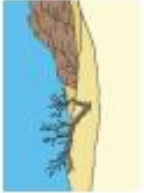

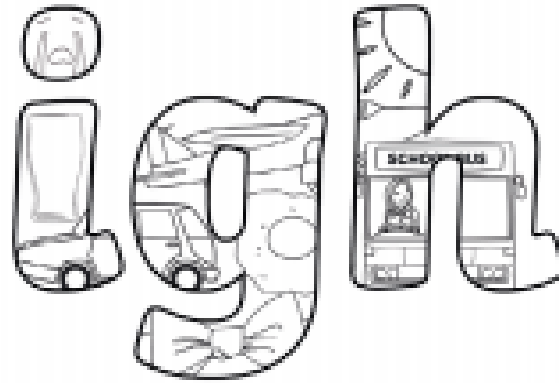

"Never fear!" replied Ned. "I am a knight and I shall get you to your wedding on time!"

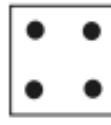
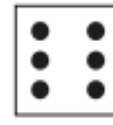
