English Learning

Task 1

This week we are learning the new sounds 'air', 'ure', and 'er'. A good demonstration of how to say these sounds is on YouTube - <https://youtu.be/ob7bOrRtX3Q?t=72>

Have a go at finding examples. Here are some examples of words below:

- air, fair, pair, hair, chair
- pure, cure, secure, injure, treasure,
- hammer, letter, dinner, burger, boxer

Next:

- Practice writing these sounds,
- then writing words with these sounds in, and
- then using a word of their choice in a sentence.

We are still concentrating on learning our tricky and high frequency words. There are no new ones this week.

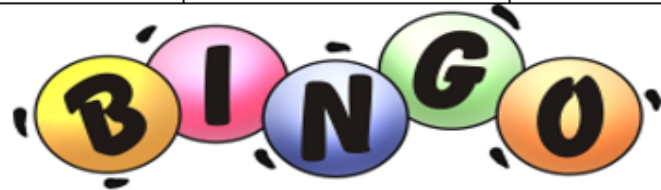
So can you use some of these words to write a couple of sentences about your week. Or you could use magnetic letters on the fridge or a computer to type it.

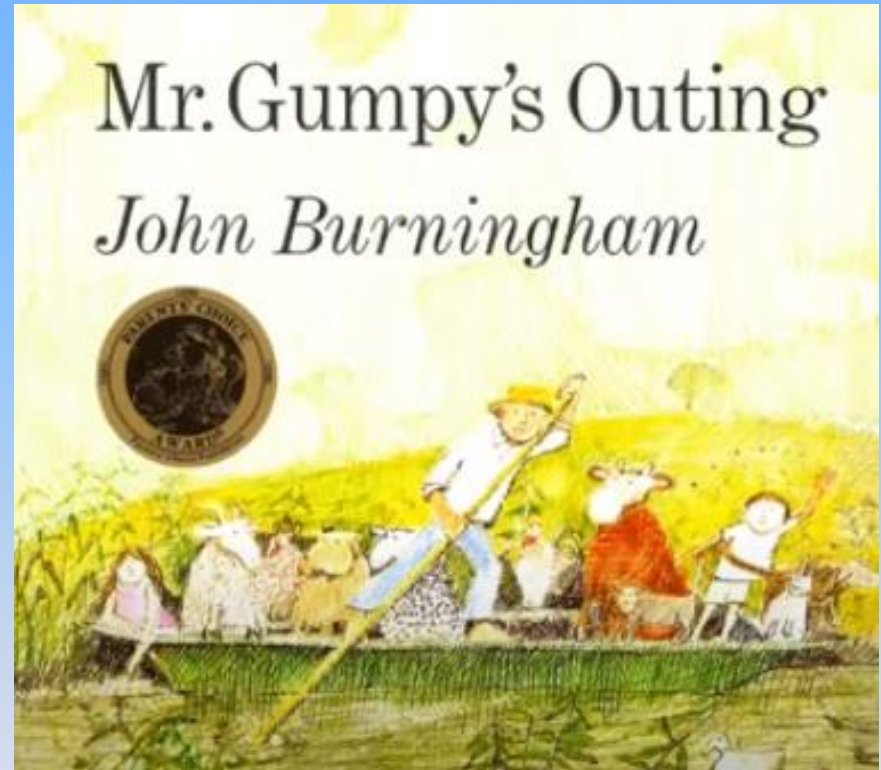
This week we are learning about adding more.

You could read this story together (Genesis - 6-9) in children's bible or watch <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2JZHxkl9BB4>

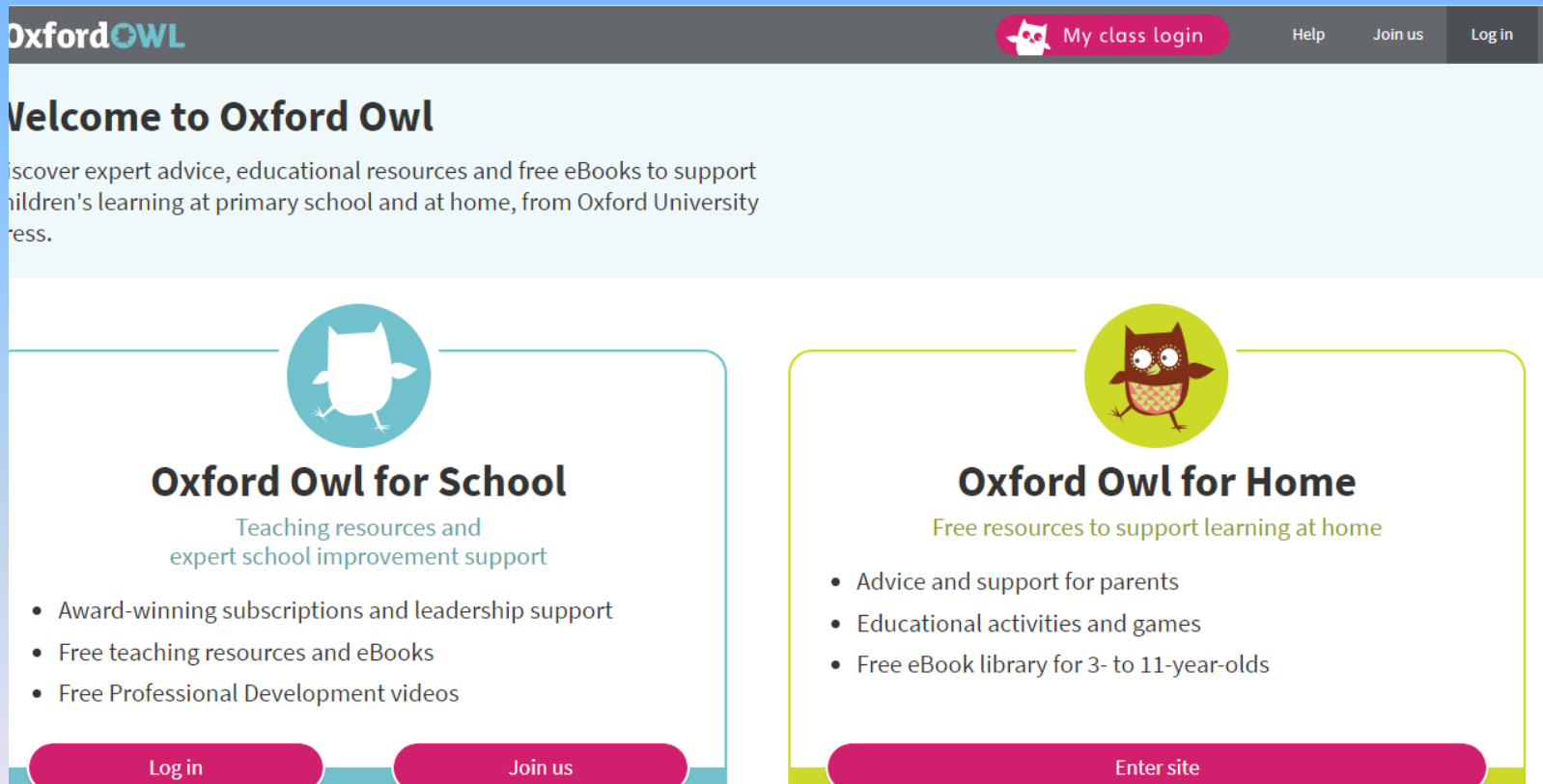
Perhaps talk about the meaning of promises together and any you've made recently.

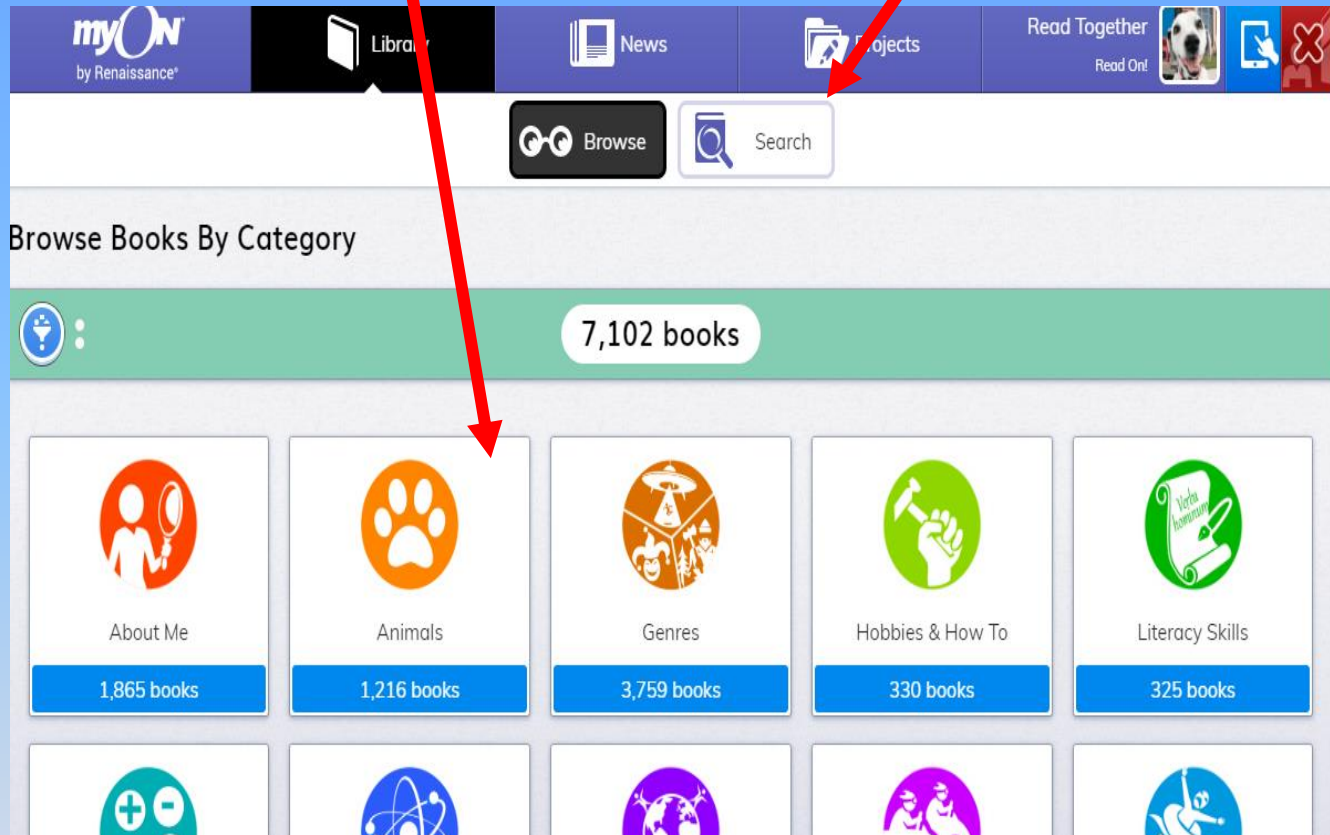

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

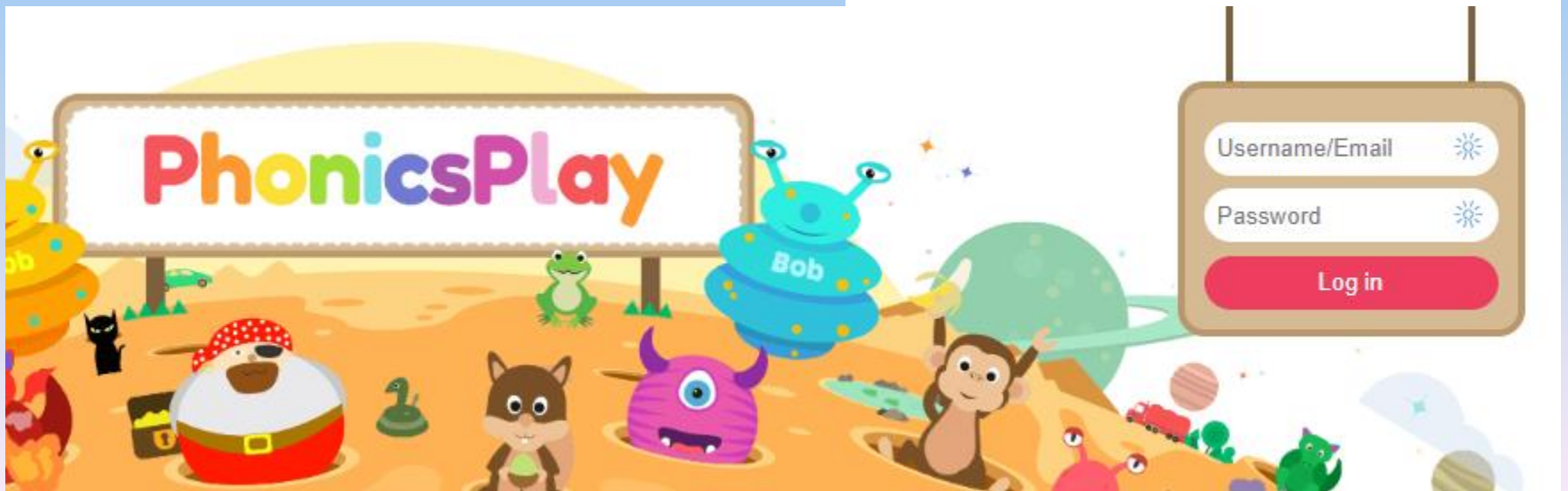
Phonics

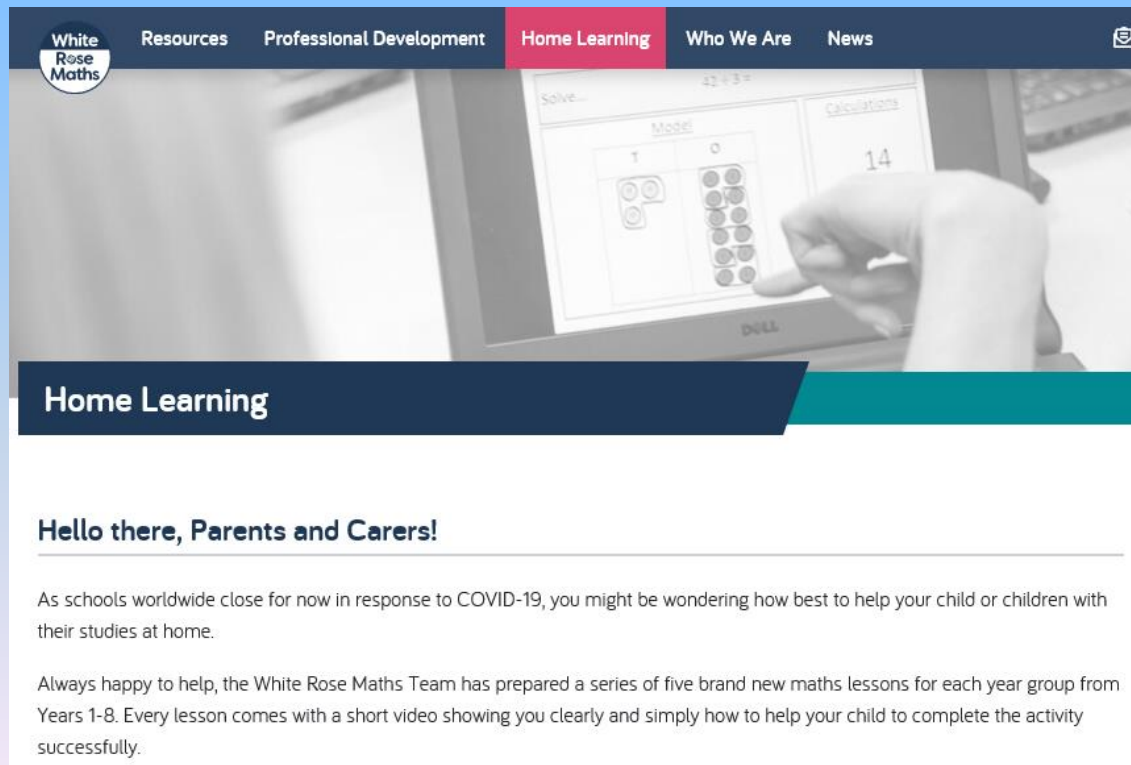


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

Accessing Twinkl

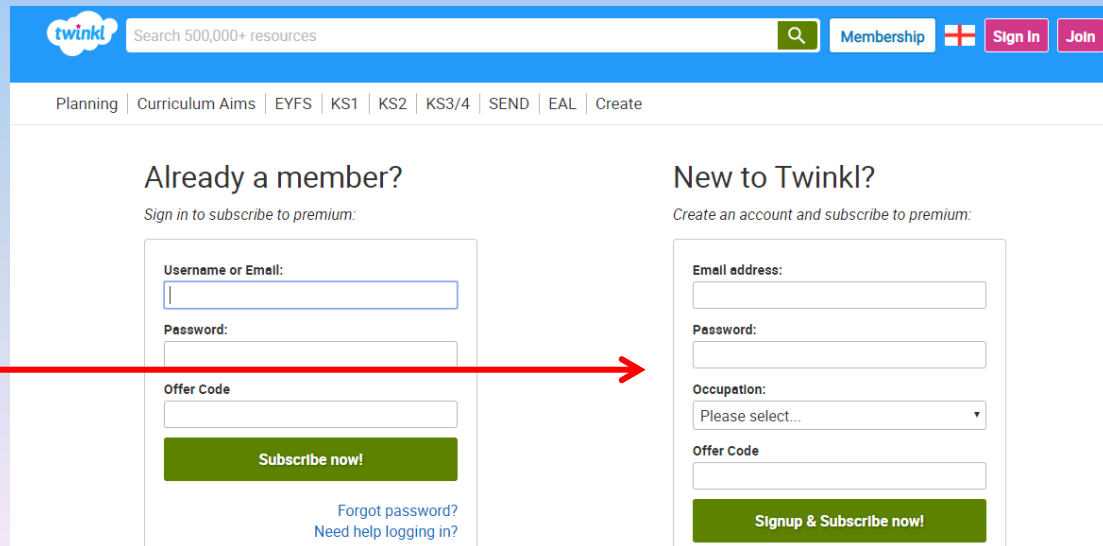
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

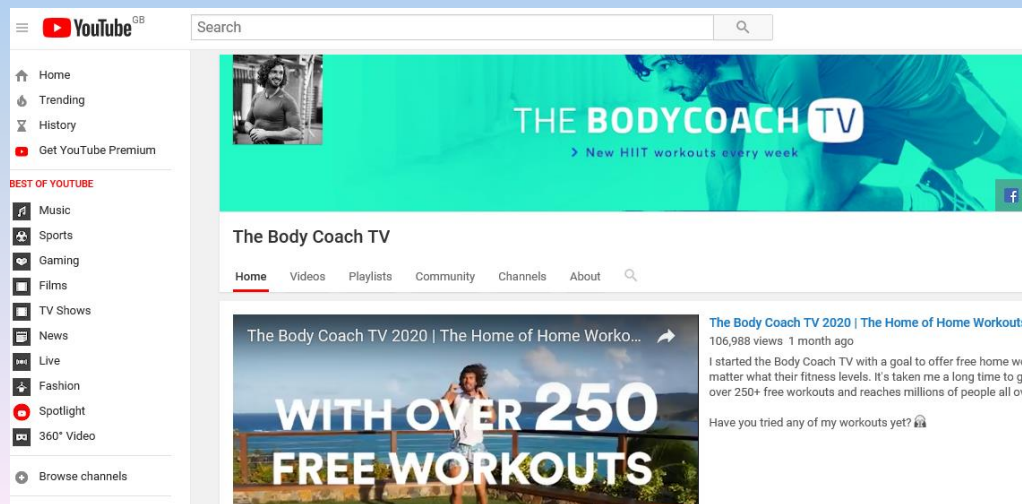
