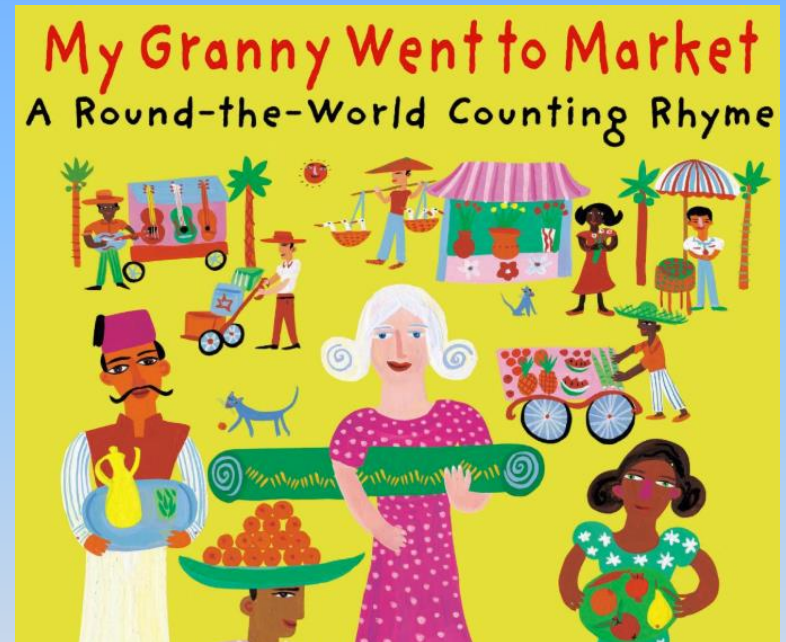

Task 2

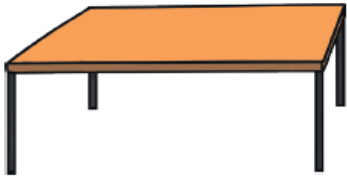

A little tip if you get stuck is that odd numbers will always have one left out when halved in two and that even numbers can be shared fairly.

Can you sort numbers to twenty into odd and evens? Useful to have objects to hand for working out and checking. Reinforce that objects which can be shared into 2 equal groups with no items left over are even and those which have one left over when shared into two equal groups are odd.

Using a number line count only the odd numbers then just the even numbers until confident.



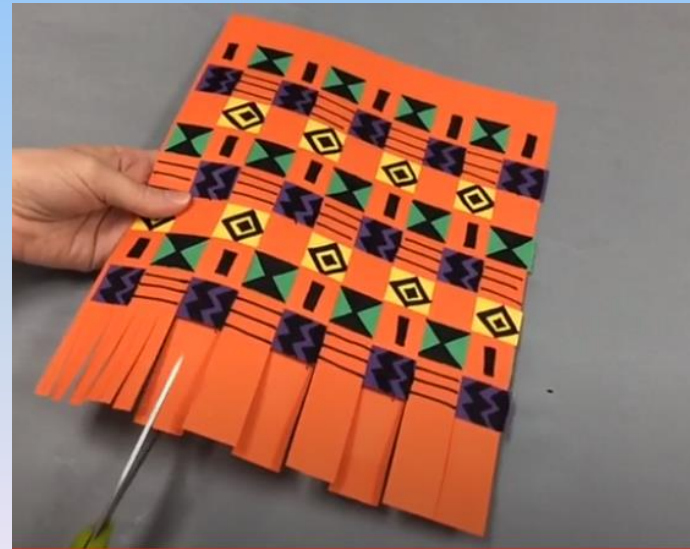
Topic

This week we have been thinking about a magic carpet journey ride. Here are some ideas you might like to explore.



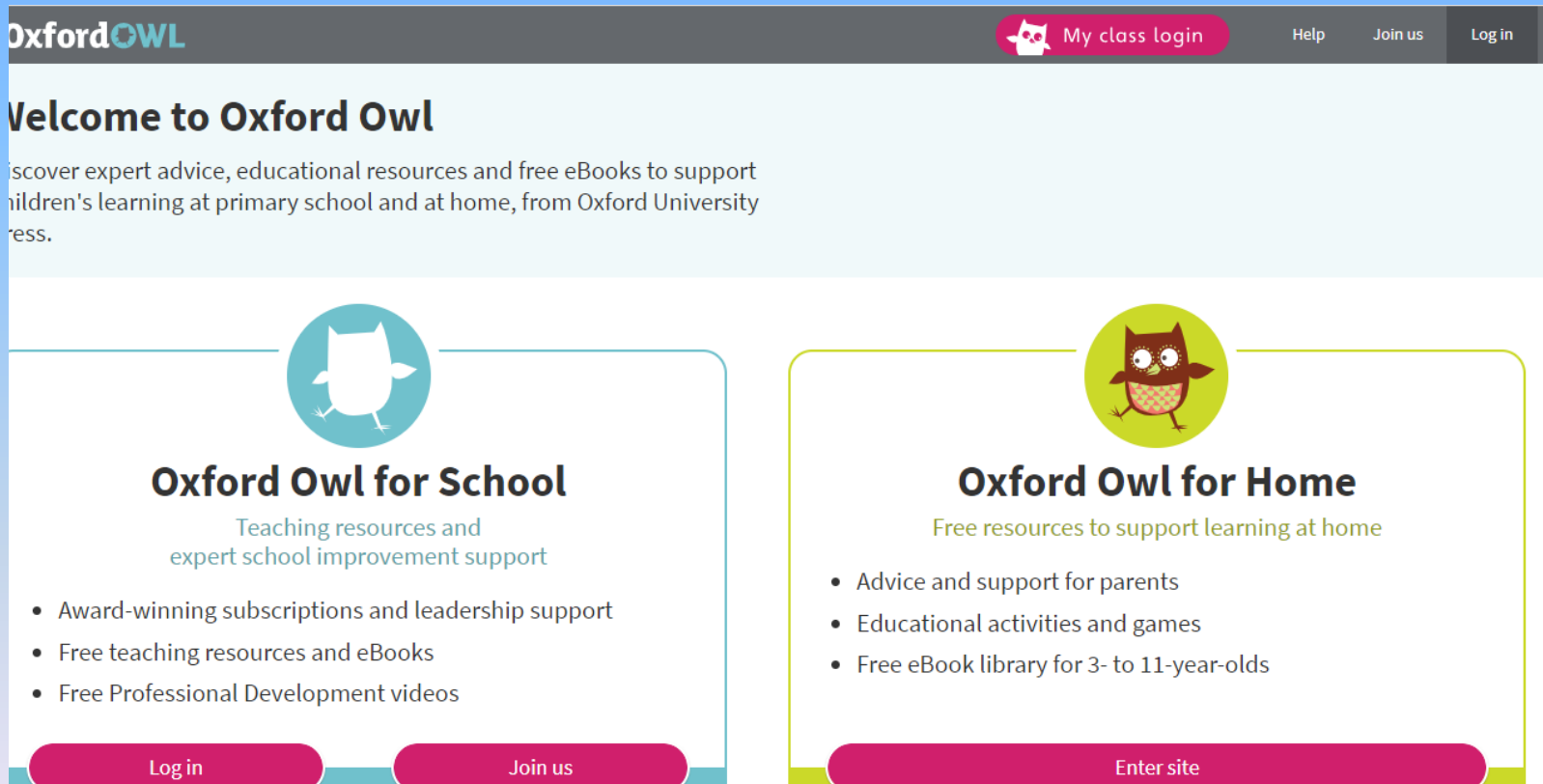
1. Can you imagine going on a magic journey and role play where you might go, who might go with you, who might you meet?

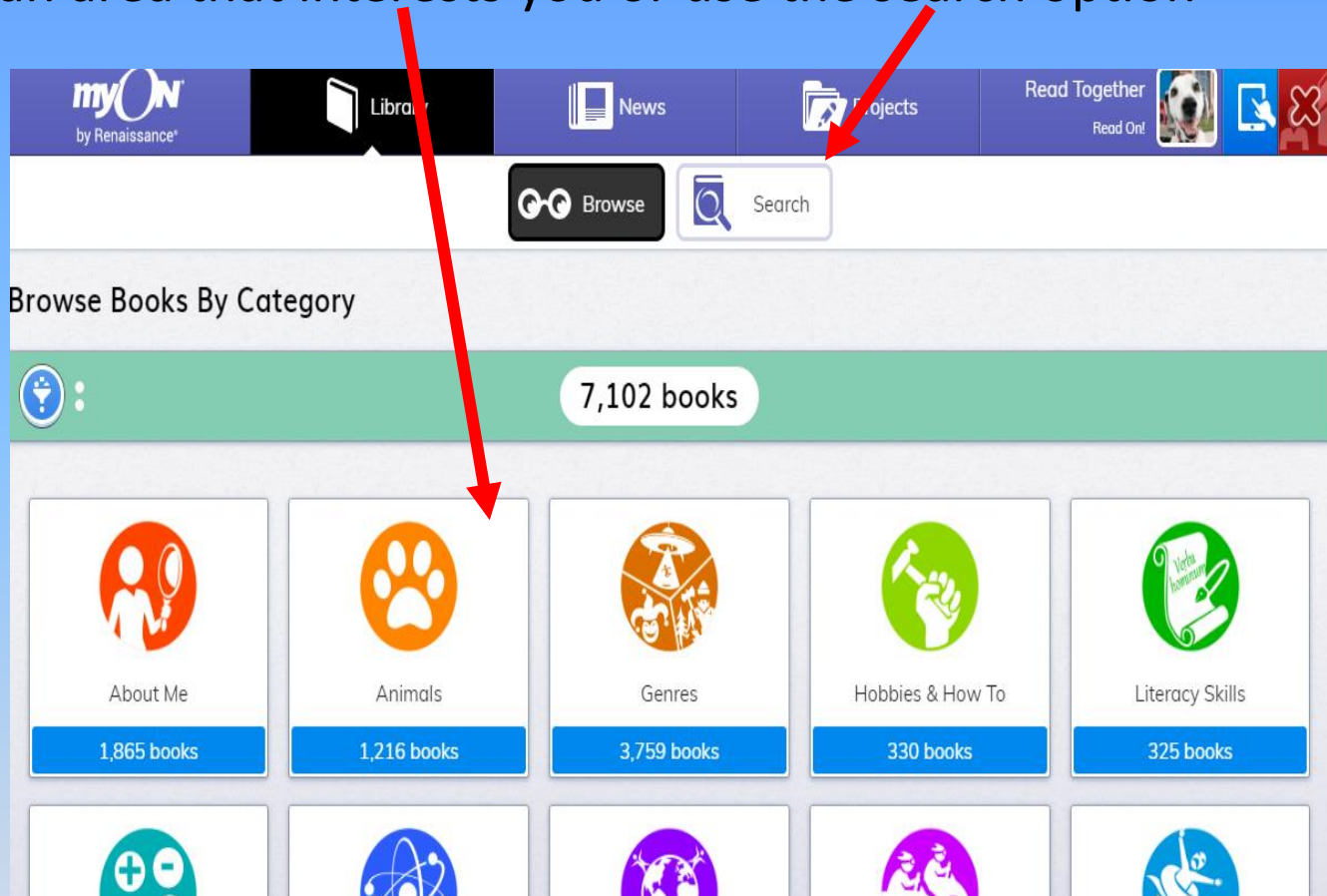

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

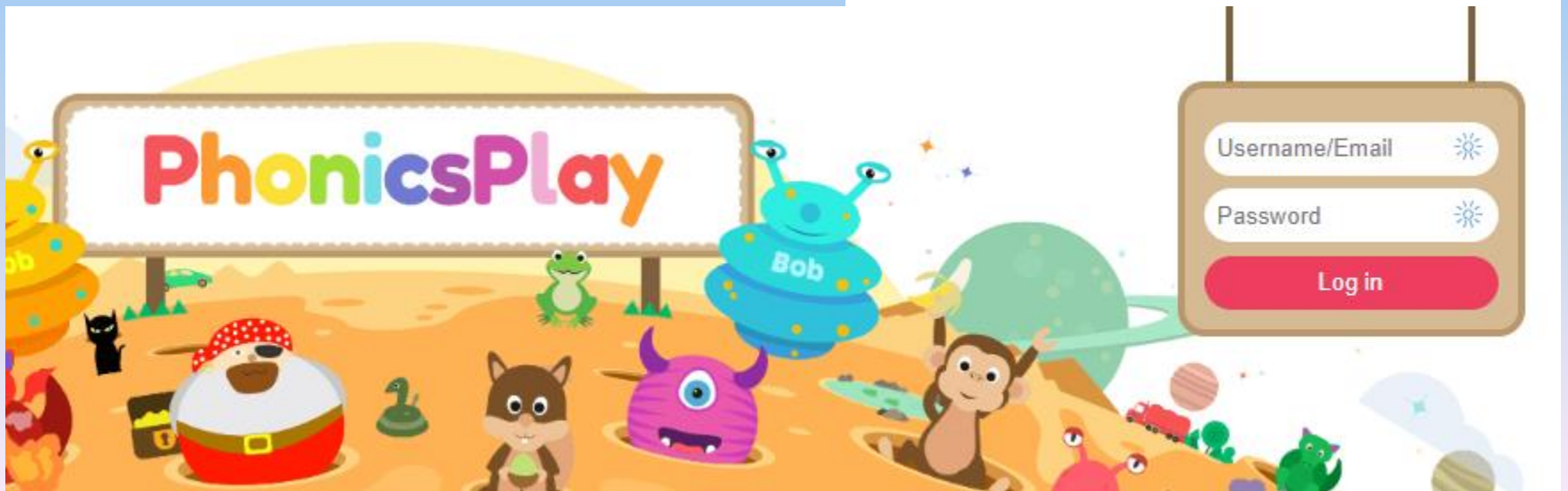
Phonics

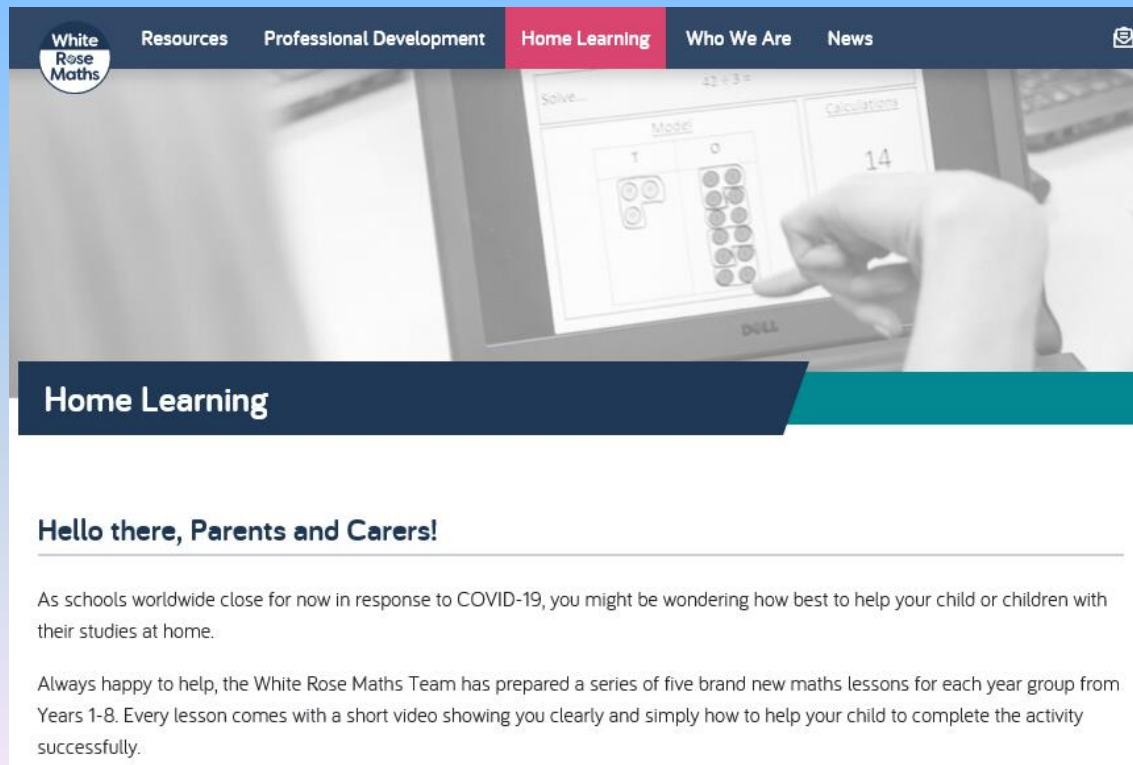


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

Accessing Twinkl

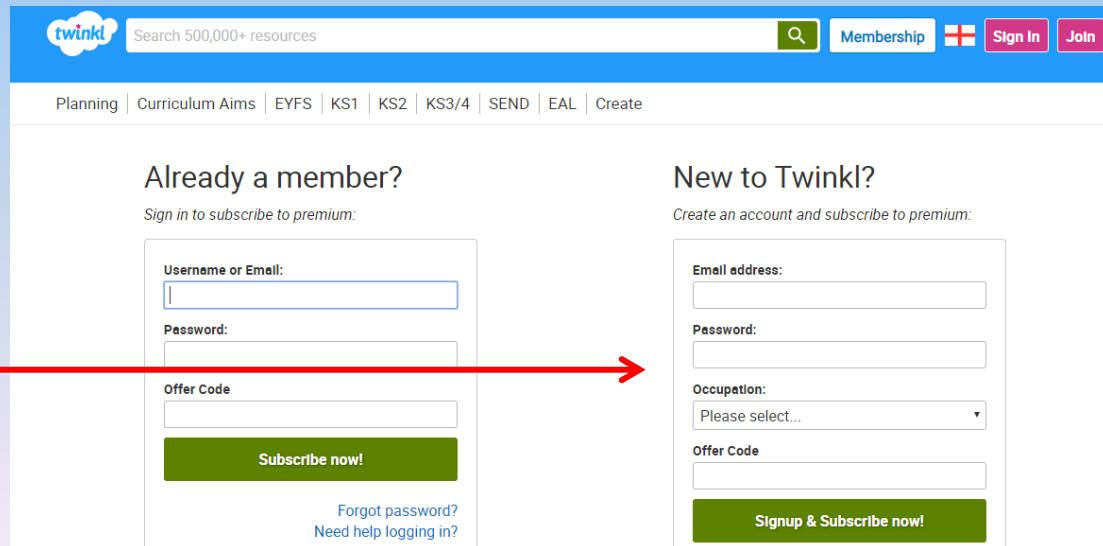
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

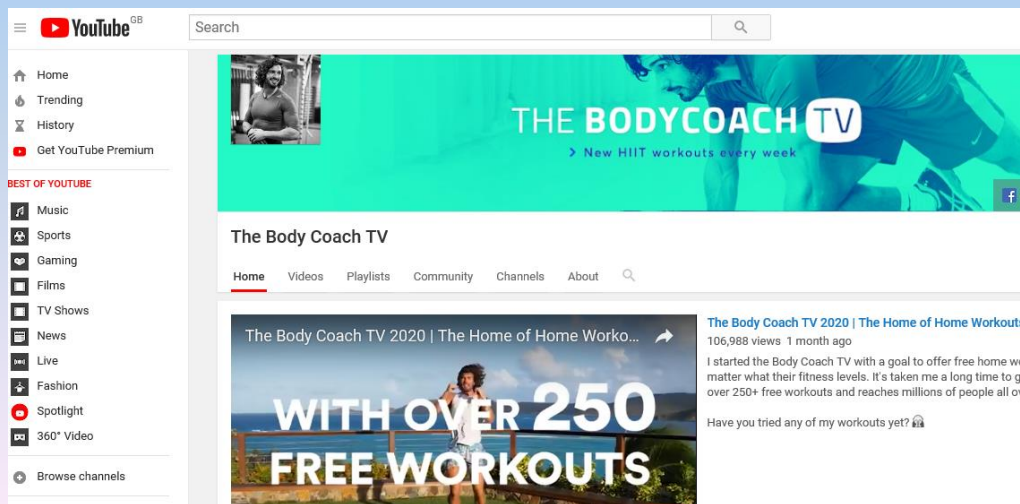
