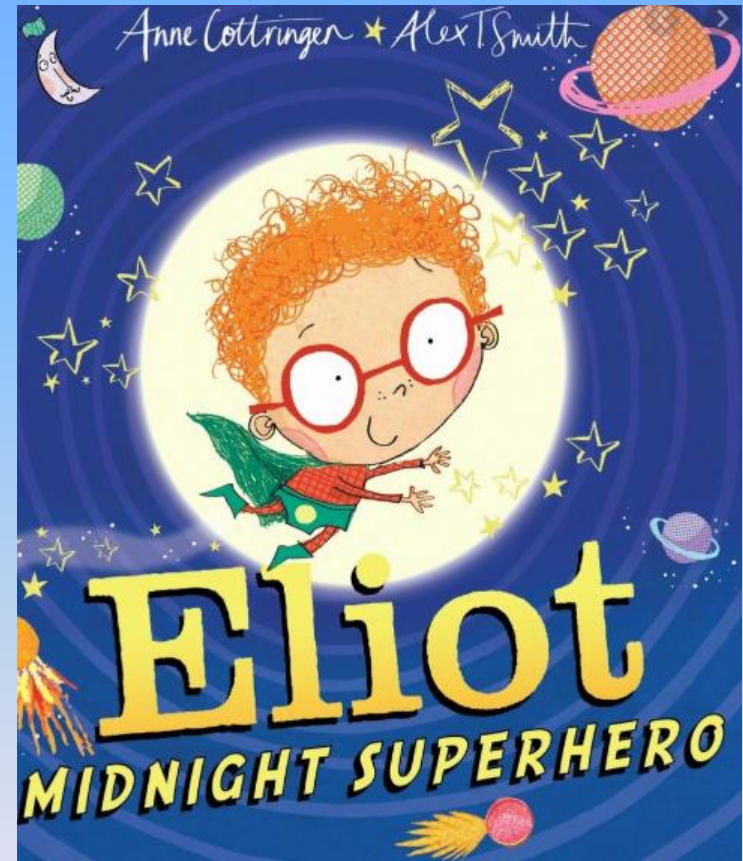
Task 2

This week we are learning to double.

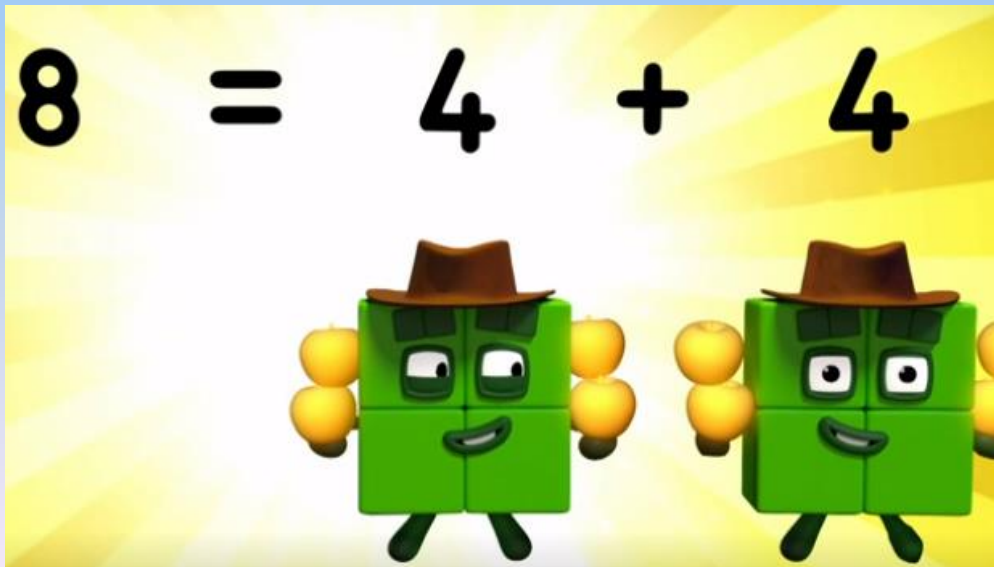
Task 1

Use your toys to have a go at doubling.



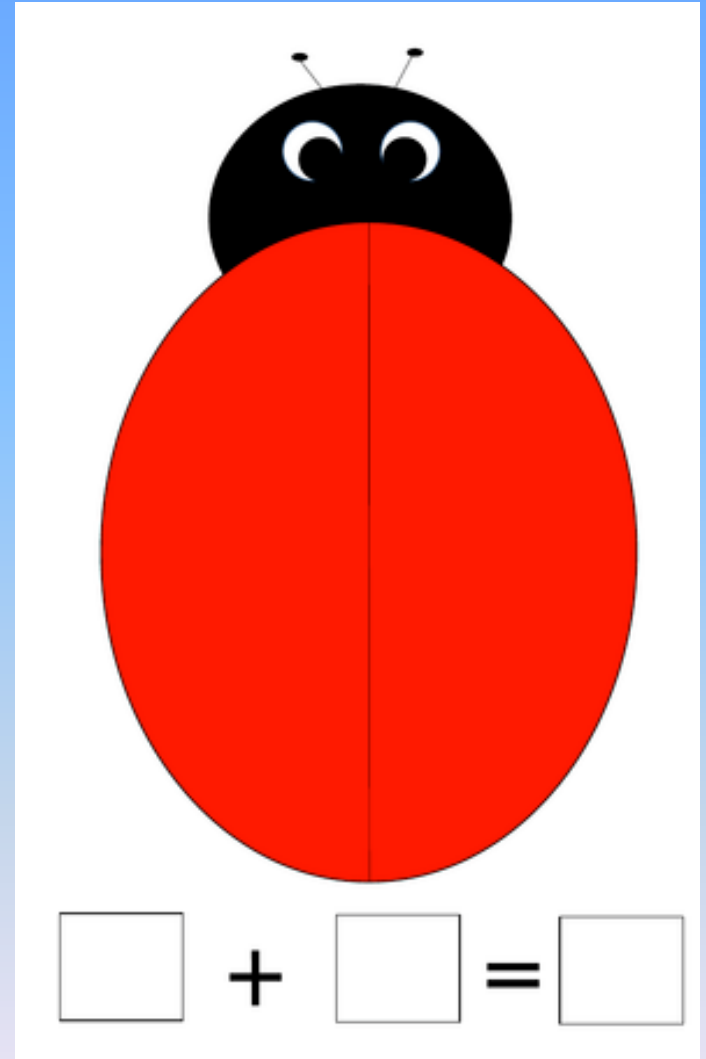
Maths Learning

Topic

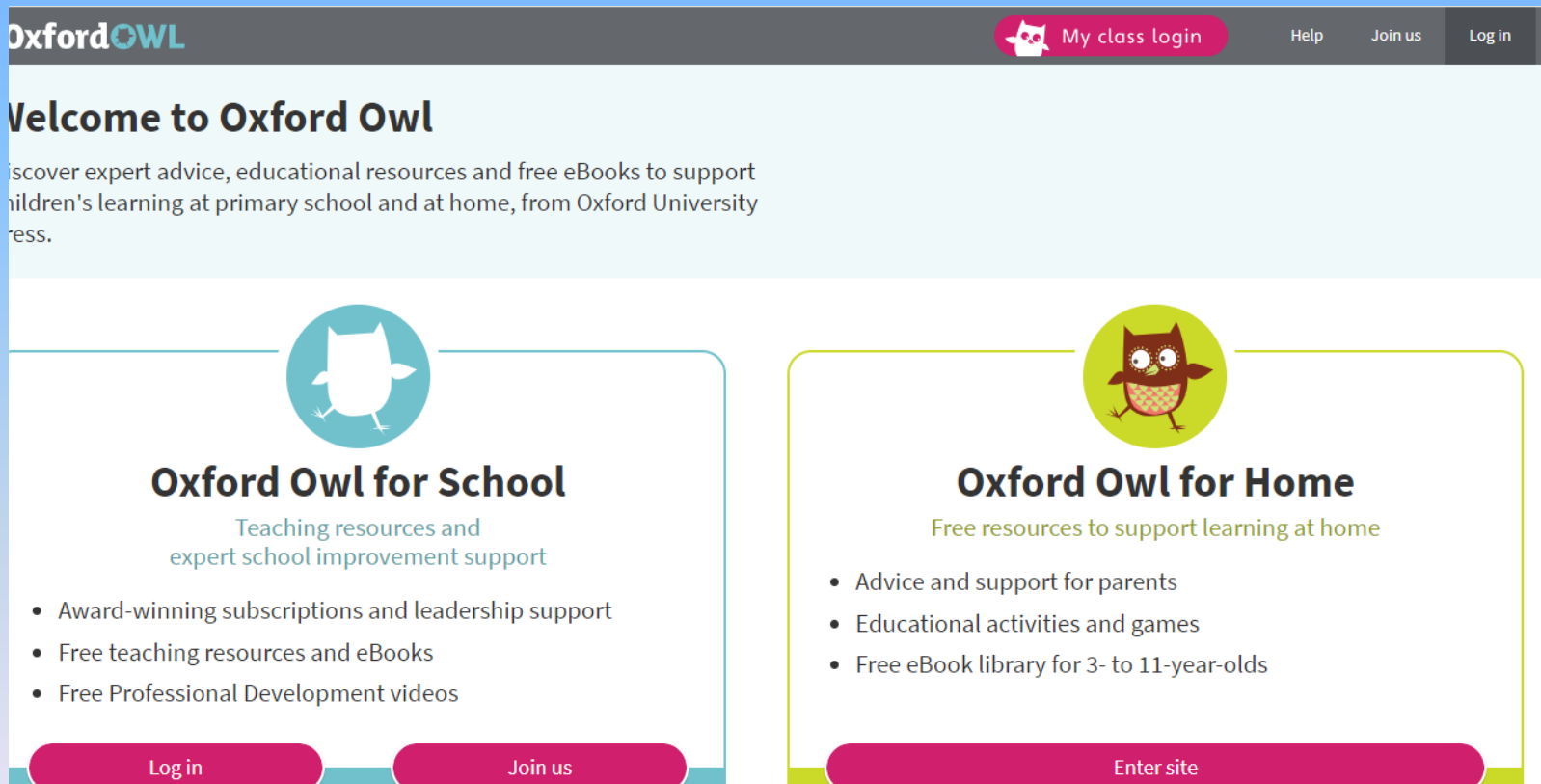
This week we have been thinking about superheroes and the problems they solve and the powers they have. As part of this you might like to have ago at one of these ideas.

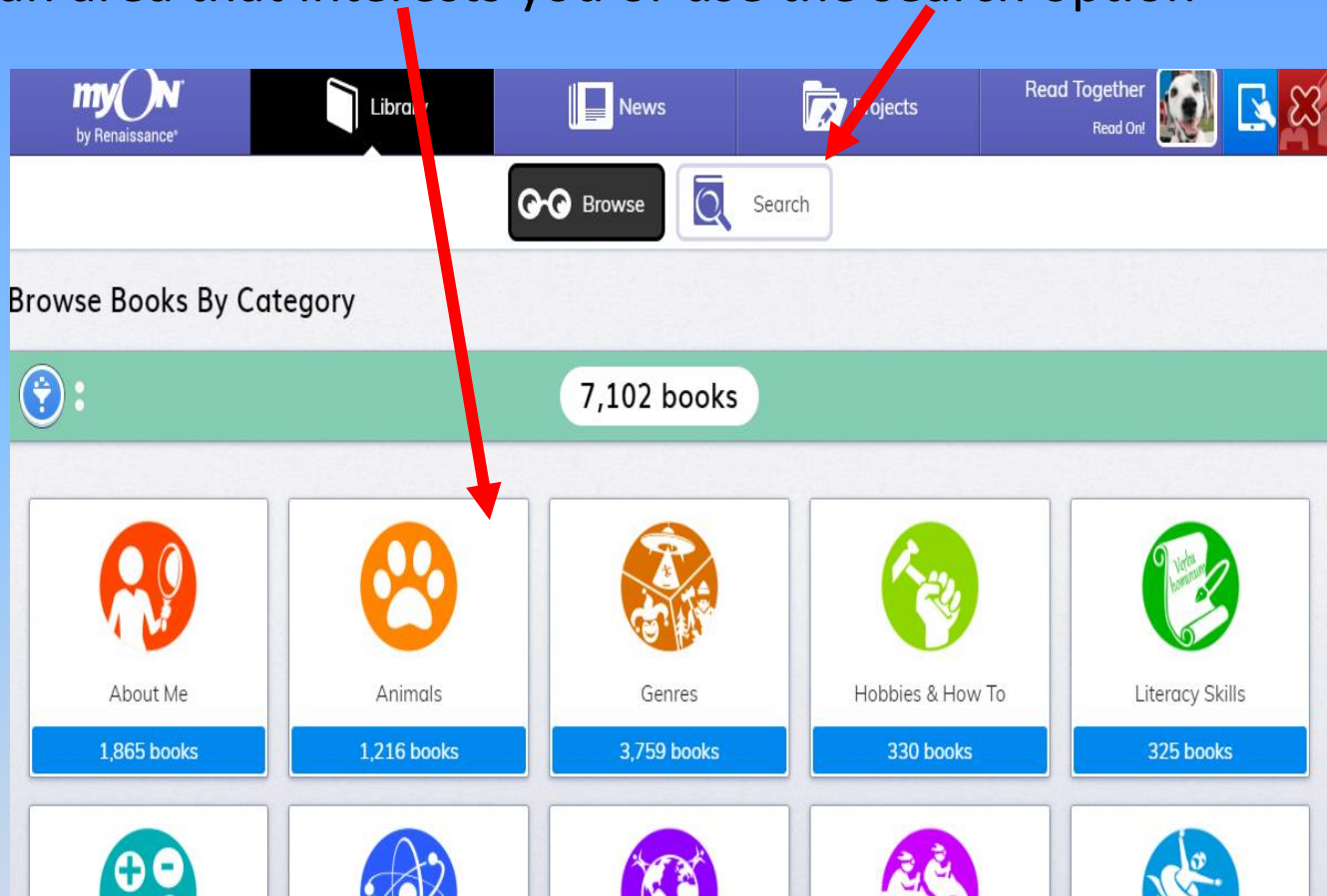

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

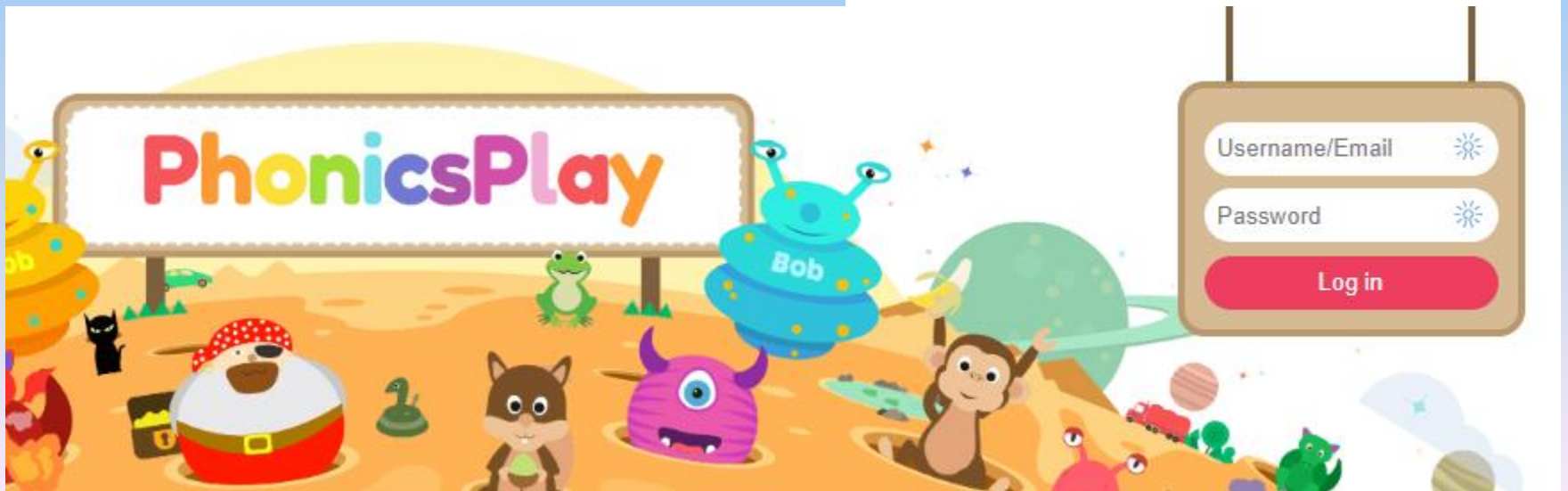
Phonics

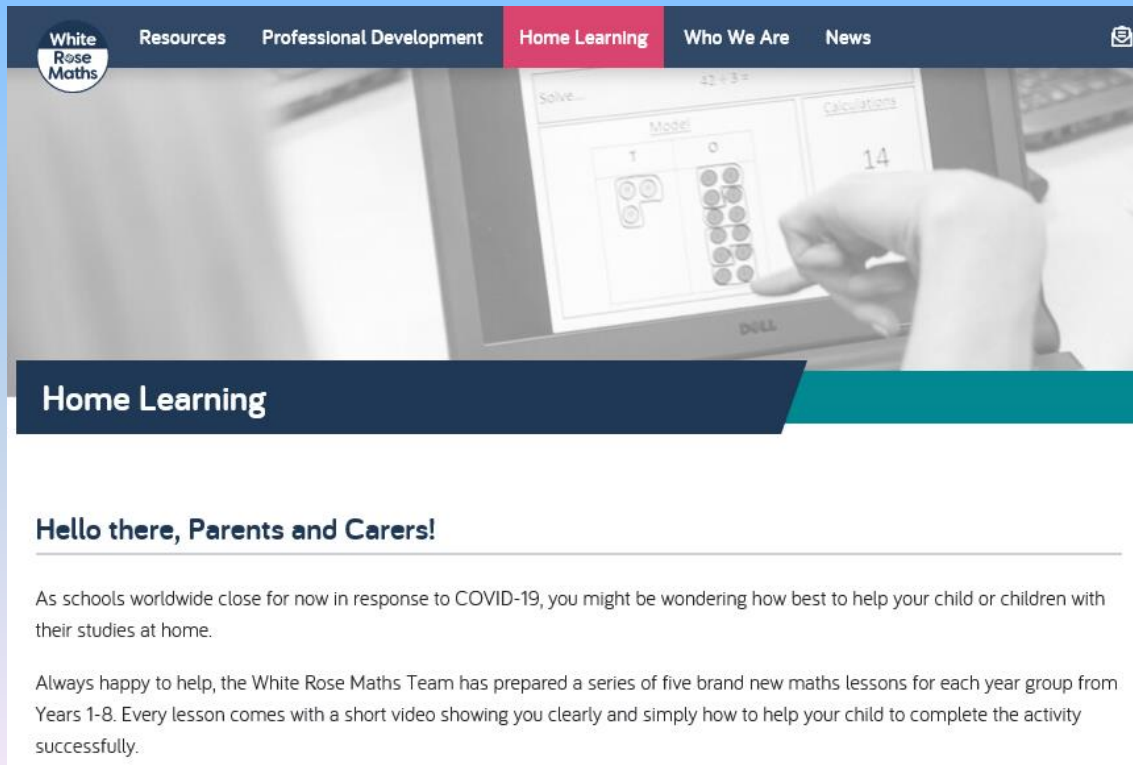


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

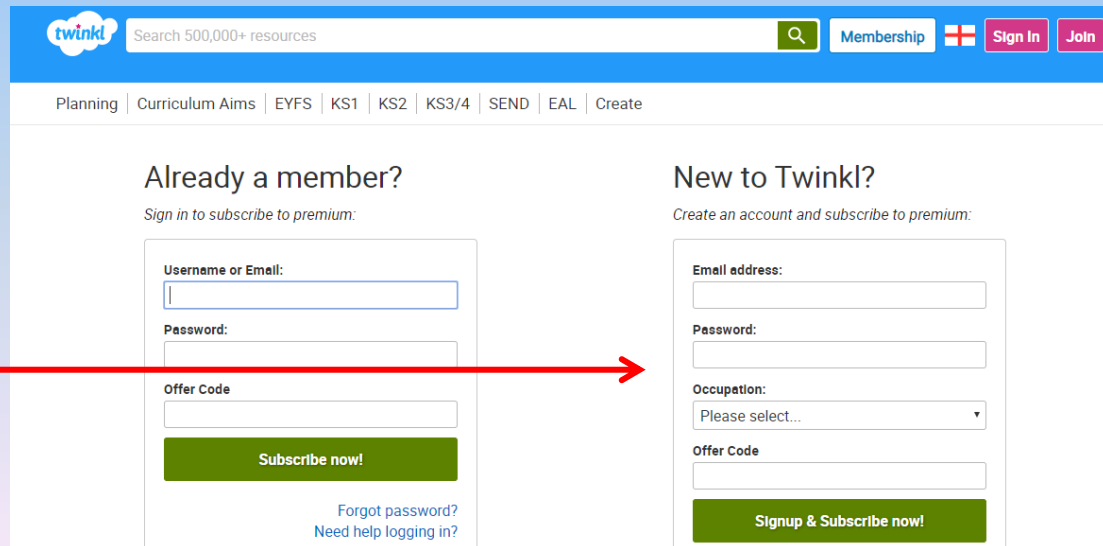
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

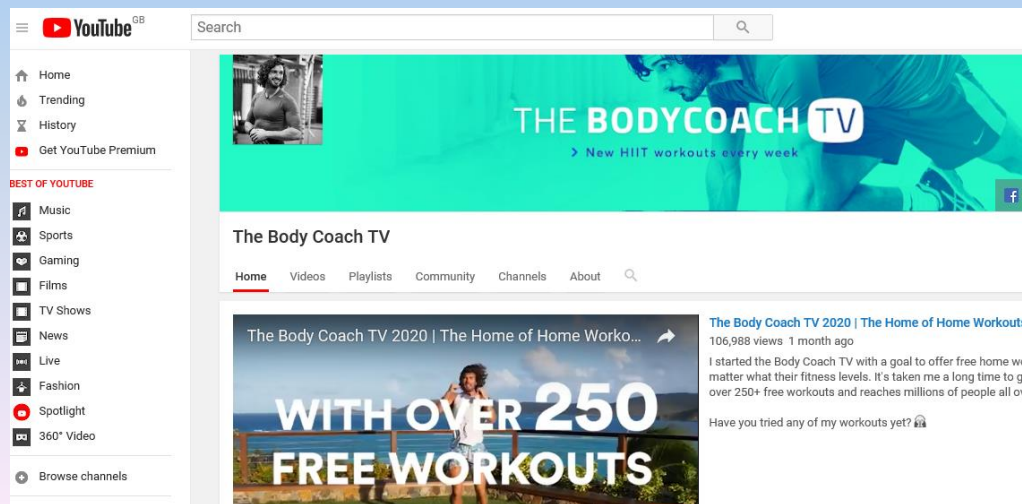
