Task 1

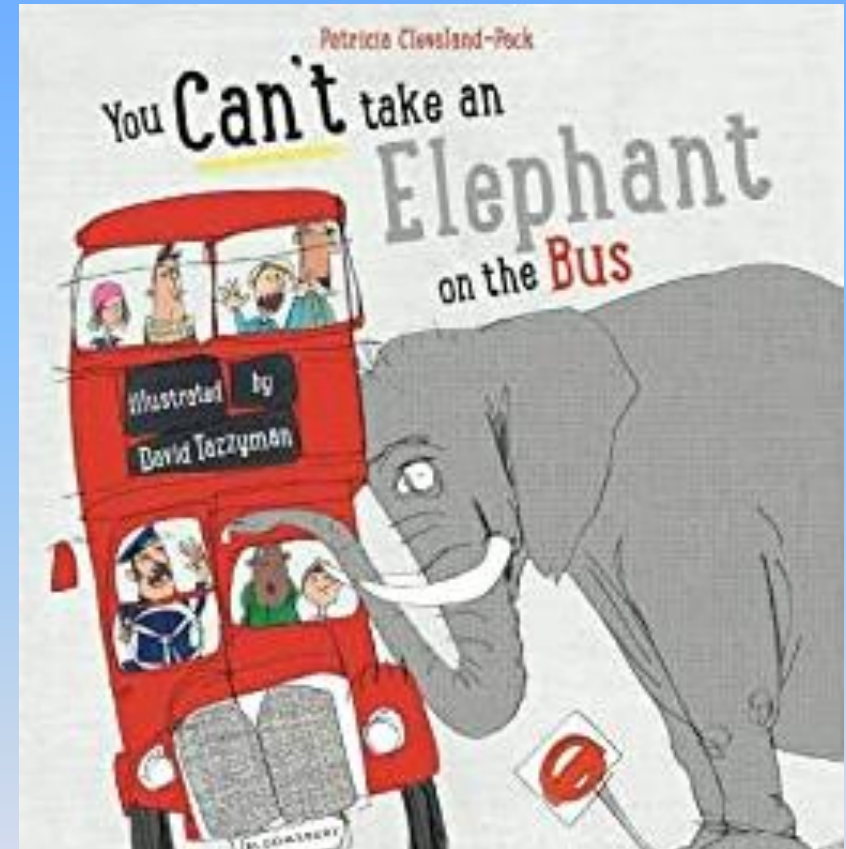
We are going to be continuing thinking about journeys this week but with a bit of a difference and a little bit silly.

Which is your favourite animal on which transport? Can you explain why?

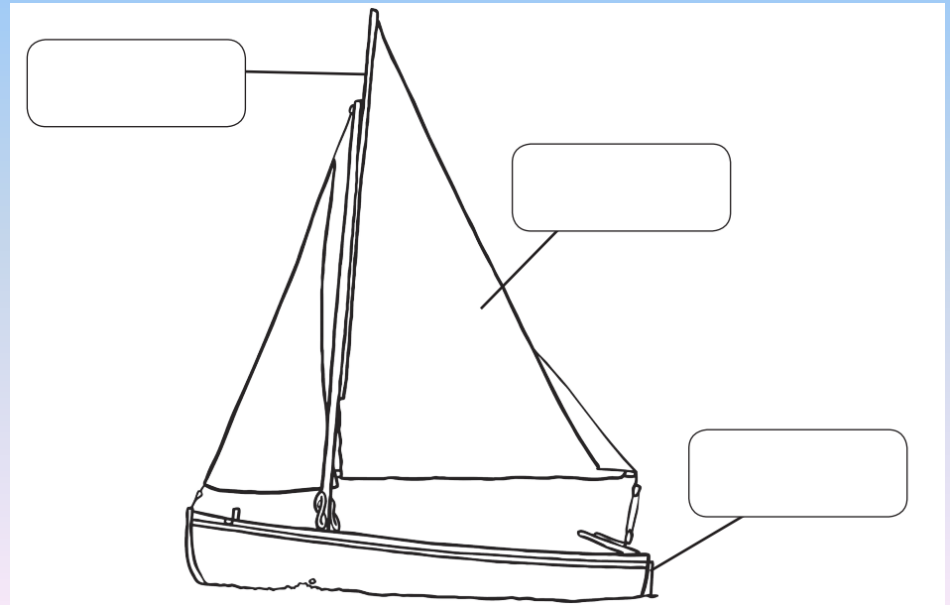
I would like you to choose an animal and think of a silly way for it to travel. Don't forget the because and to add a reason for why they can't do it?

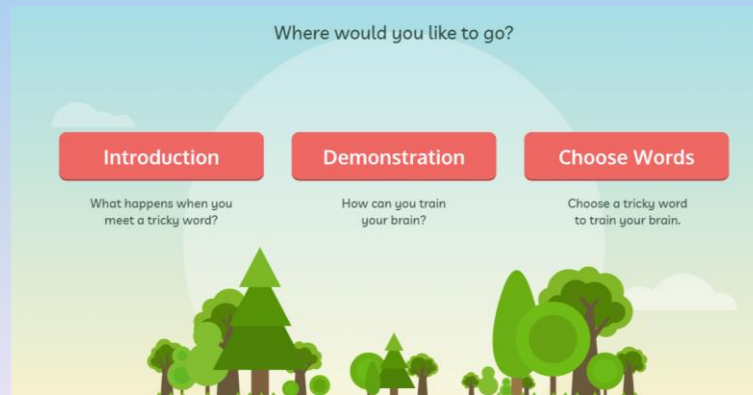
This week we are going to be continuing our learning of tricky words by learning two more:

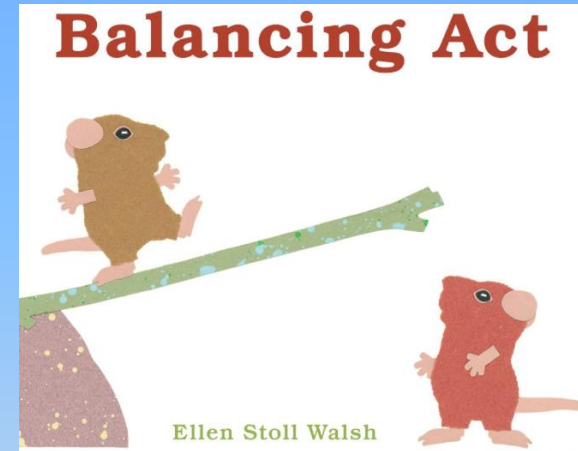

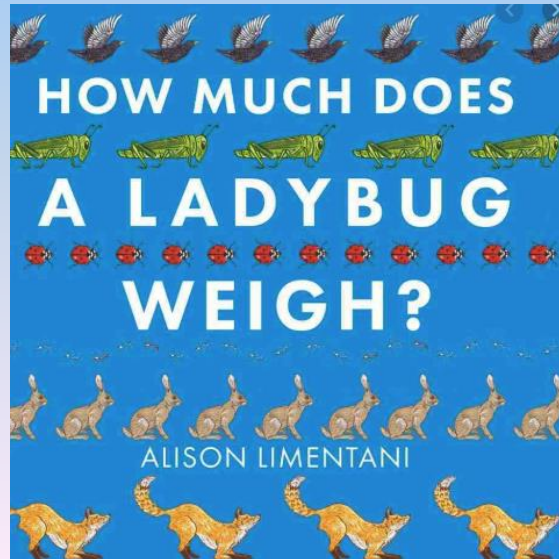

Explore the mathematical vocabulary of heavier and lighter using weighing scales or balancing scales from Task 1.



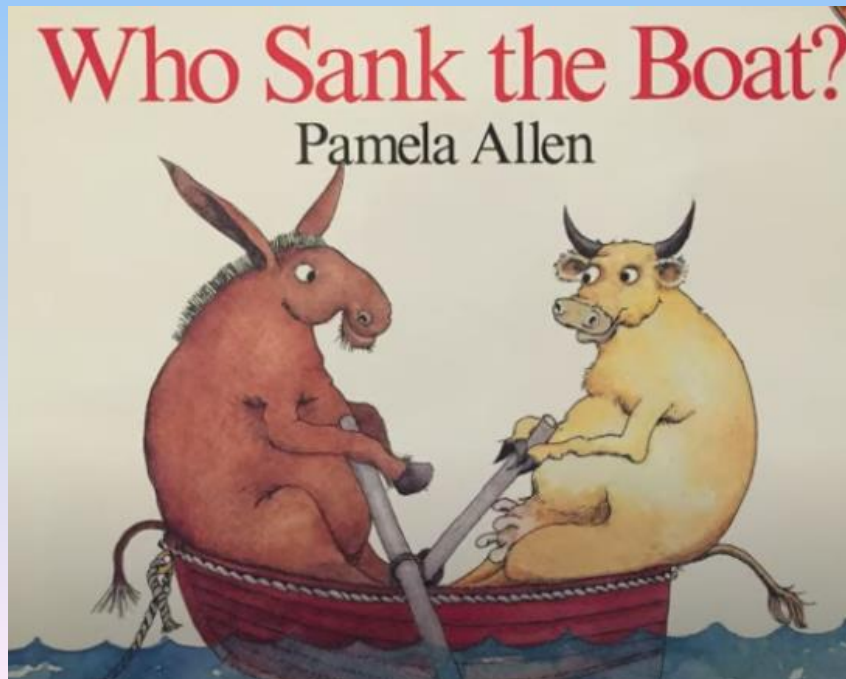

Topic

This week we have thinking about weight as well as animals travelling on different types of transport and the silly reasons why this would not work. You might like to try out one of these tasks connected to this week's learning.

1. Role play a Post Office. Can you make your own parcels and compare to see which are heavier and lighter?
2. Can you build me a vehicle that an animal from the story could travel on?
3. On plates put brightly colour paint and a range of wheeled transport toys. Children dip the wheels into the paint and run them across sheets of paper.
4. Collect together transport toys, e.g. car, train, boat, bicycle, taxis, motorbike. Identify them. Discuss specialised forms of transport, e.g. ambulance, lifeboat, mobility scooter. Generate different criteria to group the collection of vehicles. Consider reasons for travelling in each.

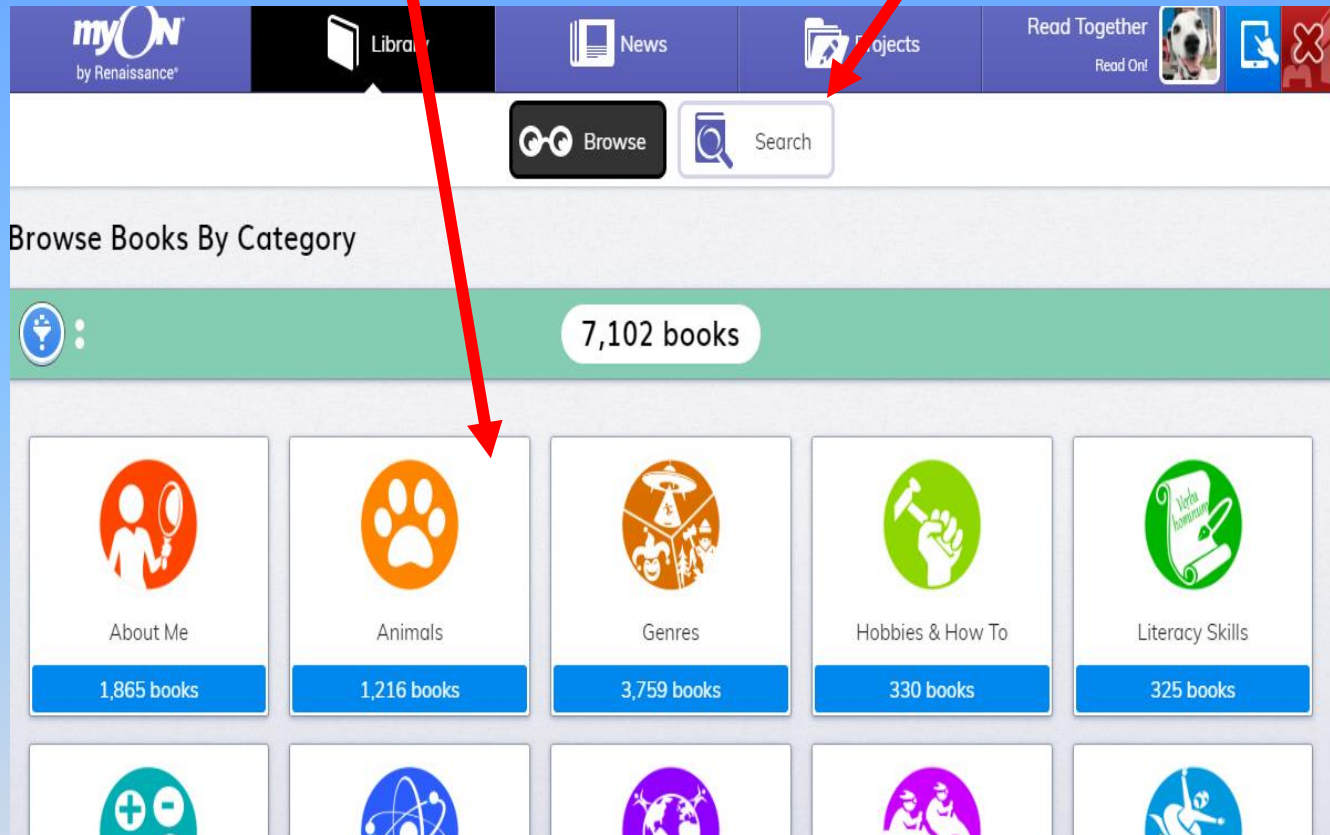

Please continue sharing books together. Talking about the content and the characters in the books and making predictions about what might happen as you read.

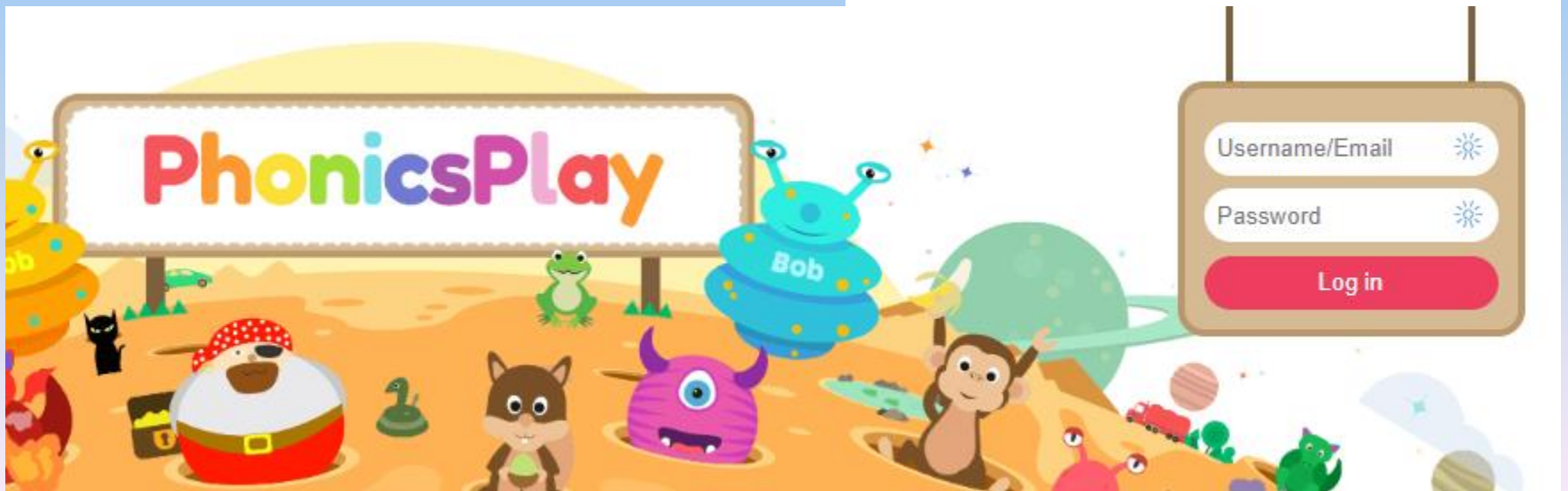
Phonics

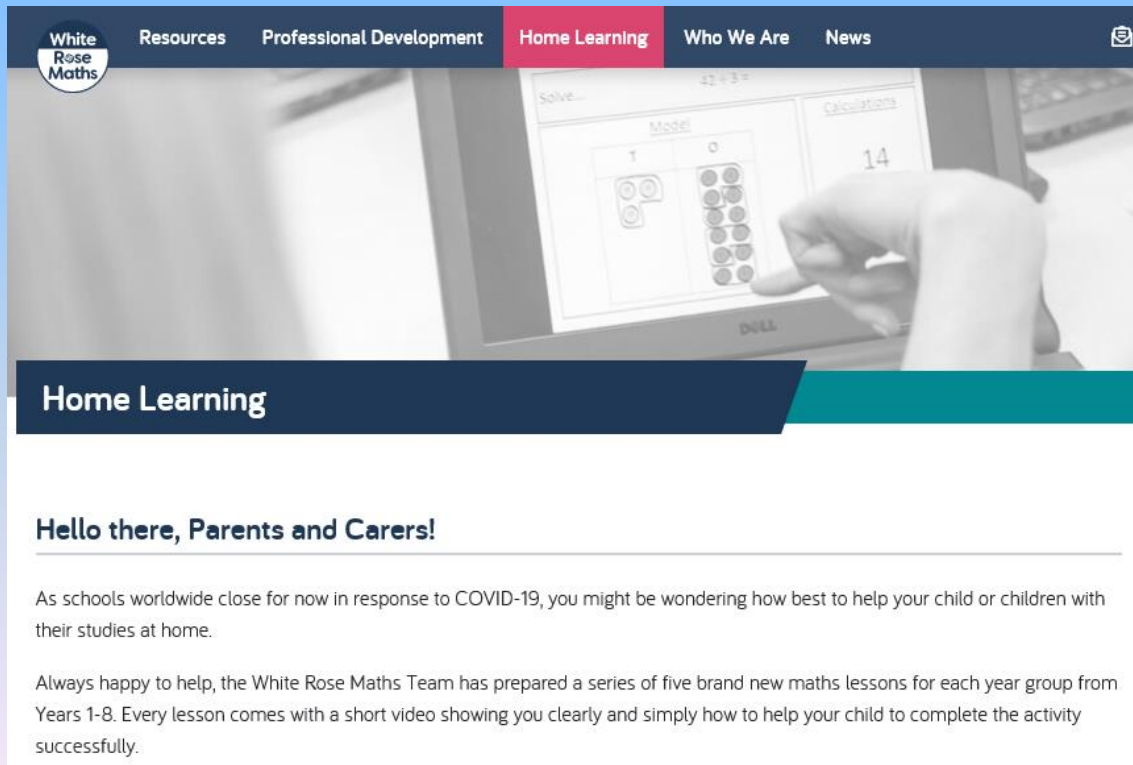


Maths – White Rose Home Learning

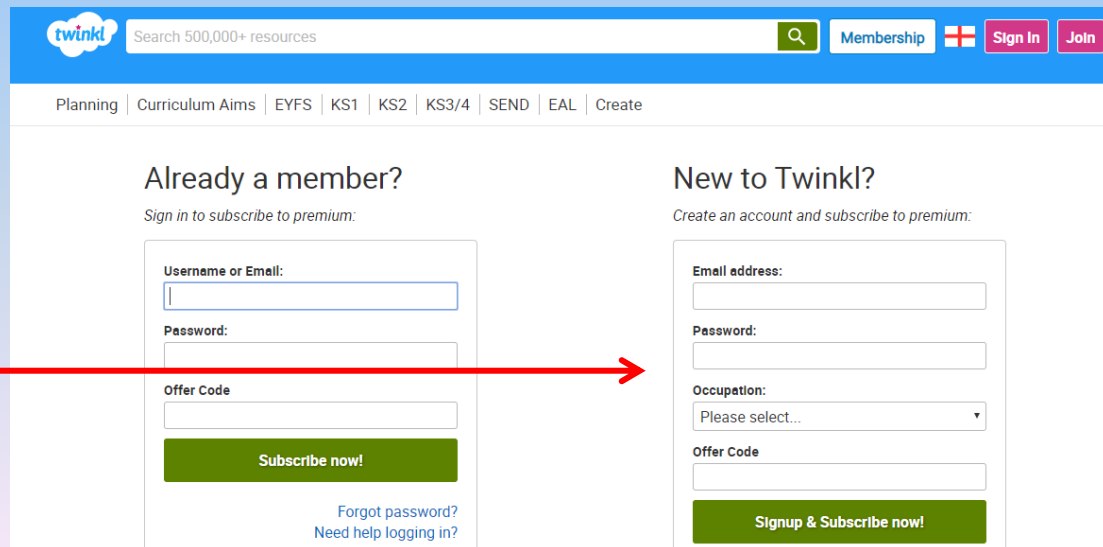
Many educational content providers are offering free access to their resources. Twinkl is a website that we use from time to time to resource our lessons to aid in teacher input and pupil activities.

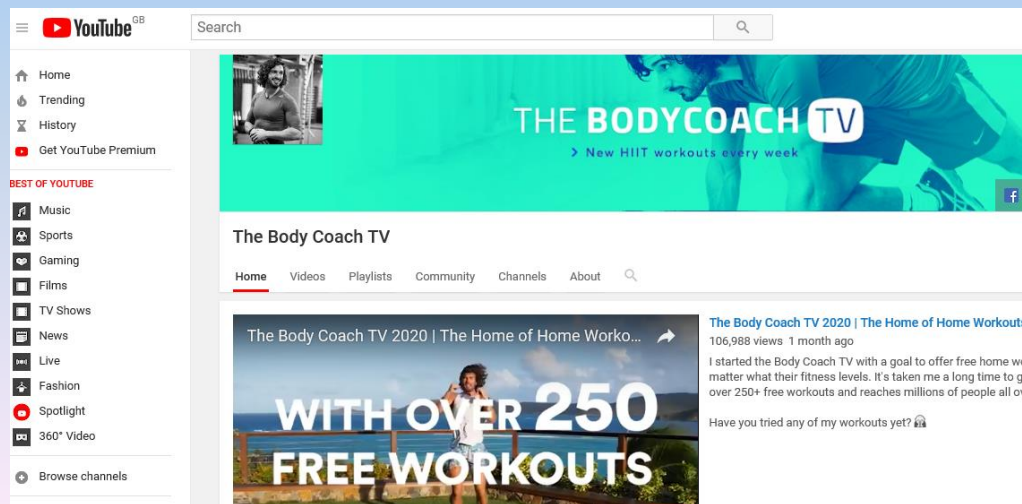
