- The farmer gets up at six in the morning.

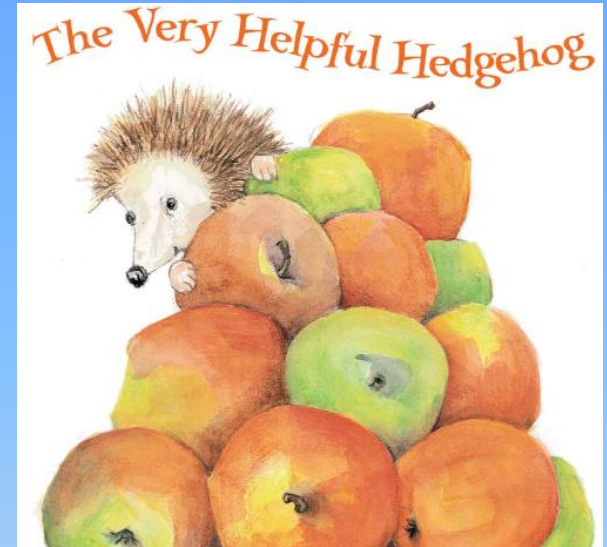
English Learning

Can you think of any times you have been helpful at home?

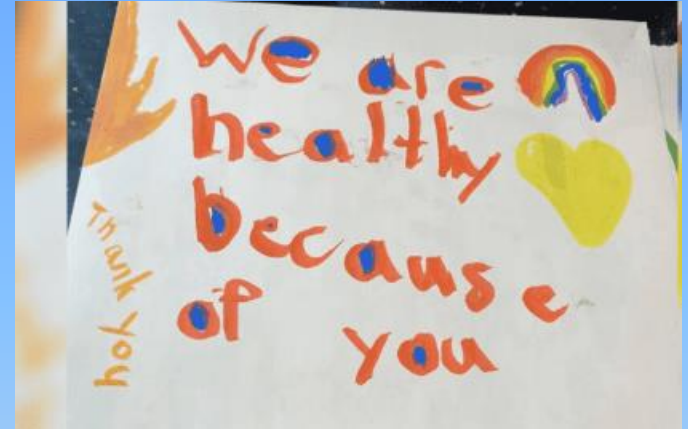
Can you draw me a picture of a time and tell me about it by labelling or writing me a sentence?

Topic

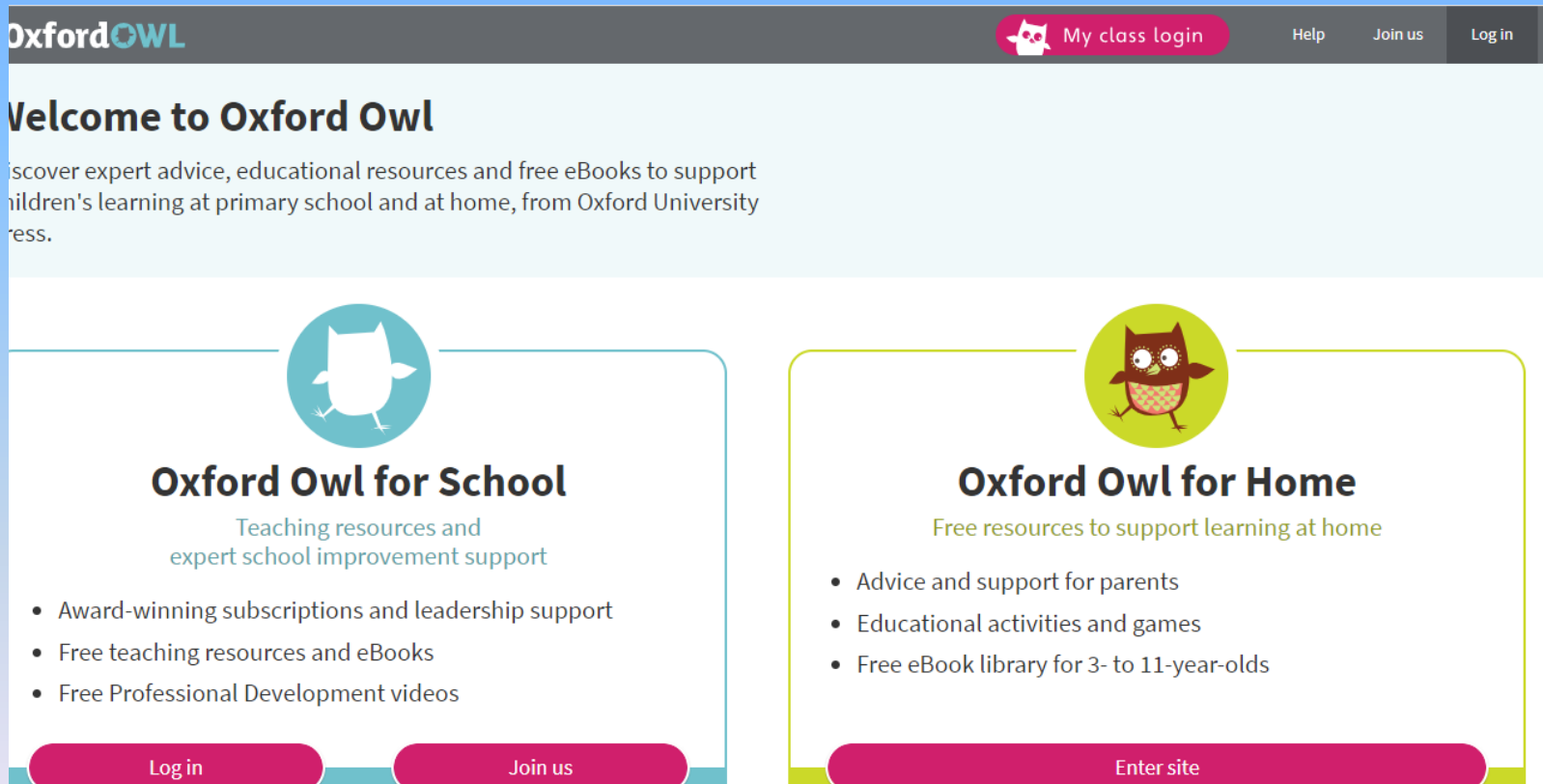
This week we have read about helping each other and people that help us. So have a go at our fun ideas:

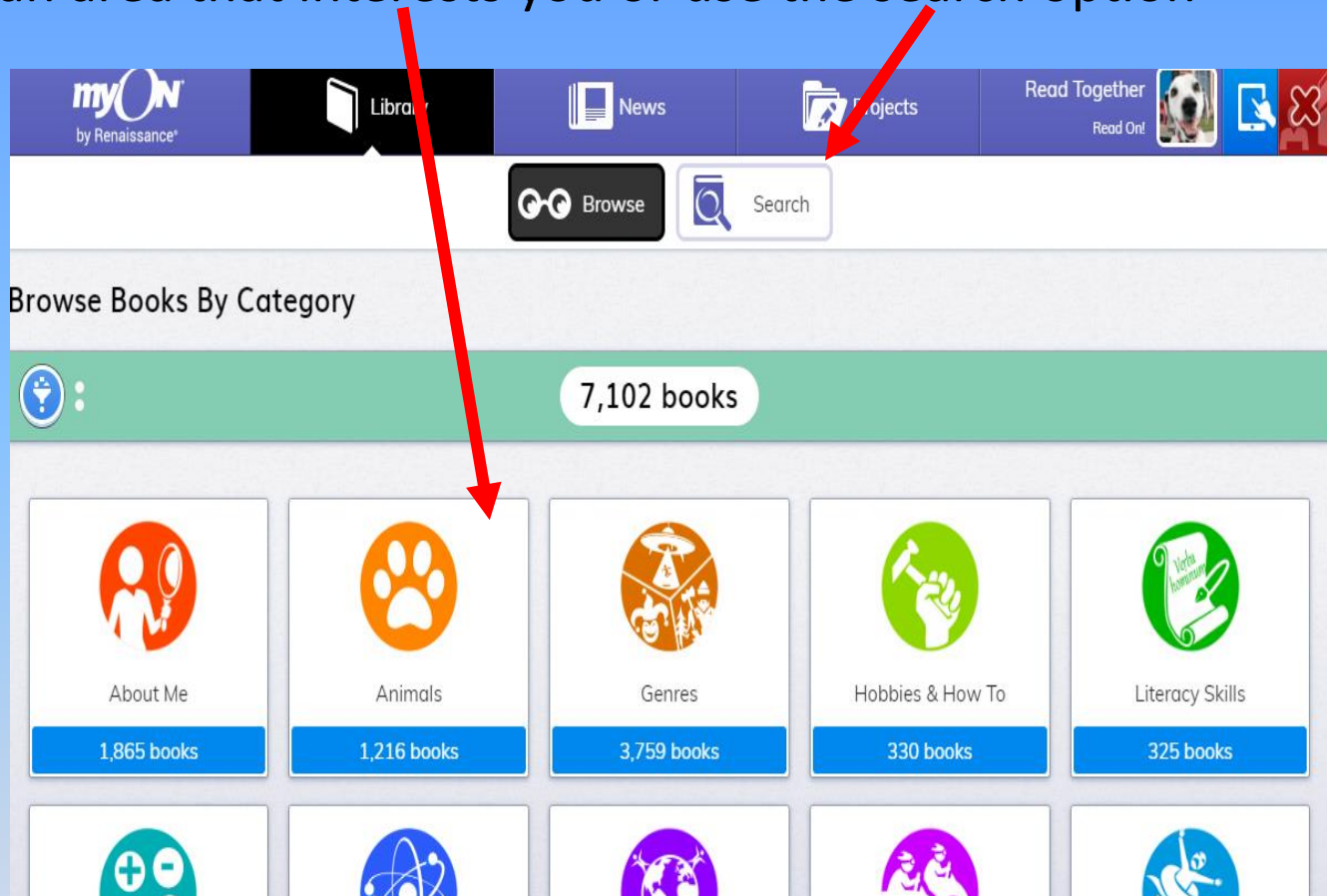

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

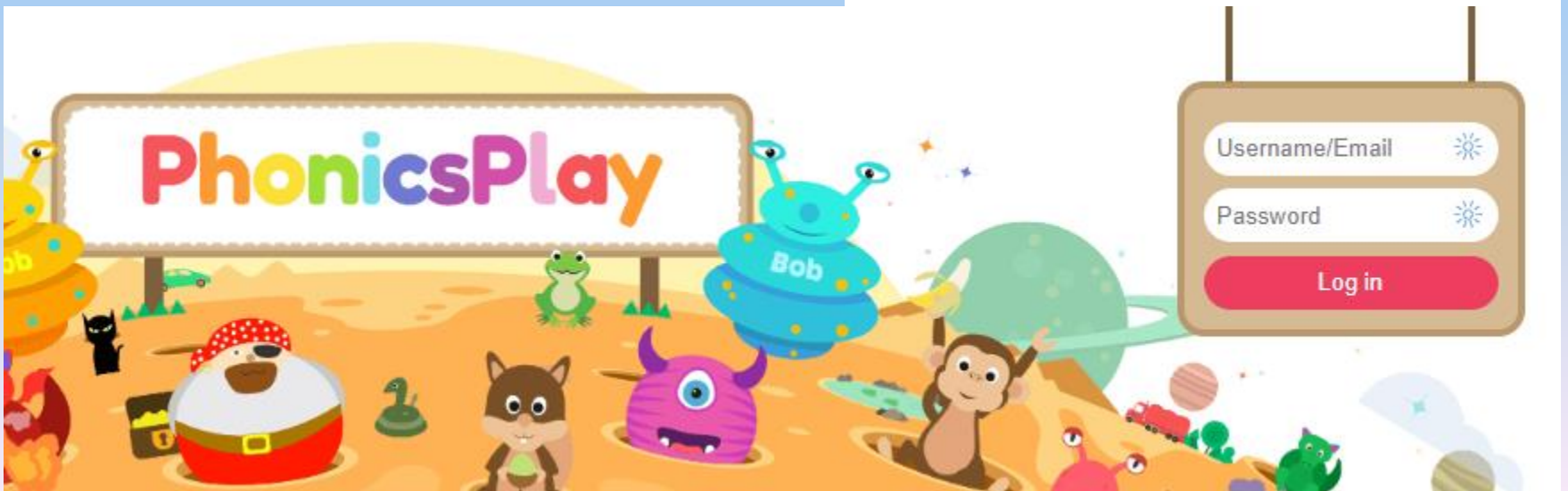
Phonics

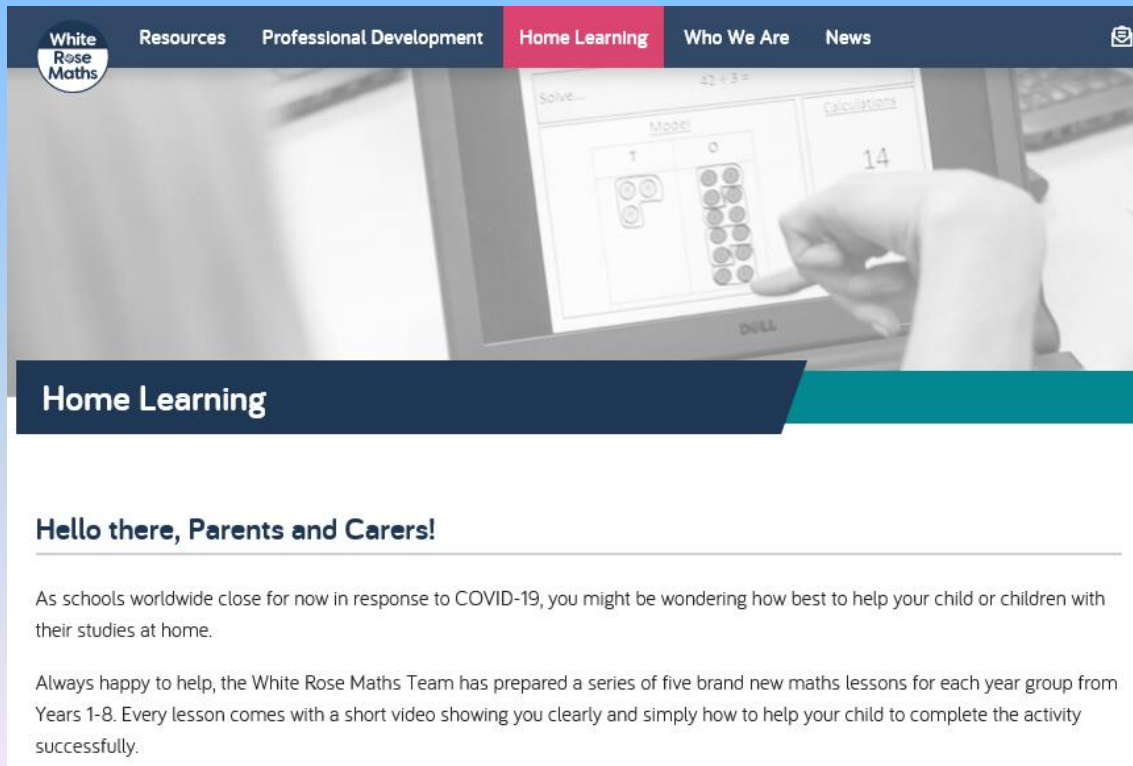


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

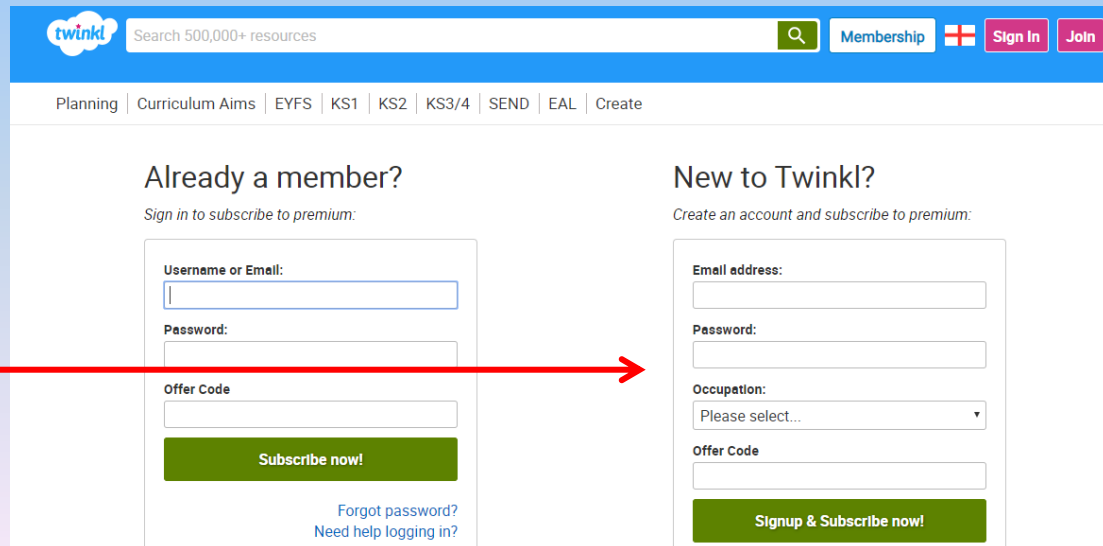
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

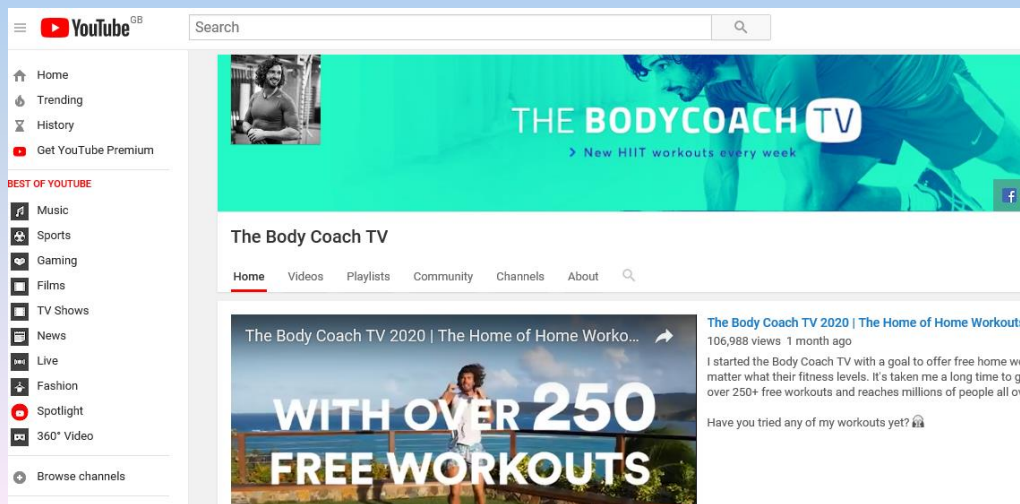
