Task 1

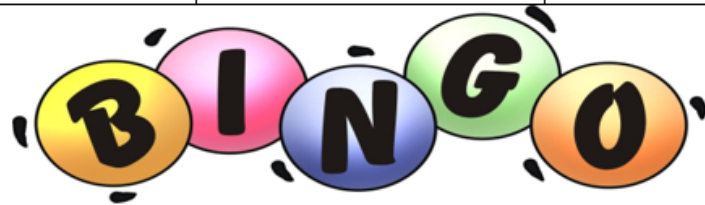
This week we are learning some new high frequency words.

Watch the Hungry Caterpillar video –

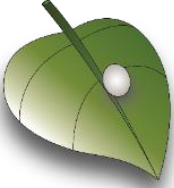
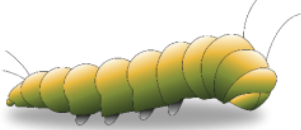
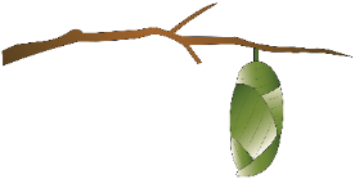

Maths Learning

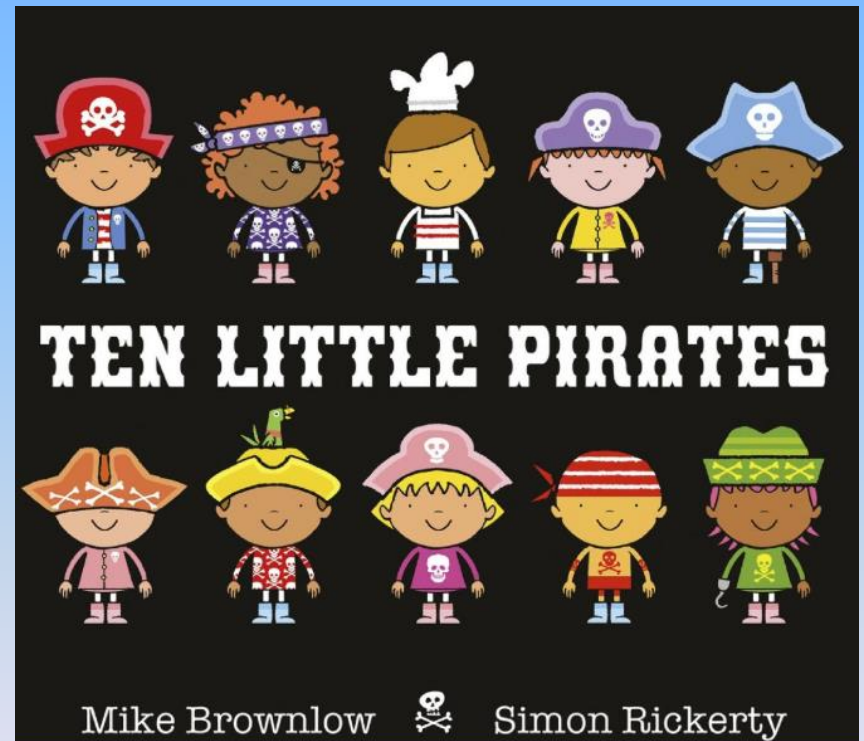
This week we are learning about taking one or more away.

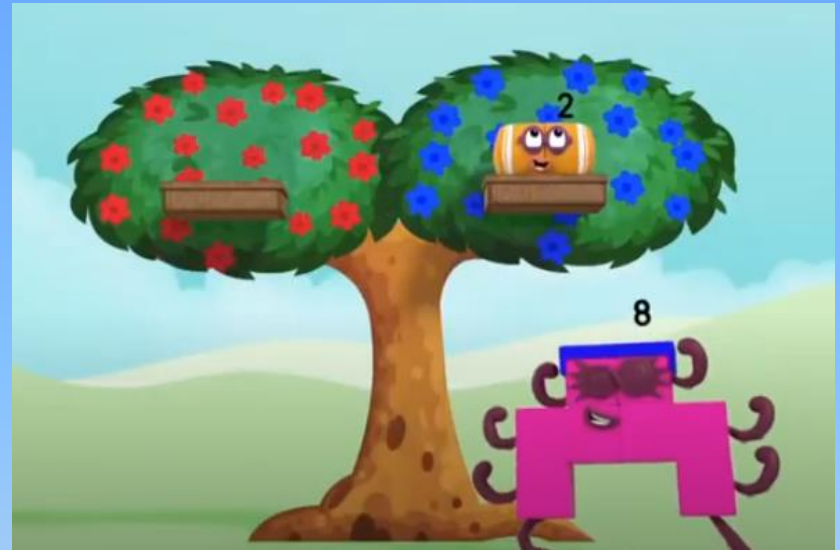
Task 3

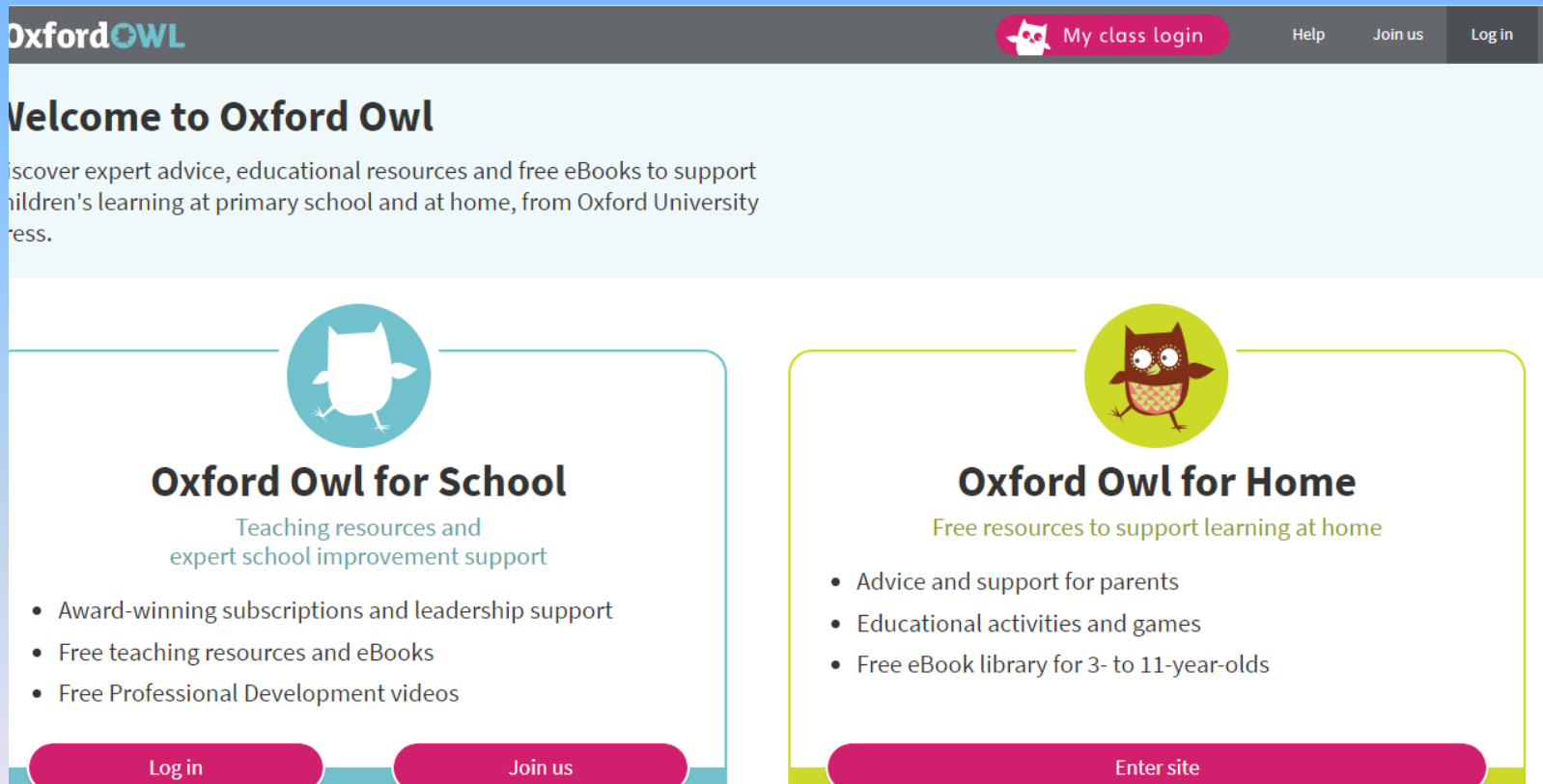


This week we've been learning about the hungry caterpillar. So some fun ideas that you might like to try:

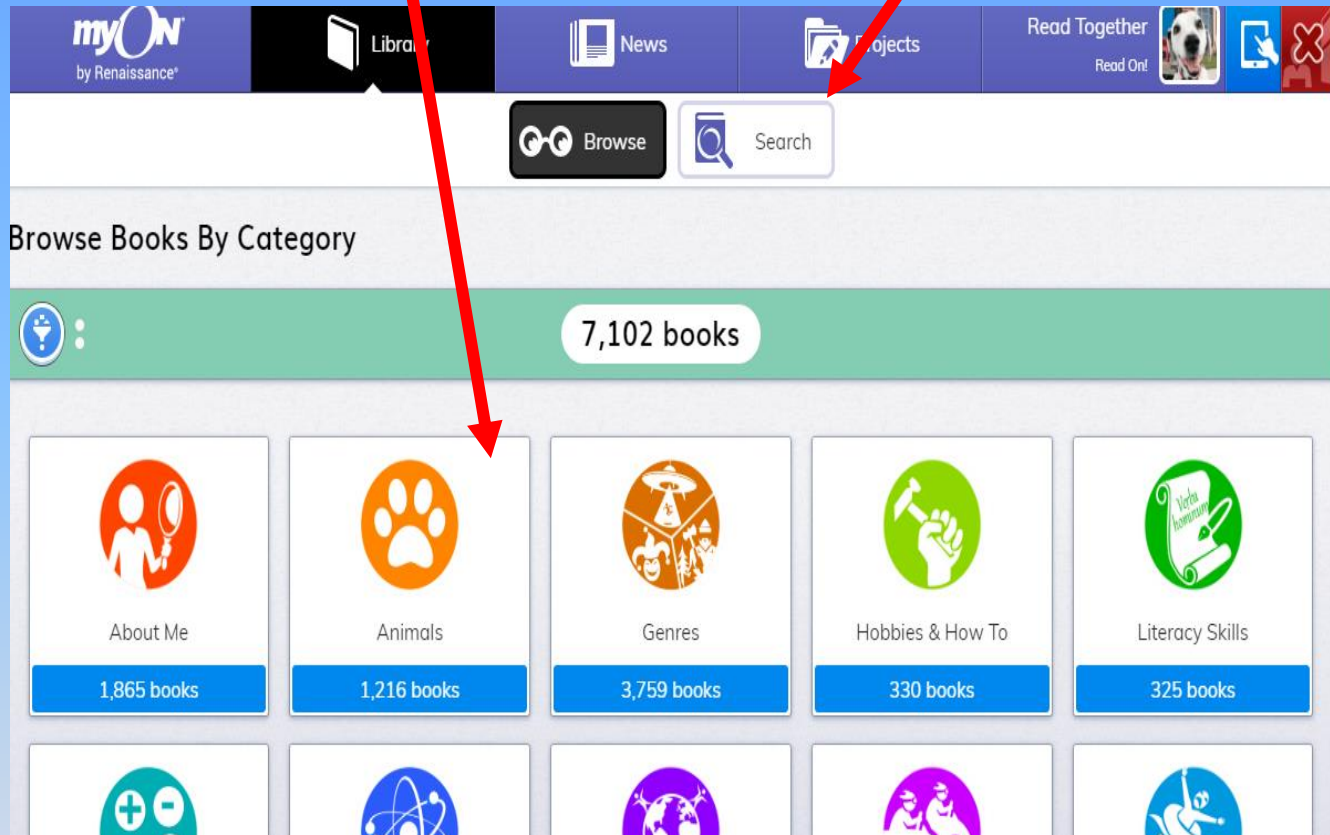

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

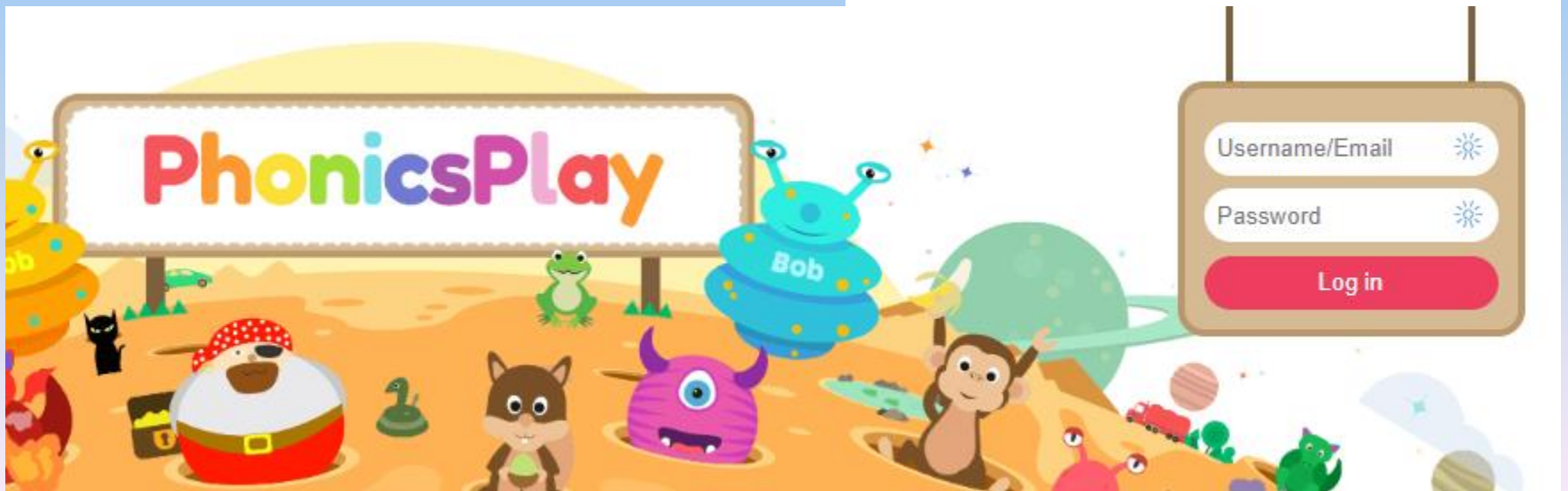
Phonics

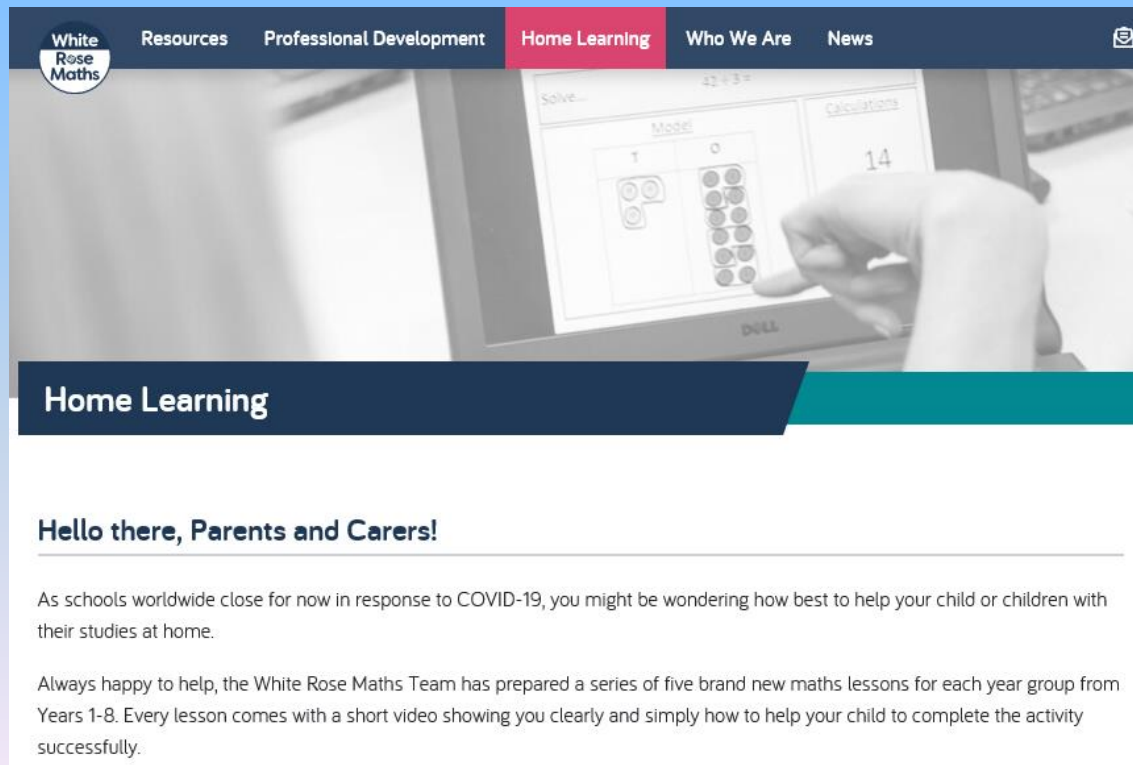


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

Accessing Twinkl

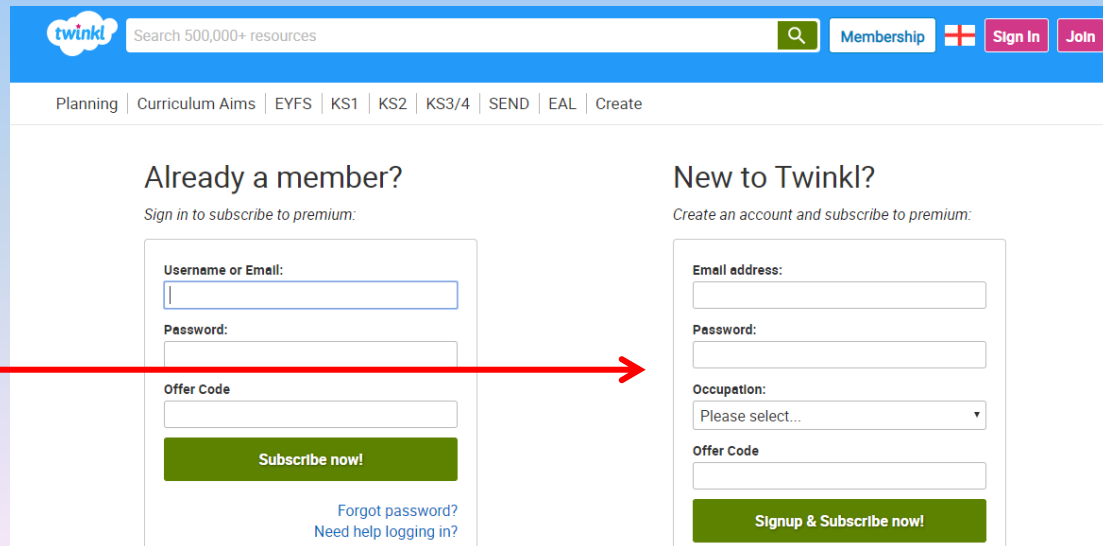
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

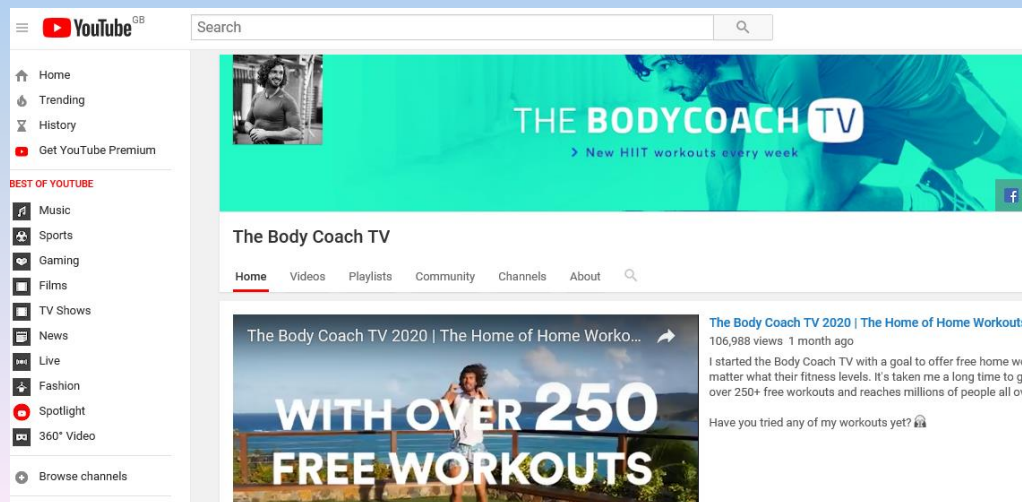
