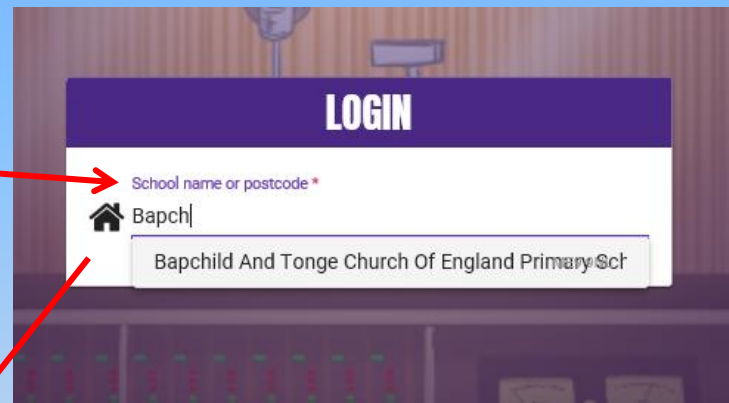
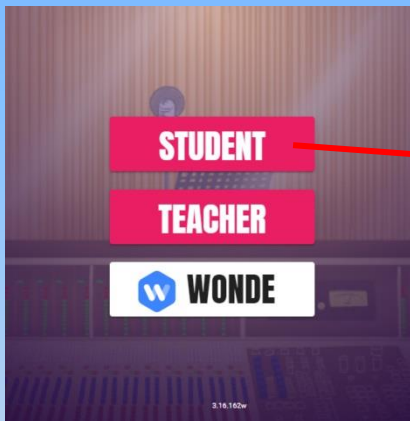
As schools worldwide close for now in response to COVID-19, you might be wondering how best to help your child or children with their studies at home.

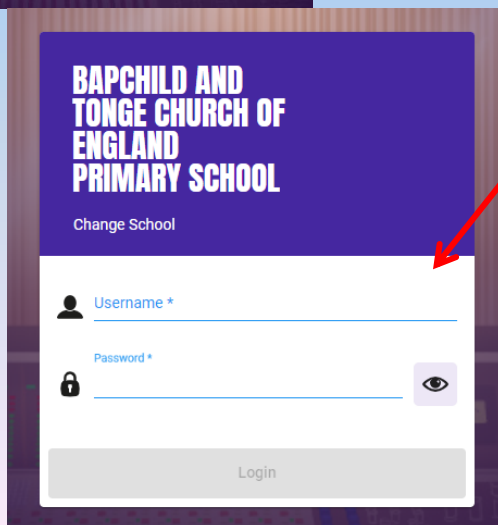

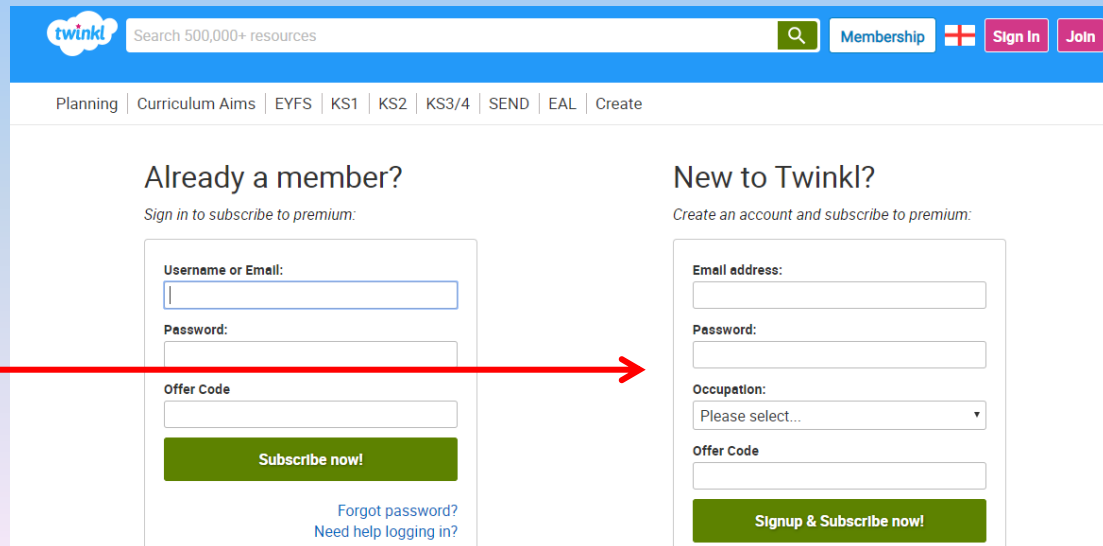
Accessing Twinkl

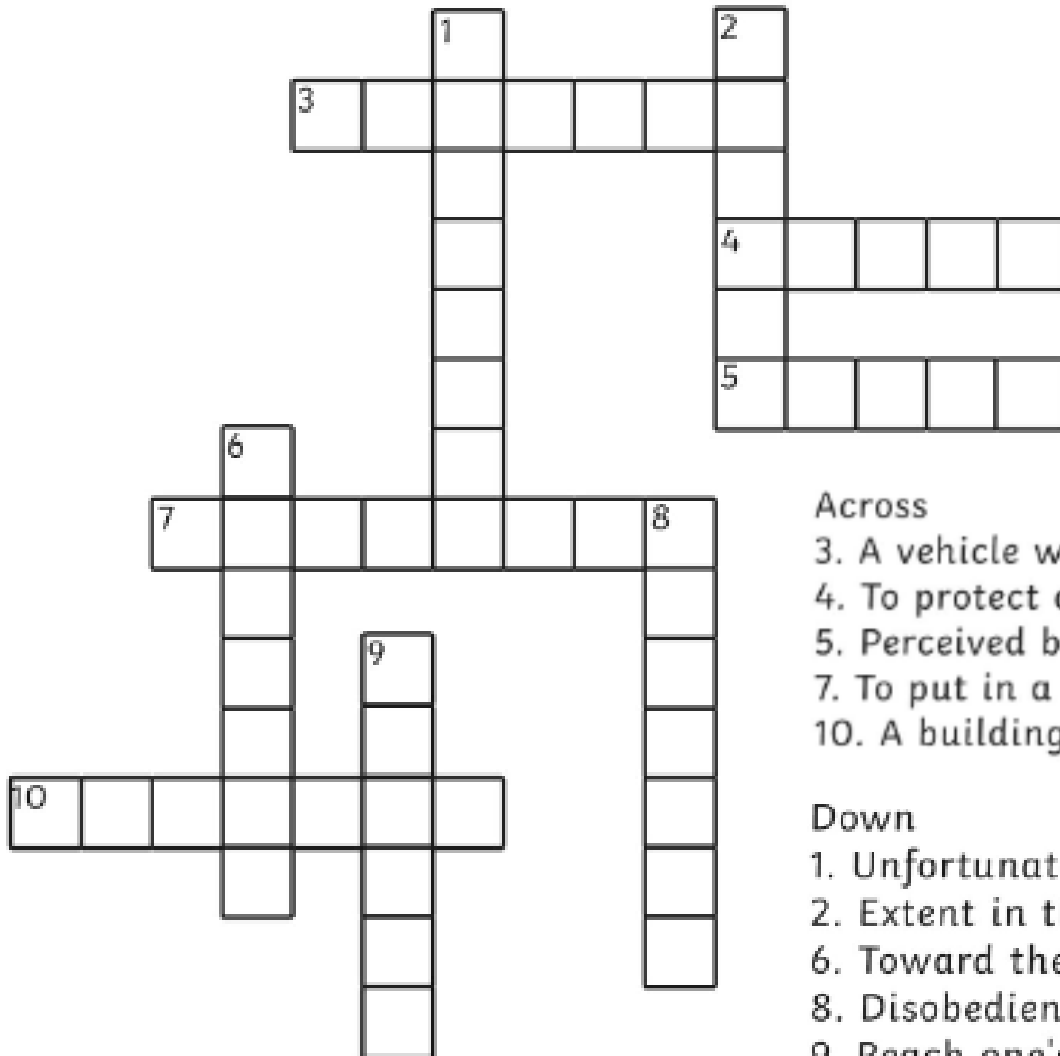

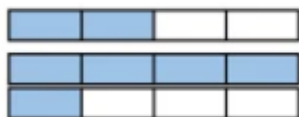

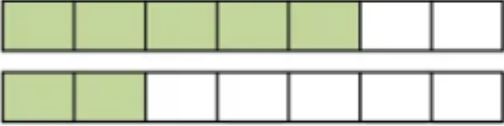
