English Learning

Task 1

This week we are learning the new sounds 'ow', 'oi' and 'ear'. A good demonstration of how to say these sounds is on YouTube - https://youtu.be/BqhXUW_v-1s?t=23

Have a go at finding examples. Here are some examples of words below:

- owl, cow, row, town, down
- oil, coin, soil, join, coil, boil
- ear, hear, beard, fear, tear

Next:

- Practice writing these sounds,
- then writing words with these sounds in, and
- then using a word of their choice in a sentence.

Use phonics play, to play the game buried treasure with these sounds. These can be found under phase 3.

Task 2

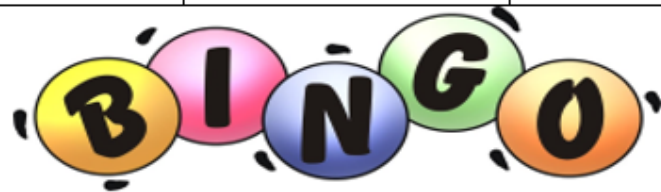
To help your child recognise their high frequency and tricky words, we often play word bingo.

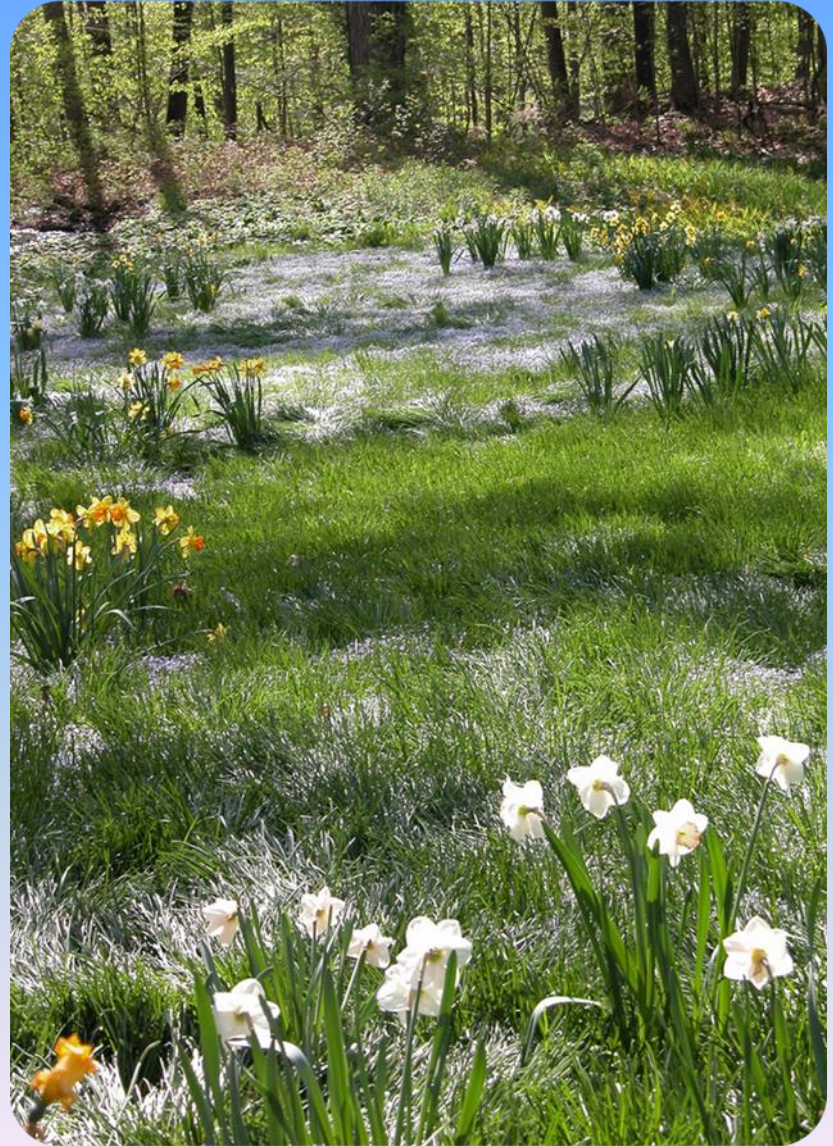

Maths Learning

Repeating patterns are based on 1 or more repeating units, eg red-green-red-green or red-blue-green-red-blue-green or red-blue-blue-red-blue-blue.

Create your own 2 colour repeating pattern. So you might use your toys, for example red car – blue car – red car.



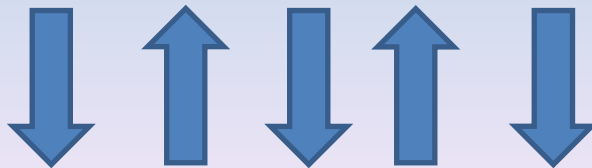
Can you explain what is that is repeating?

Create a woodland setting, with animals emerging from hibernation.

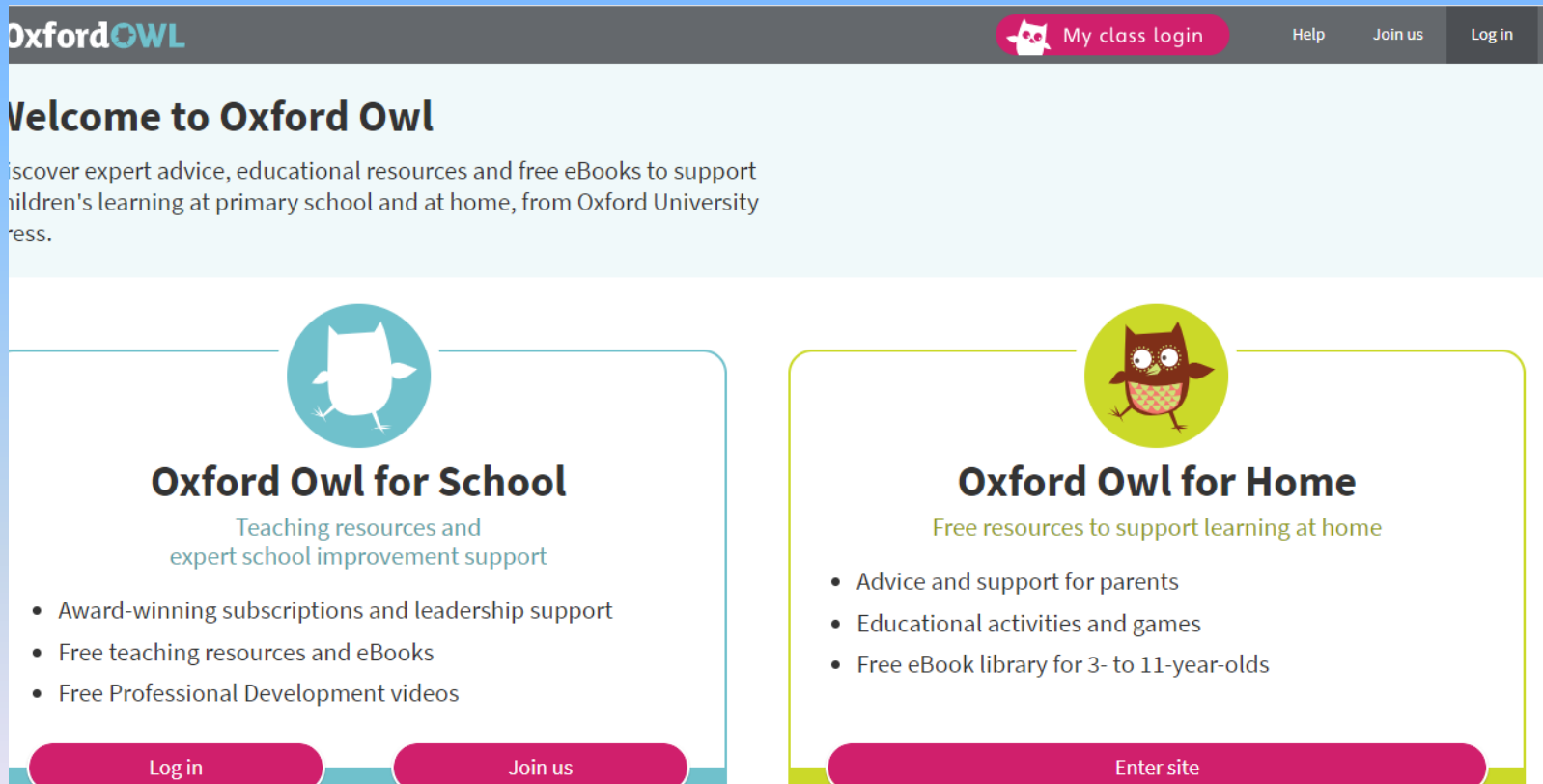
Perhaps draw a picture or use your toys to do this.

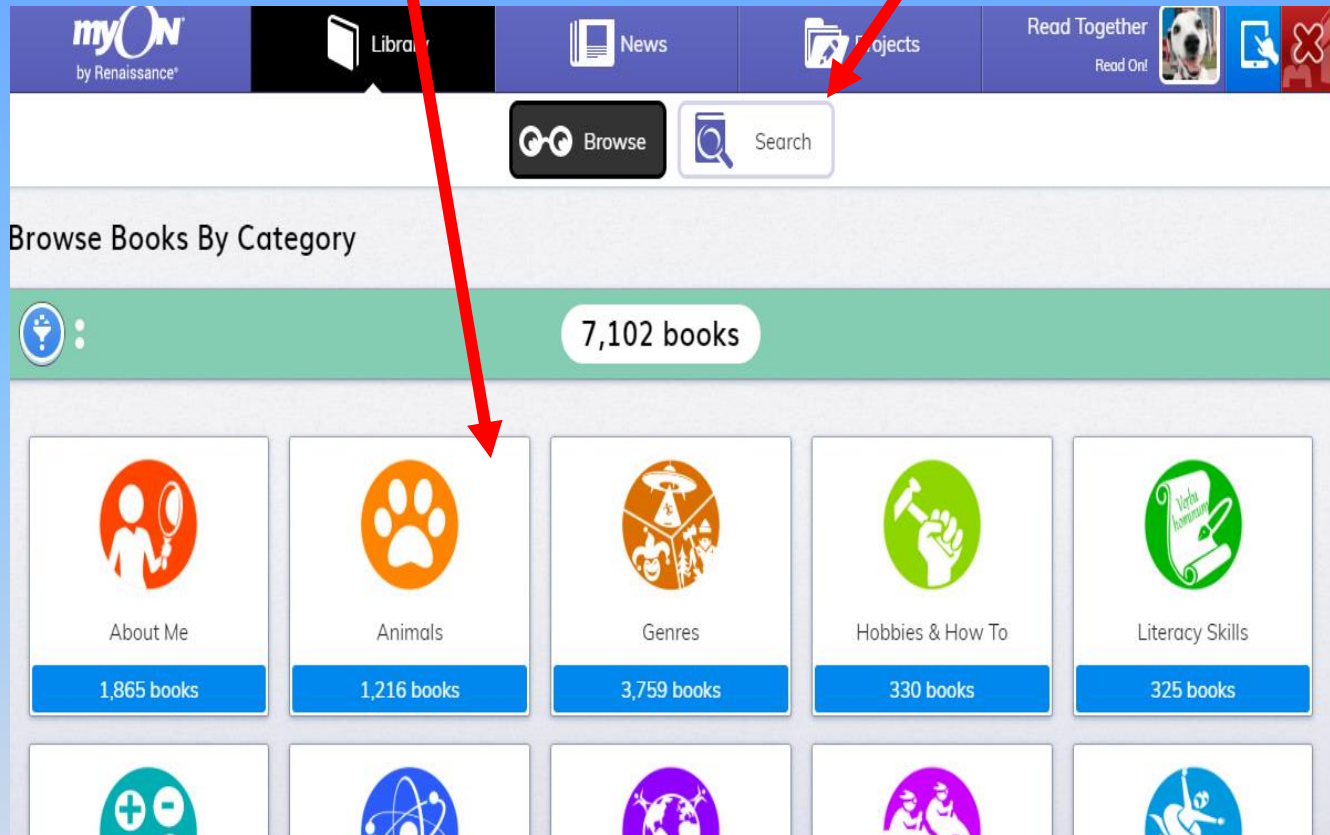

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

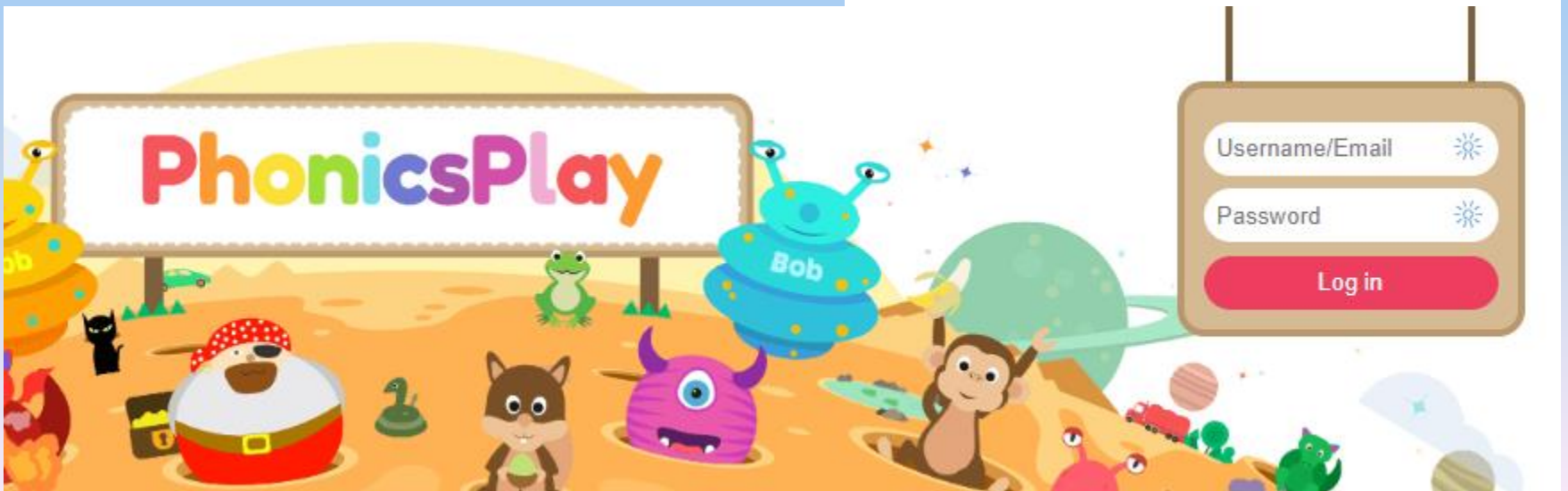
Phonics

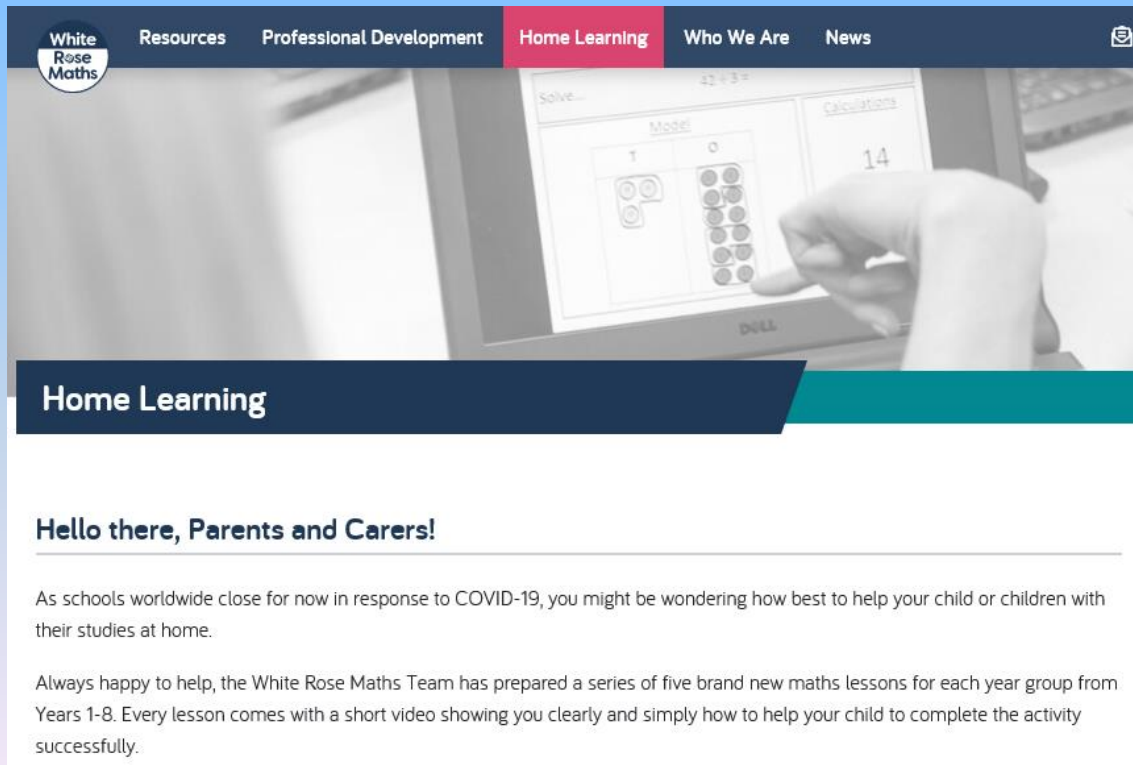


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

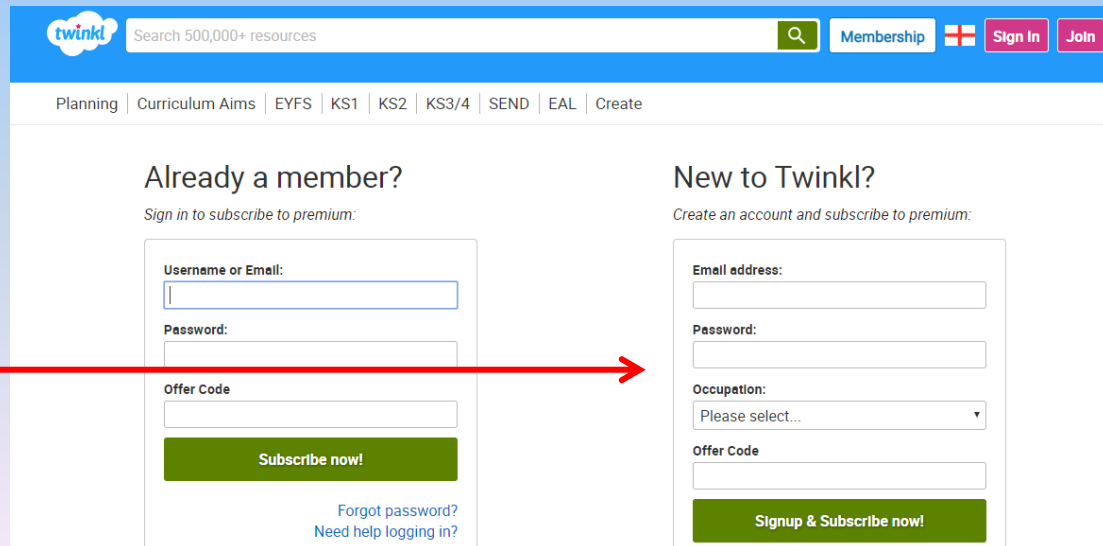
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

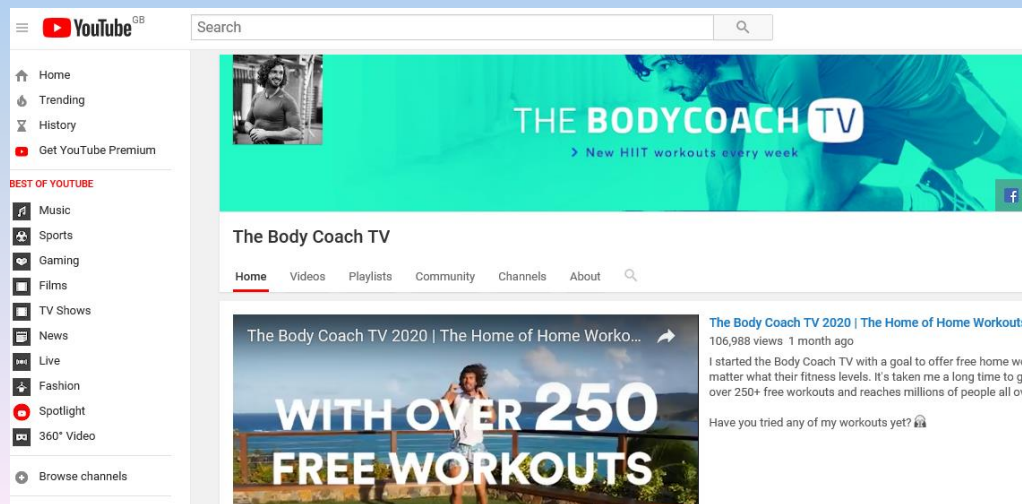
