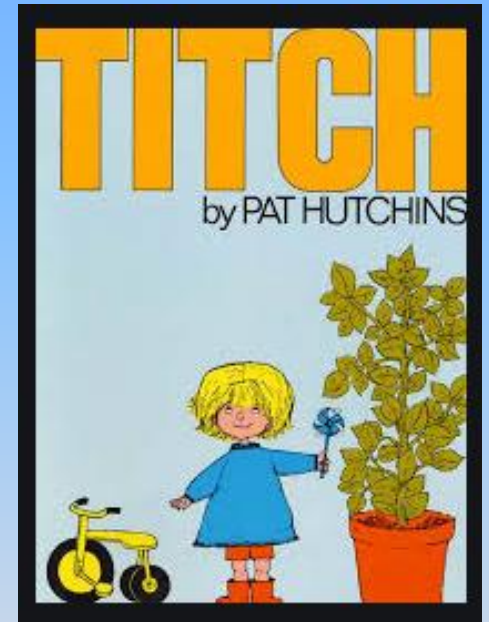
This week we are learning about length, height and distance.

Topic

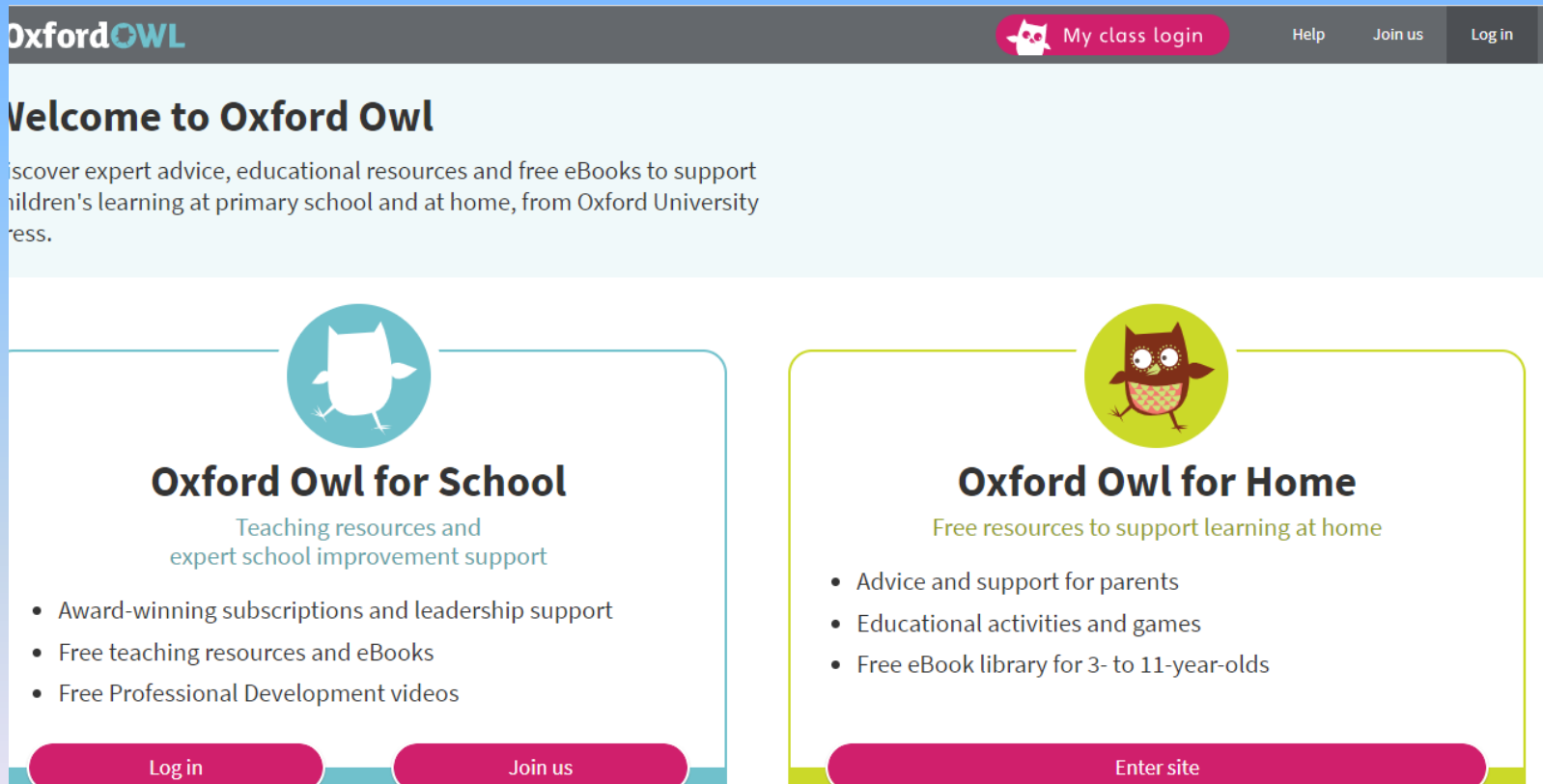
This week we have been thinking about the places Granny visits and the things she buys. Here are some ideas you might like to explore.

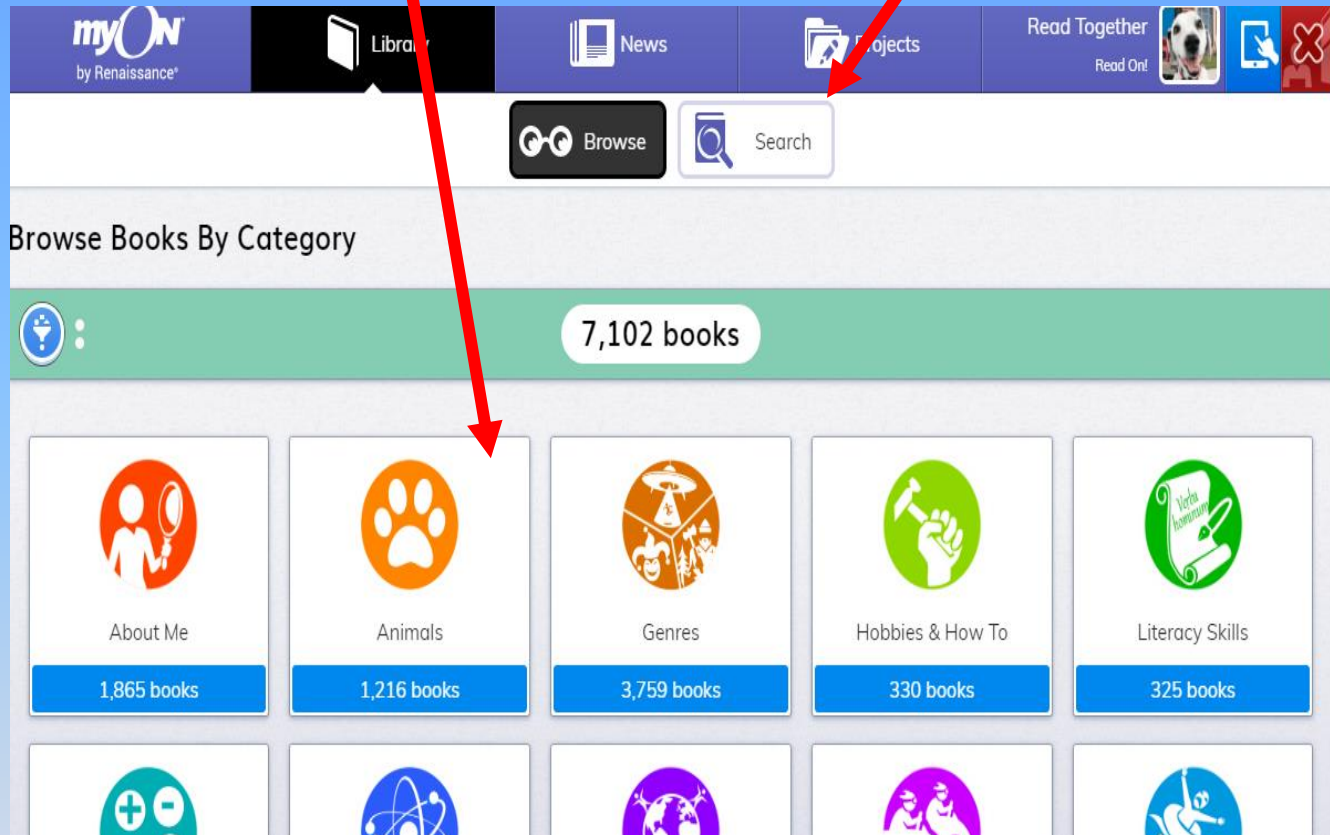

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

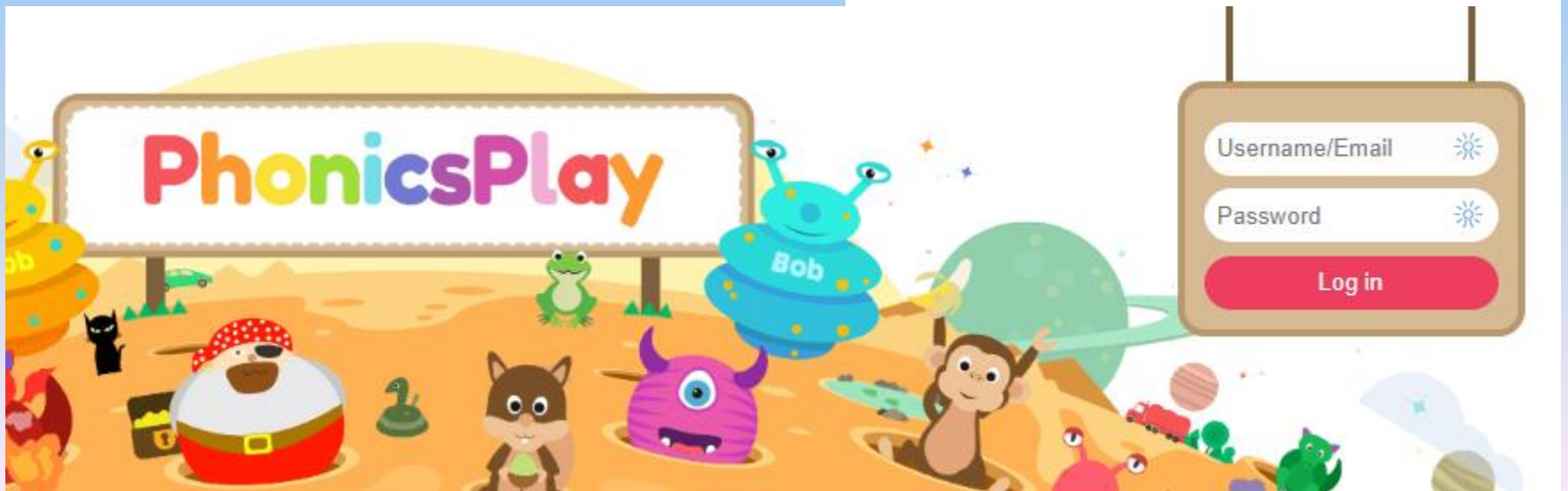
Phonics

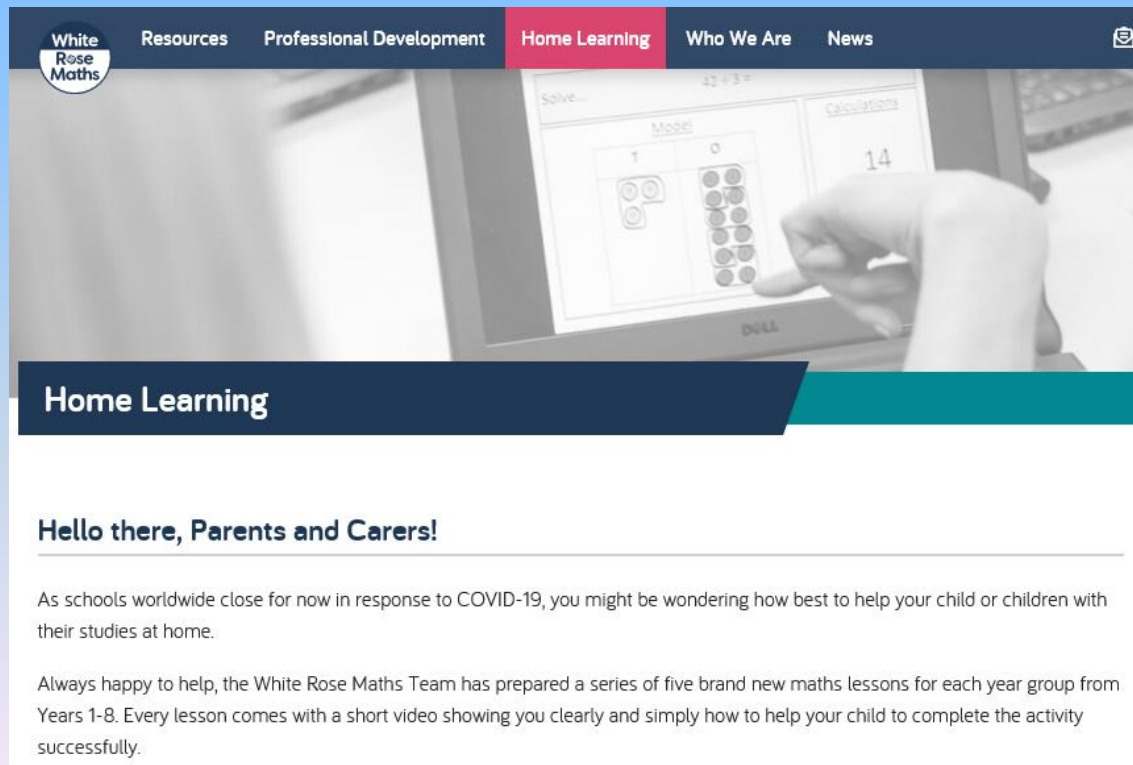


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

Accessing Twinkl

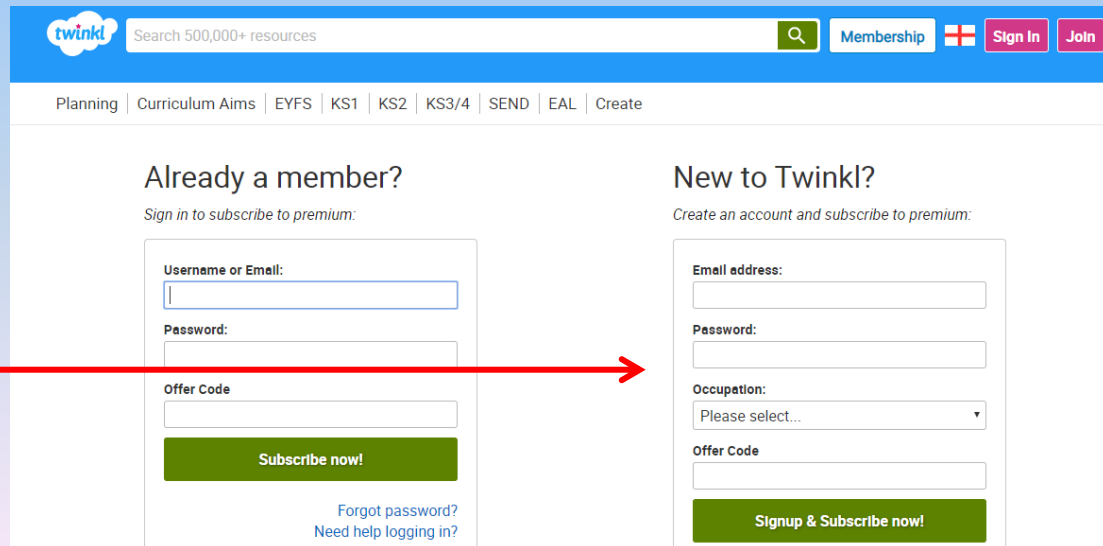
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

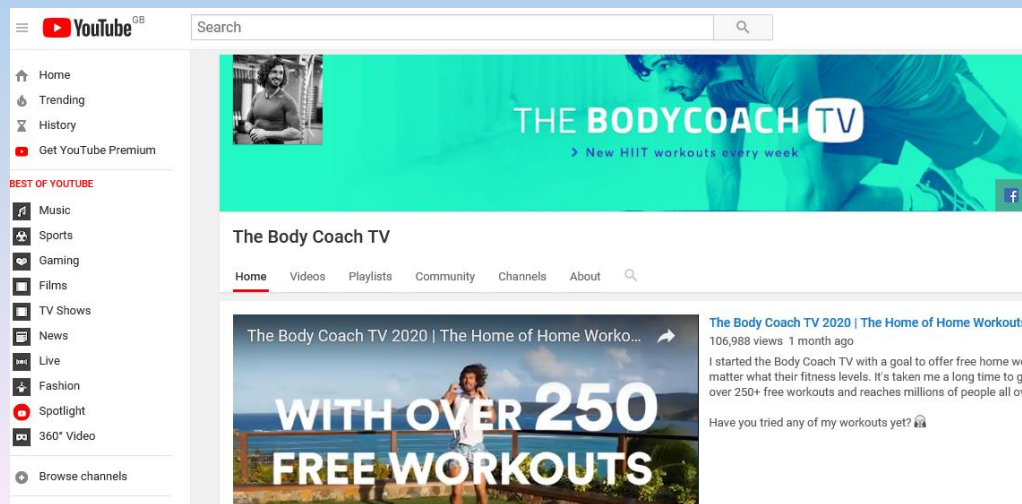
