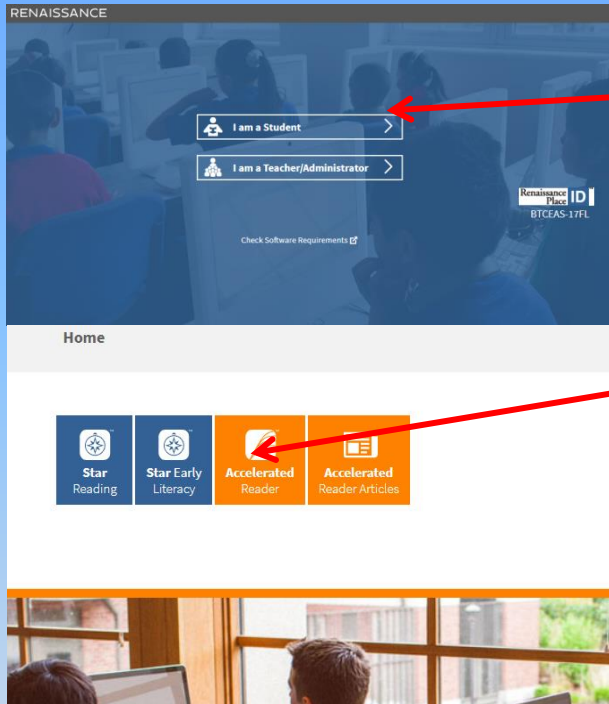

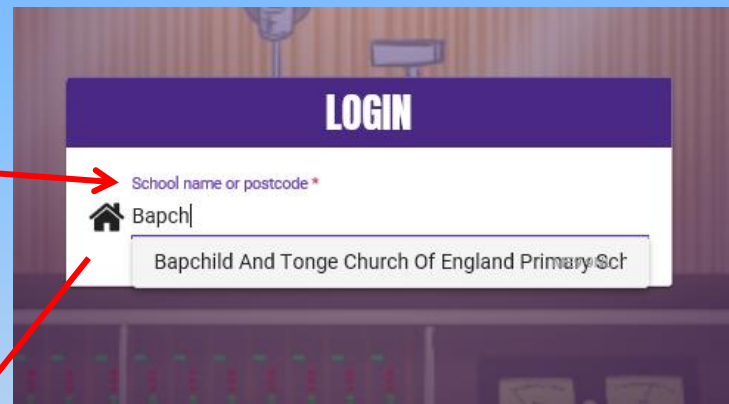
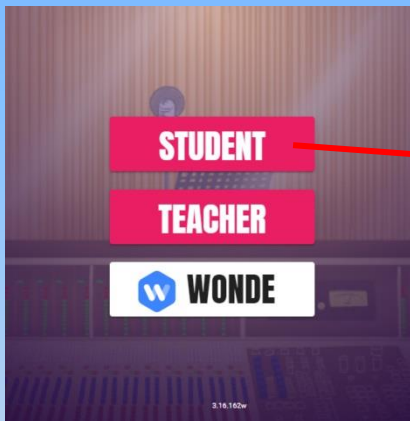
As schools worldwide close for now in response to COVID-19, you might be wondering how best to help your child or children with their studies at home.

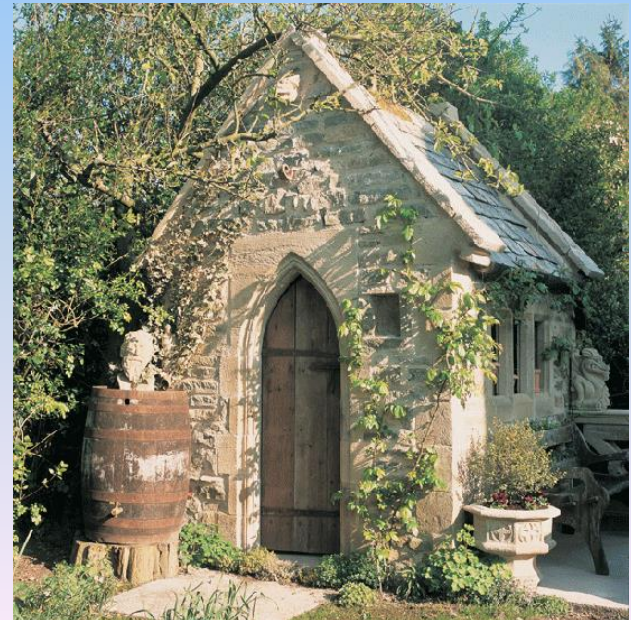
There's a Wizard in my Potting Shed

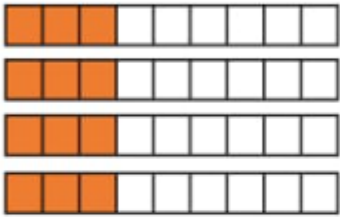

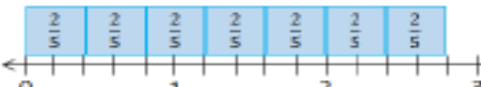

Day Two: Multiply Fractions by Fractions

 Dexter is calculating $\frac{1}{3} \times \frac{1}{2}$ by folding paper. He folds a piece of paper in half. He then folds the half into thirds. He shades the fraction of paper he has created. When he opens it up he finds he has shaded $\frac{1}{6}$ of the whole piece of paper.



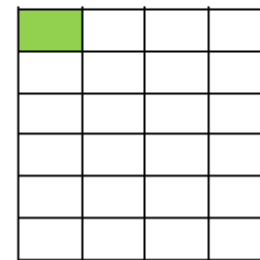
$\frac{1}{3} \times \frac{1}{2}$ means $\frac{1}{3}$ of a half. Folding half the paper into three equal parts showed me that $\frac{1}{3} \times \frac{1}{2} = \frac{1}{6}$

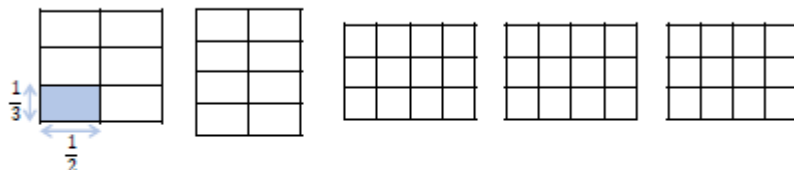

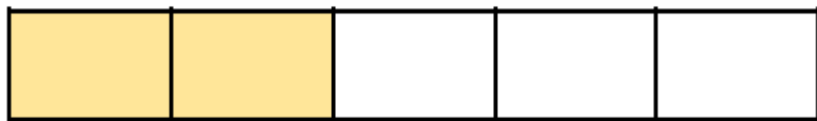

Pentecost

We are coming up to the half-term break, which is traditionally known as the Whitsun Holiday. This is a time when Christians celebrate Pentecost. On the next page is the story of Pentecost, which can be found in the book of Acts 2:1-4.

Read through the story and answer the comprehension questions.

Pentecost

- Pentecost is a Christian celebration 50 days after Good Friday.
- It is said to be the beginning of the Christian Church.

How Pentecost Came About

After Jesus had risen from the dead, He met with the disciples quite often.

After 40 days, it was time for Jesus to join his Father in Heaven. Before he left, he was on a mountainside, talking to his disciples. He told them that they had the job of telling people all over the world, that God loved them. Jesus said it would be a hard job, but He would send a gift to help them to do it.

Then, Jesus was taken up to Heaven.



The Gift of the Holy Spirit

One day, the disciples were together when there was a sudden sound of a mighty wind in the room. Then, flames landed on each of their heads, but no one was burned. The disciples were amazed.

Then, they started talking in different languages! The disciples had been filled with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit was the gift from God!



Pentecost

People nearby heard the disciples talking in different languages.

Peter, the disciple, came to speak to the crowd, and said,



"Fellow Jews and people here in Jerusalem. We have received the Holy Spirit from God. You too can receive the Holy Spirit. You must be baptised. Then, you too can receive this wonderful gift!"

That day, 3,000 people were baptised.

The disciples started to travel the world, telling people about God's message of love. This was the first day of the Christian Church.



Did You Know...?

- At Pentecost, the colour red is a symbol of the flames that appeared on the disciples' heads.
- A dove is a sign of the Holy Spirit because when Jesus was baptised, a dove appeared, bringing the Holy Spirit to Jesus.

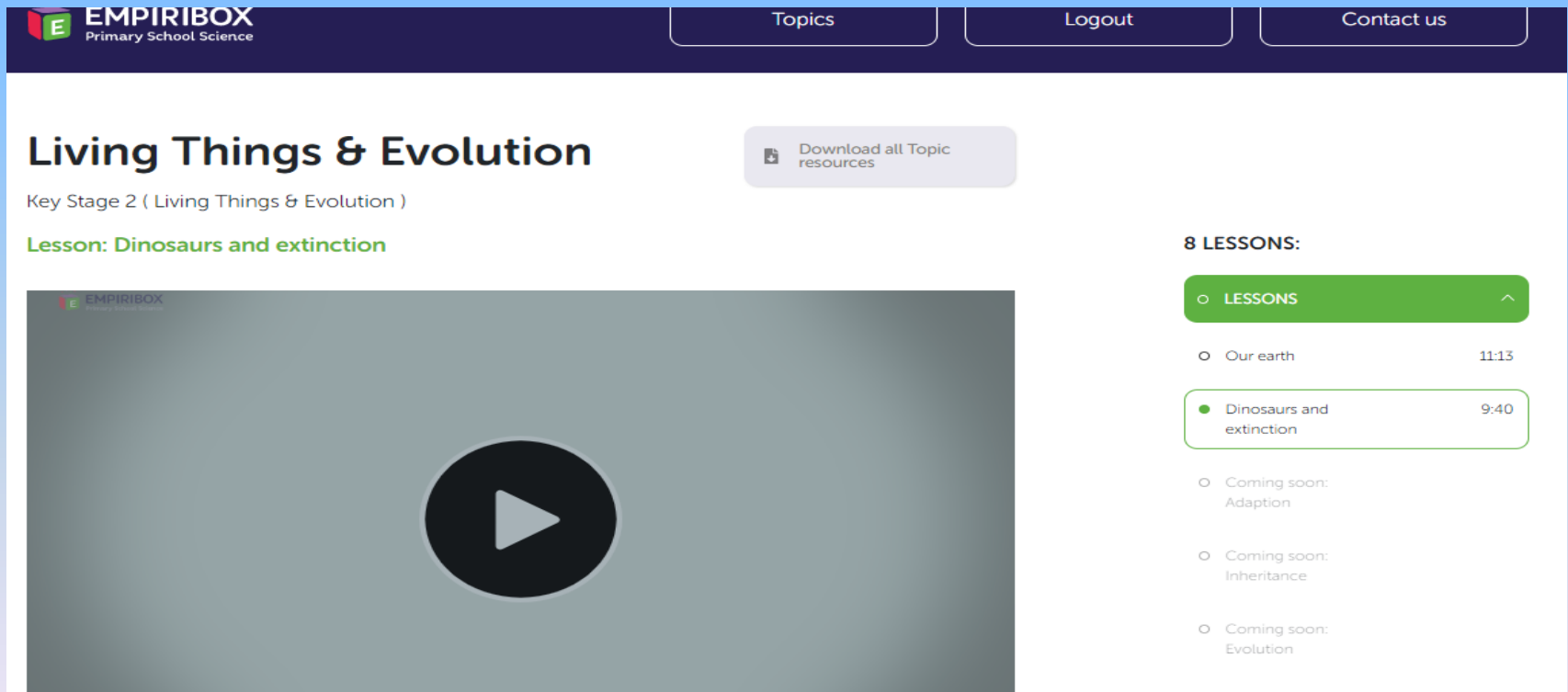

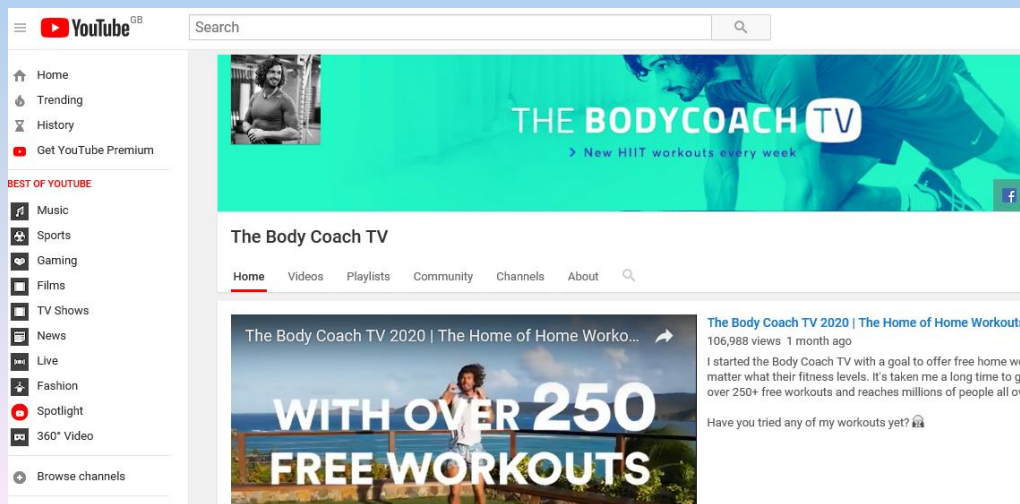

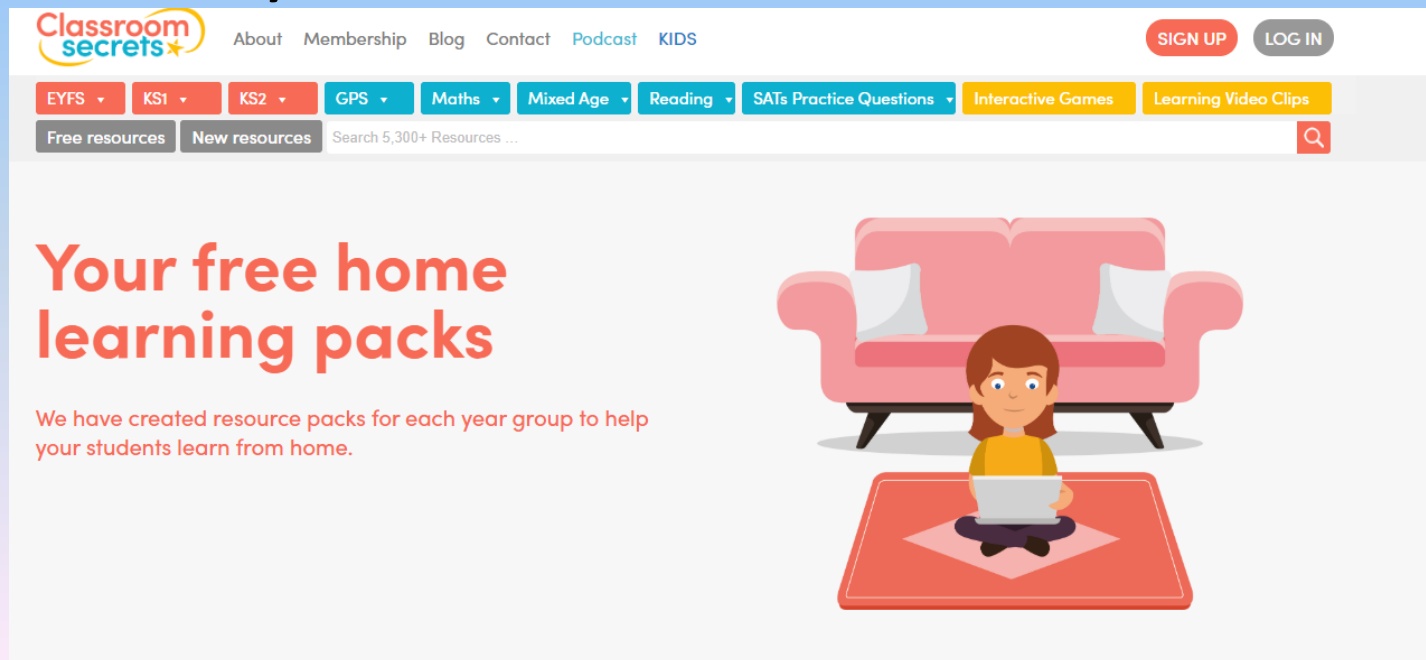
