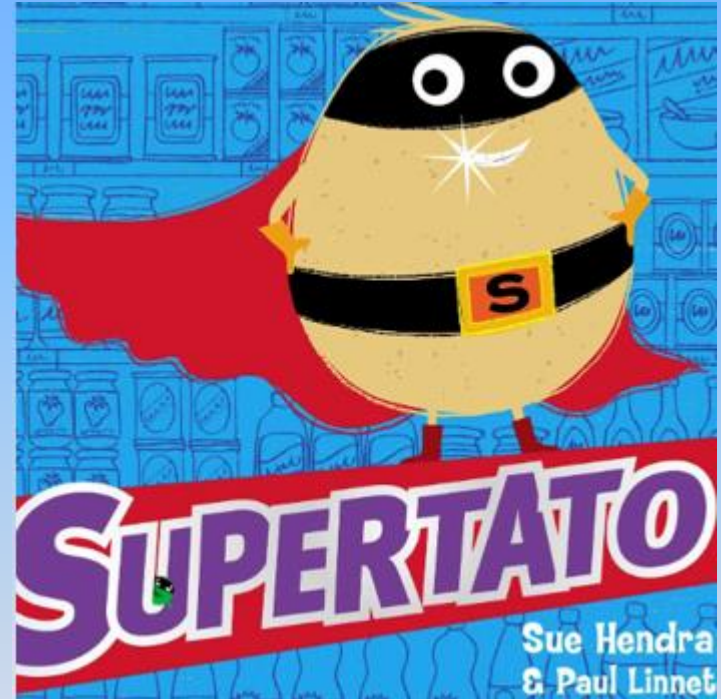

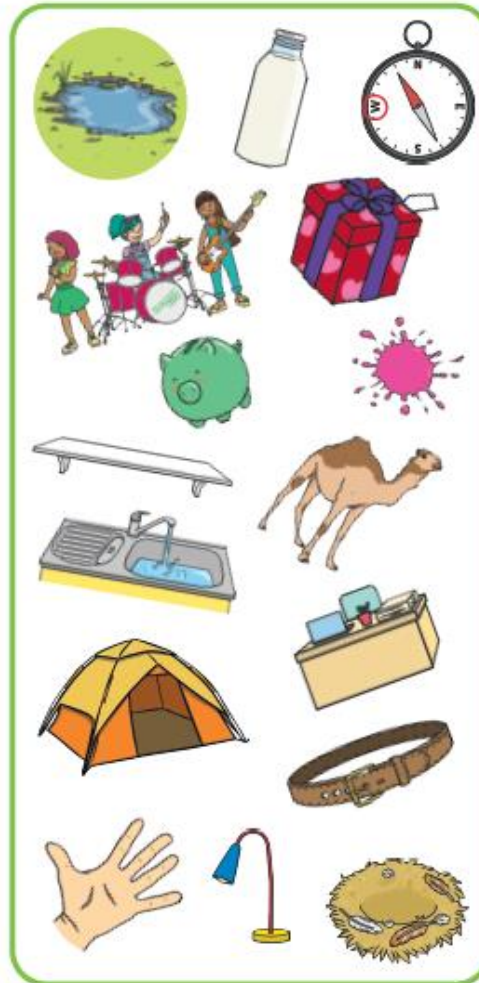

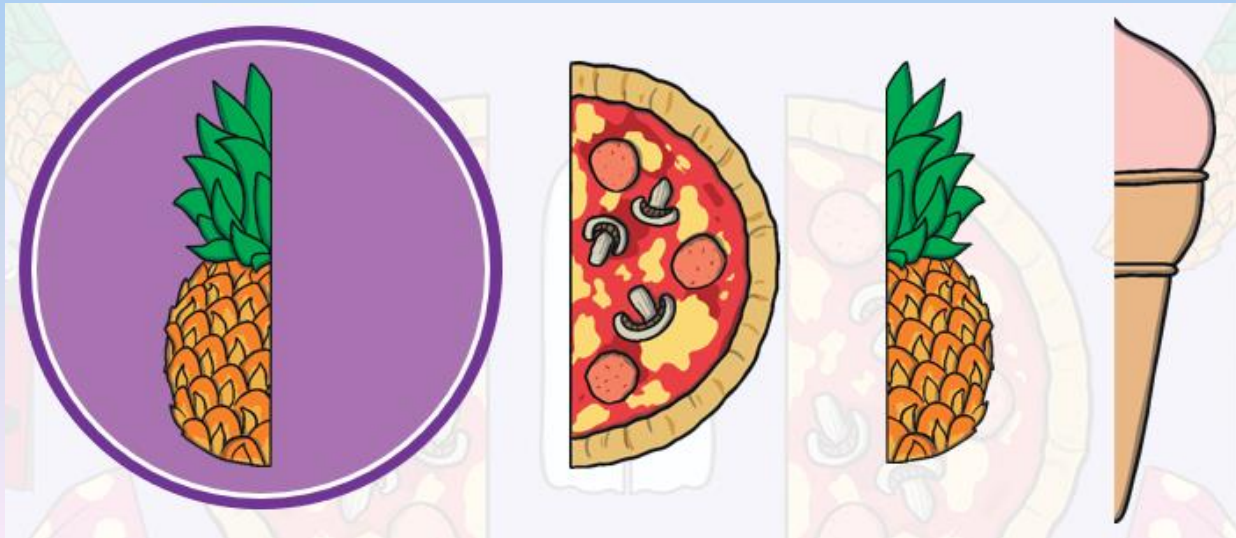
This week we are learning how to halve and share.

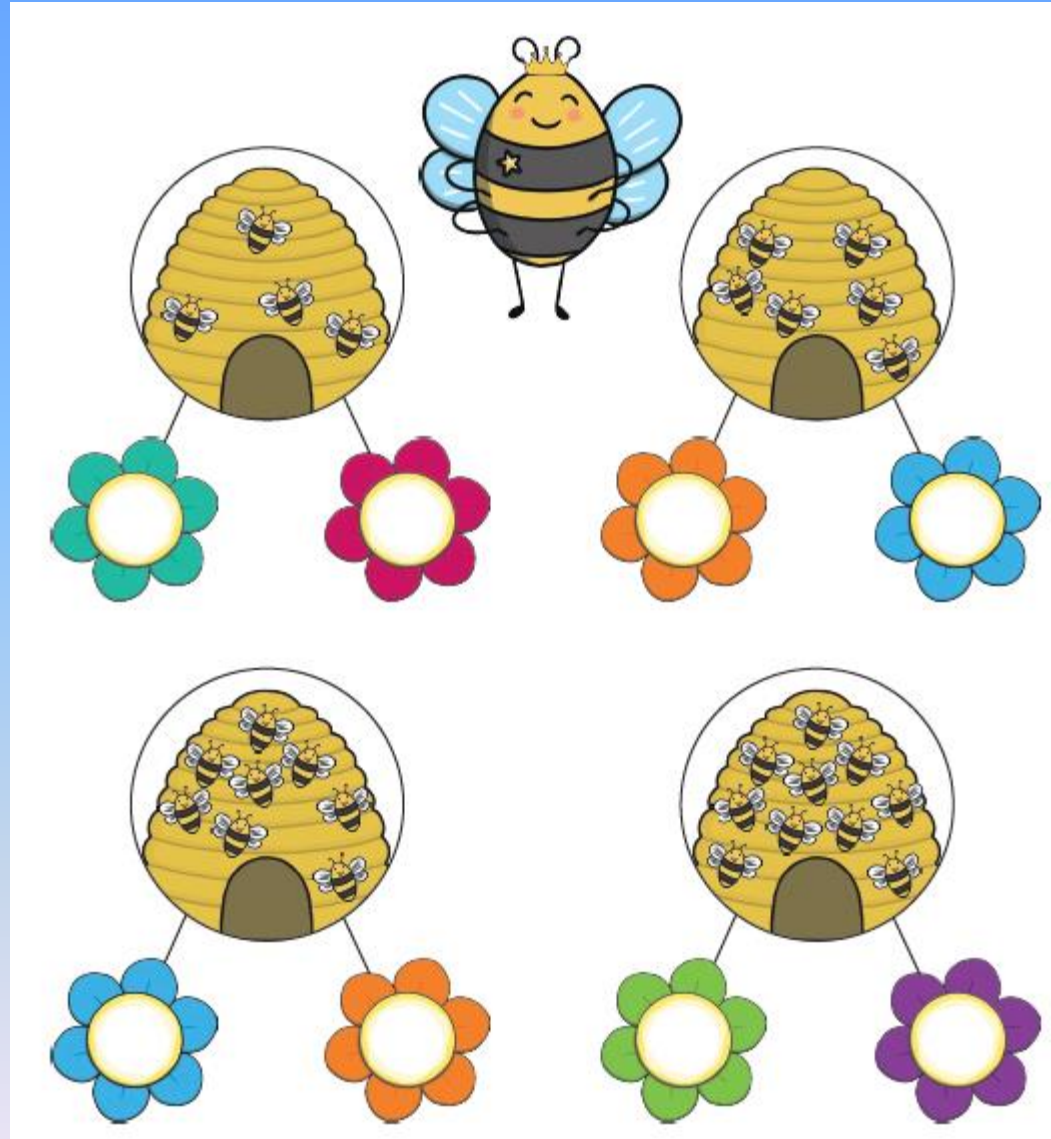

Remember that halving is sharing something equally. Look at what you can do when sharing an unequal number and there is 1 left over e.g. 3 biscuits. What could you do?

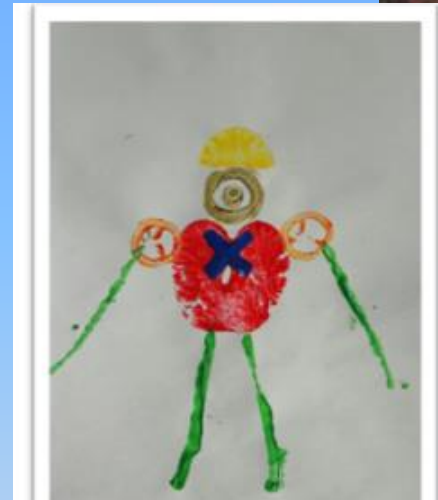


Topic

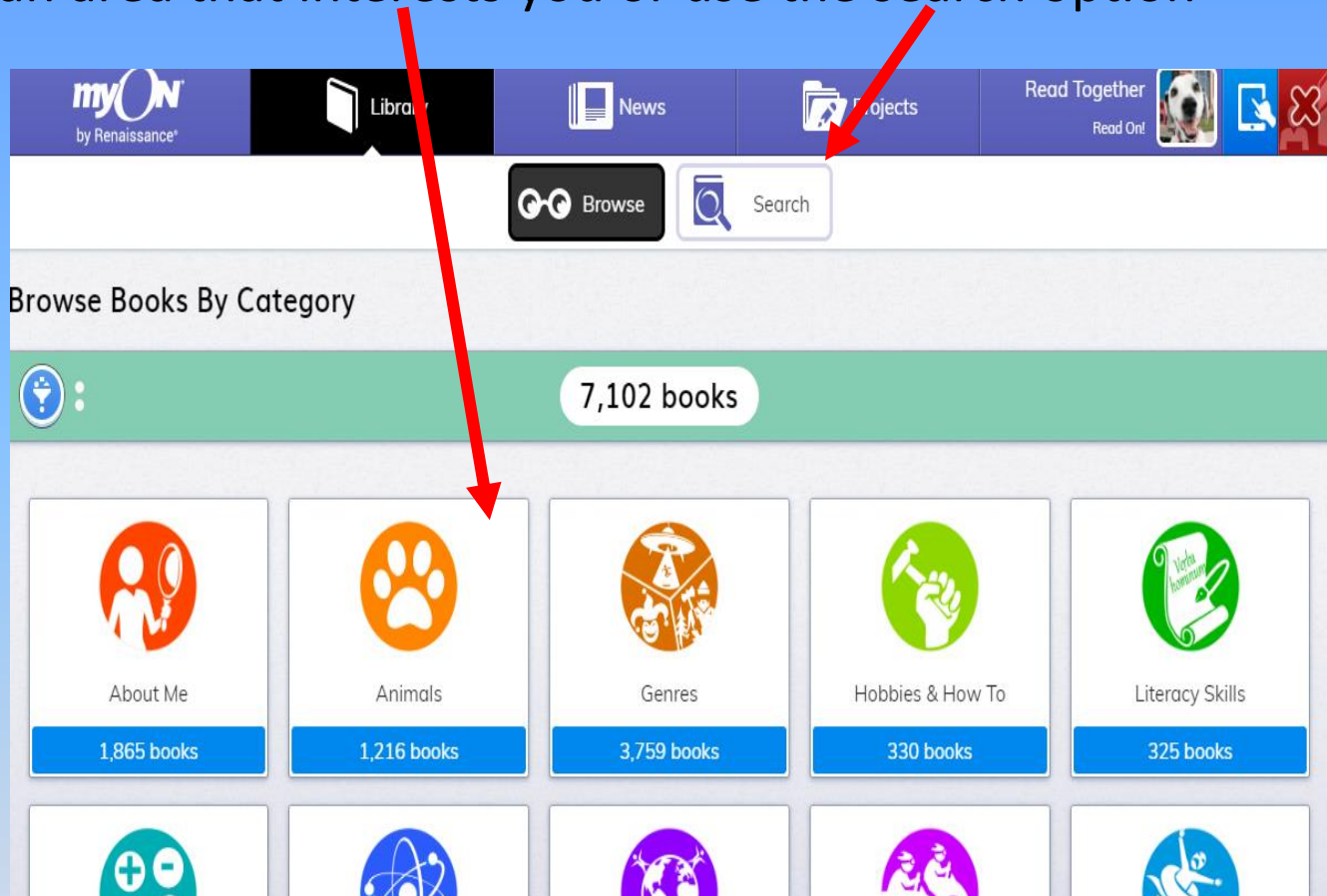

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

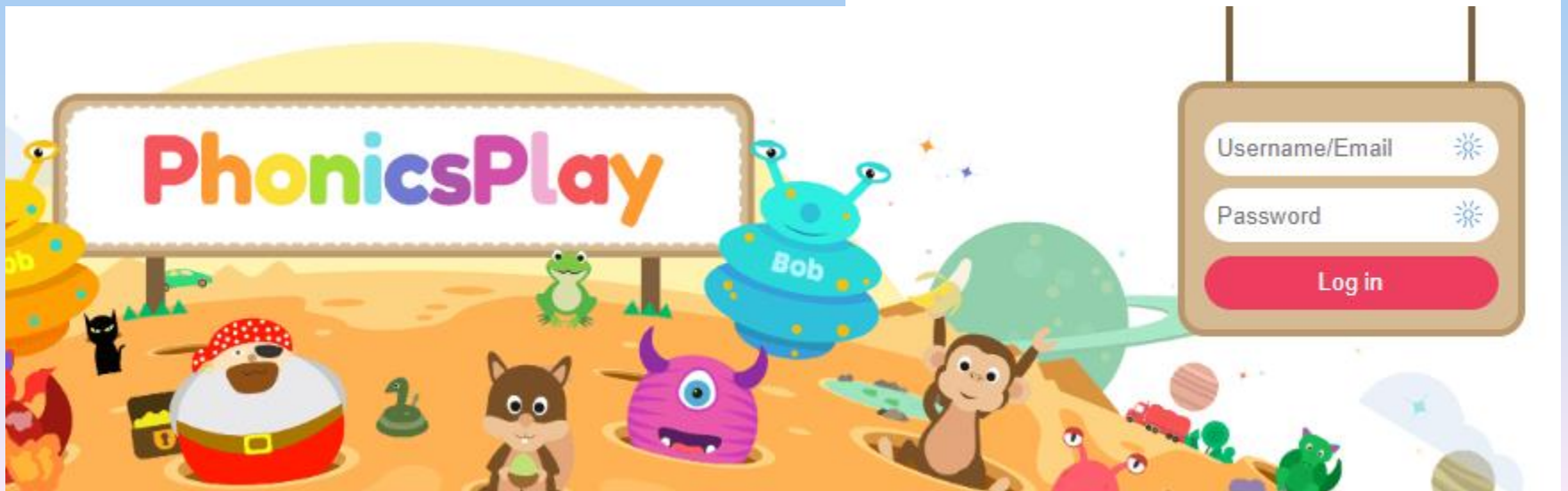
Phonics

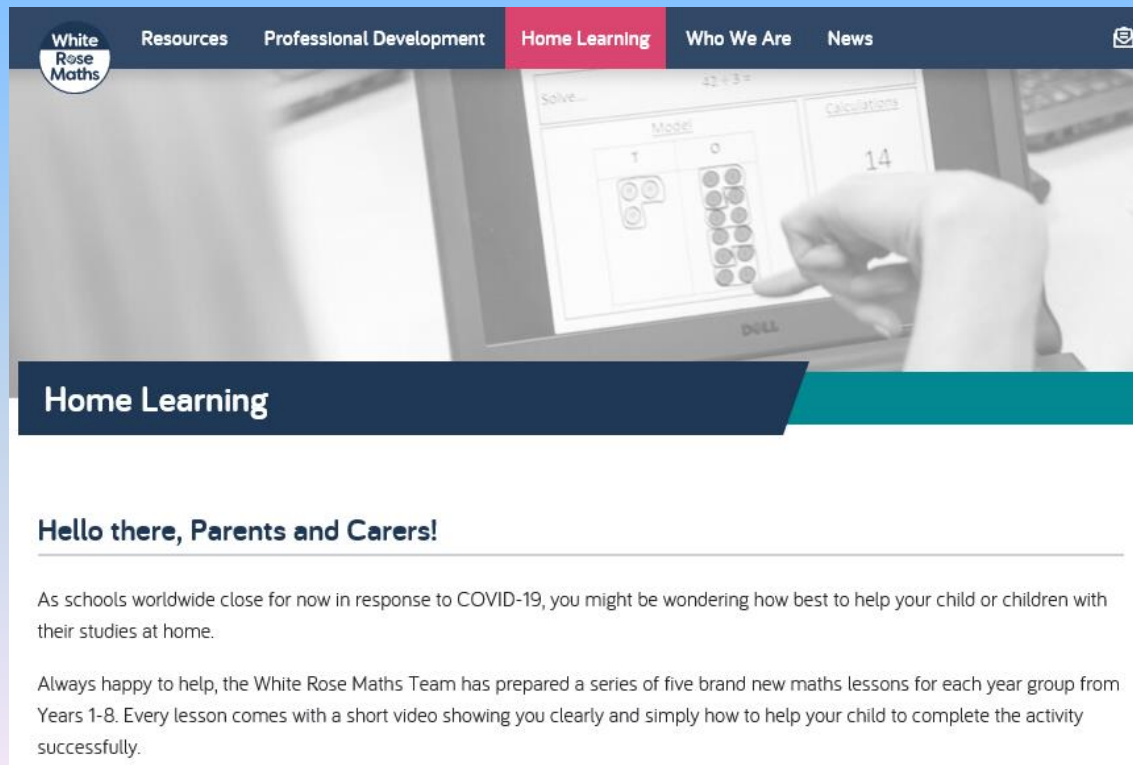


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

Accessing Twinkl

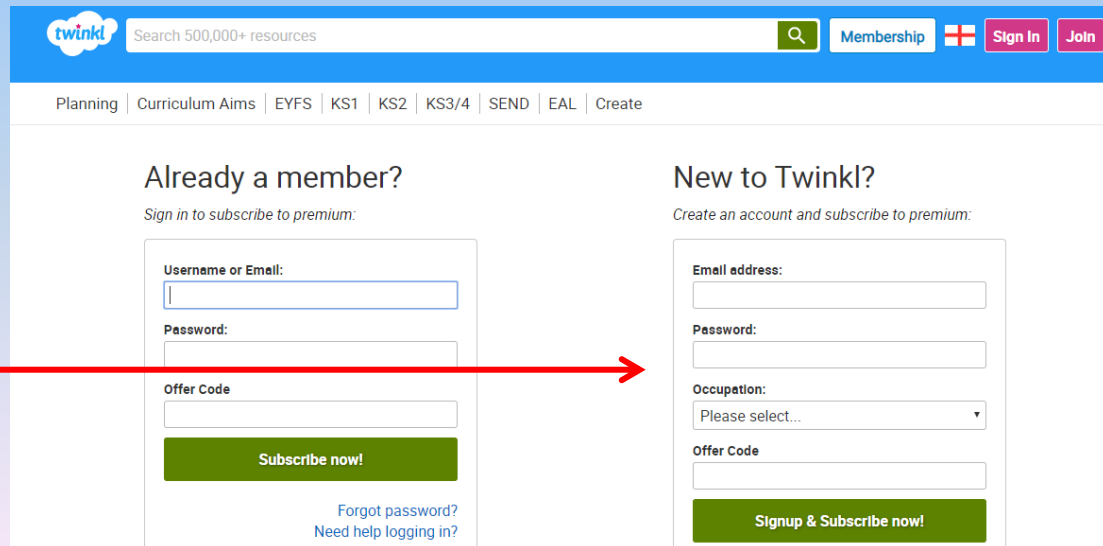
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

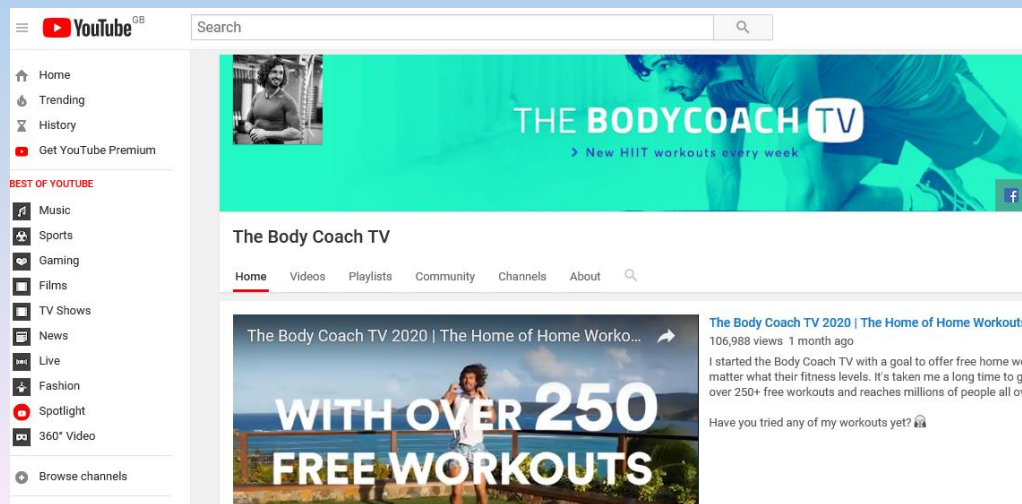
