Thank you for your continued support.

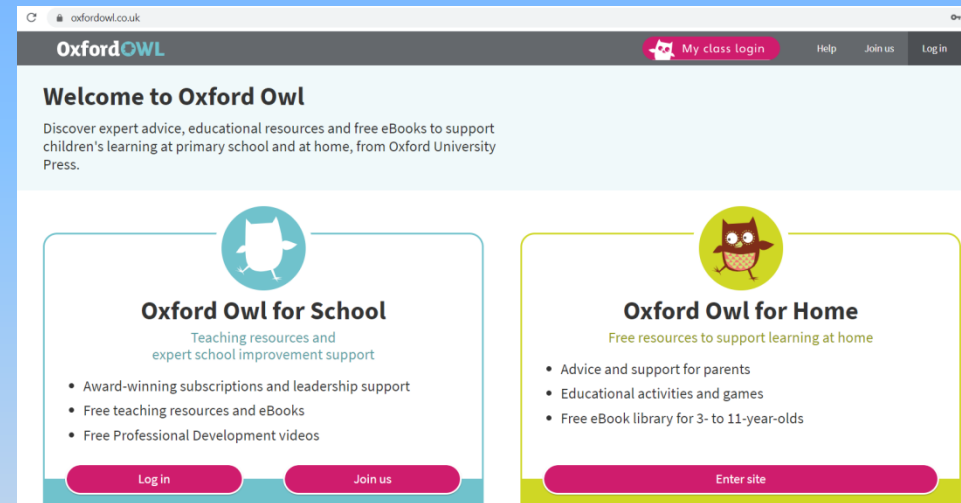
Reading

Mrs Smith's group are working on Phase 4.

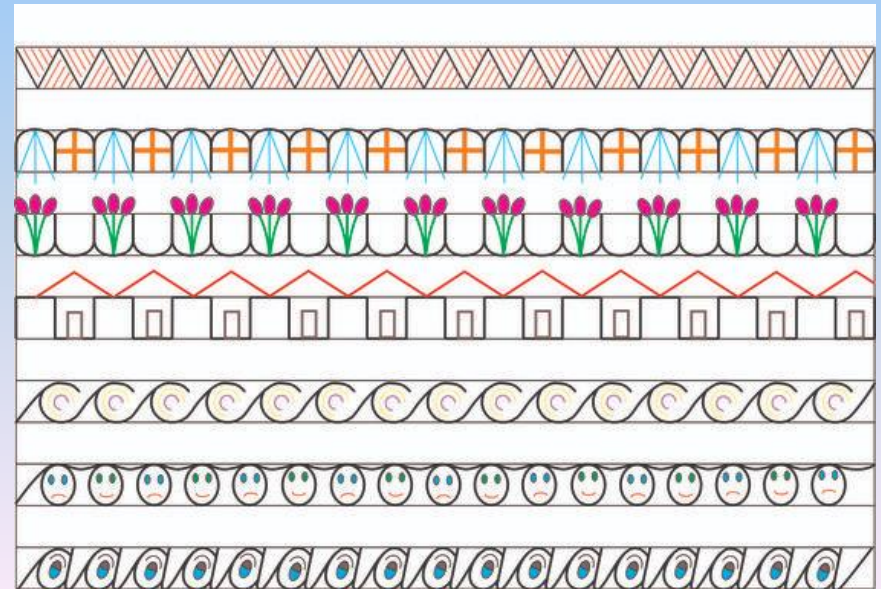
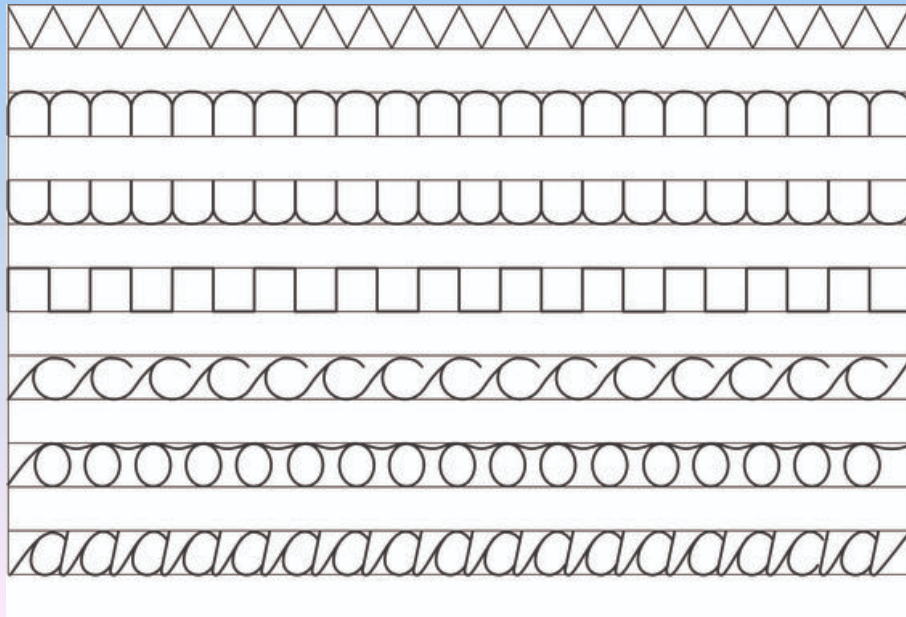
Additionally, there are many excellent Phonics resources on the Twinkl website(see below for how to get free access). Practising reading "alien words" is a particularly fun and valuable activity.

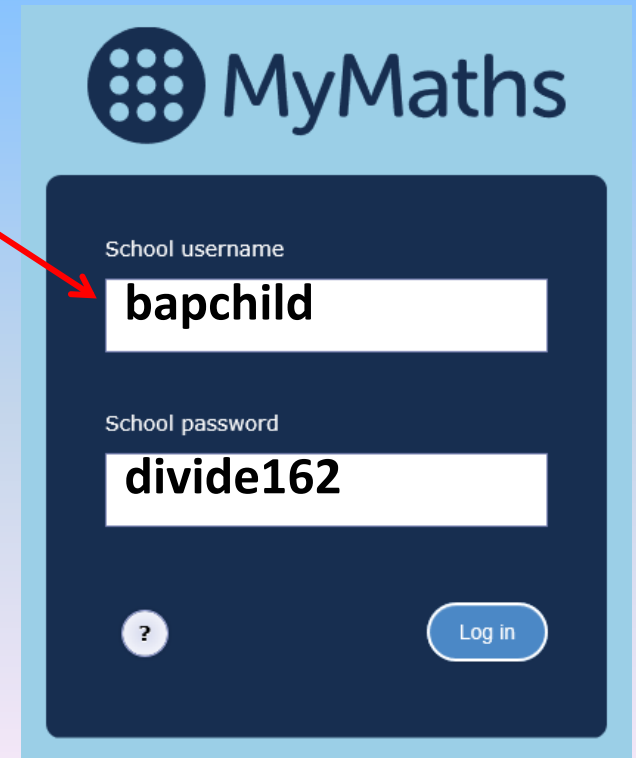
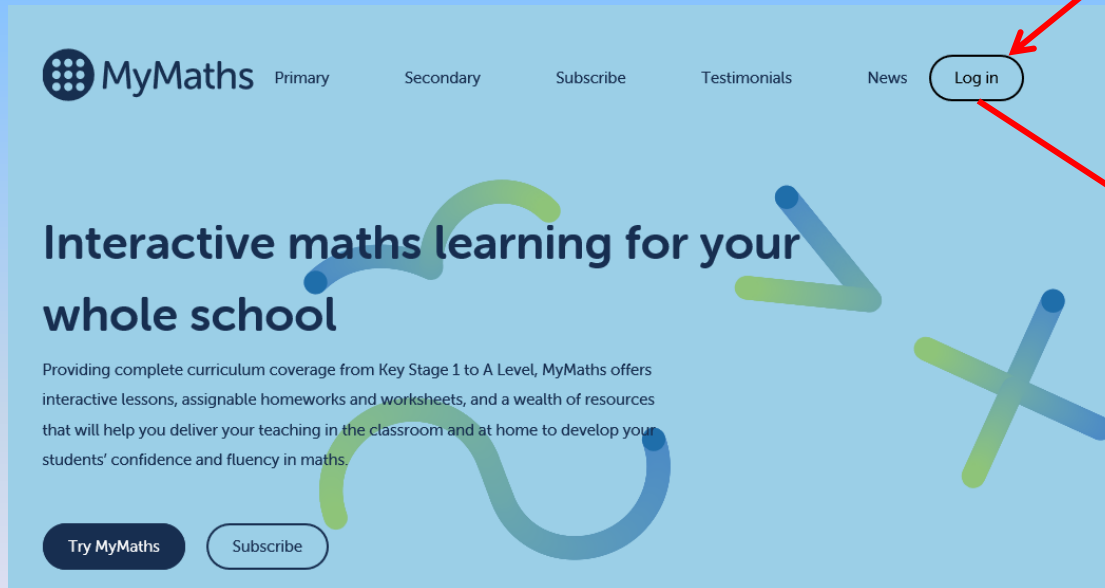
Writing

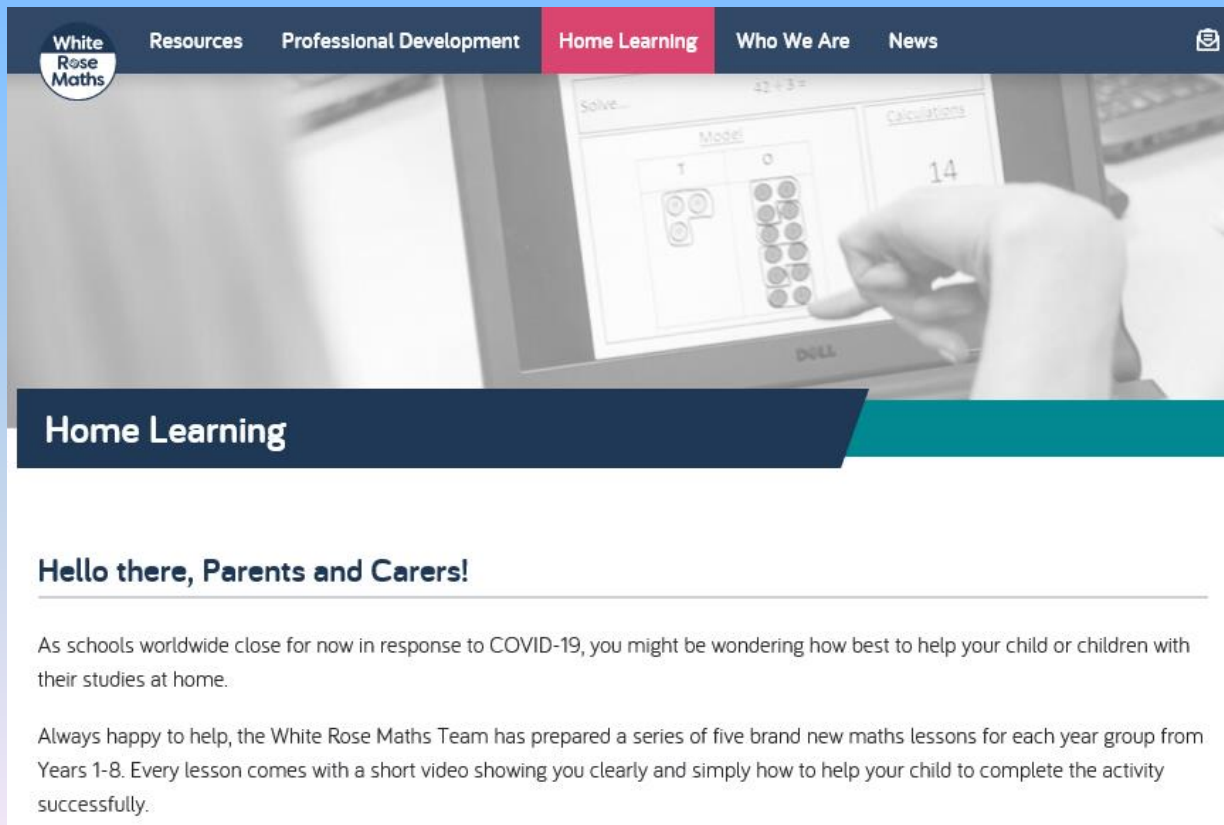
Access any lesson based on what your child is learning in class or search the topic in the search bar.

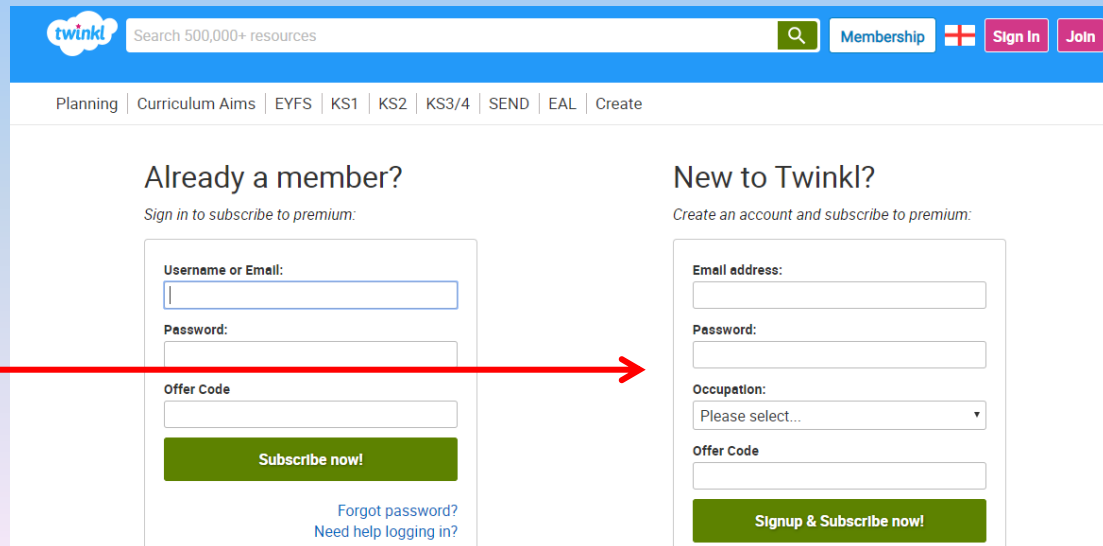
Accessing Twinkl

Maths Learning

Year 1's next unit in Maths would be about Weight and Volume. Please support your child to compare and measure weights and volumes, (perhaps by helping with cooking, gardening, cleaning and tidying!) They need to be able to use the words light, heavy, lighter than, heavier than, lightest, heaviest, full, empty, half full, nearly empty, more than and less than.



English/Topic Learning

In English we have been learning about Information Texts and we would have been working towards producing our own information pages about Transport. You could pick either a bicycle, car, train, bus or aeroplane and make a poster/information page about how they have changed over time. We would also have learned about Alphabetical Order and there are many resources to support this on Twinkl.



Science Learning

Our next Science topic will be about plants. Your child should have come home with a sunflower seed to plant and look after (very kindly provided by Felix!) and a Sunflower Diary to complete.

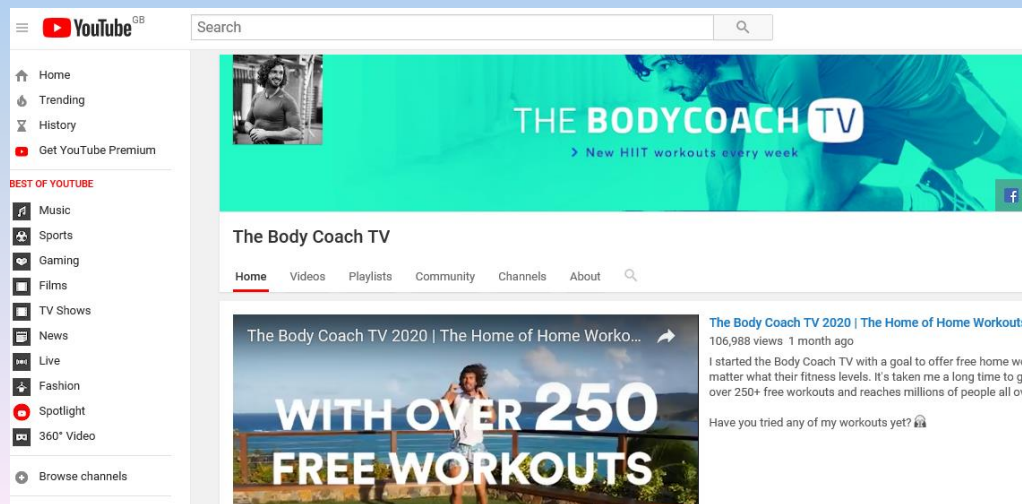
