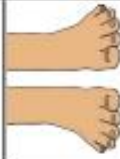

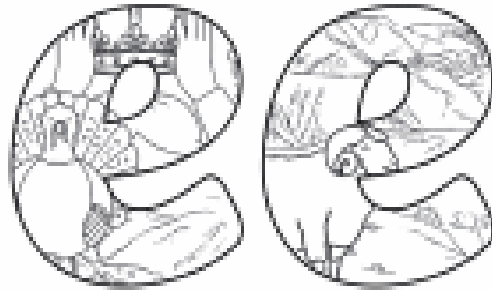
